Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee. Board of Trustees, Tuesday, March 8, 1977.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2:00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Tuesday, March 8, 1977, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, and Mr. George W. Griffin. Professor Paul Sears, Ex Officio Secretary, was present as were Board members, L. D. Gorman, and Michael McLaughlin. Dr. David A. Hull, recently appointed member of the Board of Trustees, attended the meeting as a guest. The administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Stanley Wall, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, Jack C. Blanton, John Smith and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Robert M. Drake, Special Assistant to the President; and Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel. Representatives of the various news media were in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Sturgill called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. Following the invocation given by Mr. Black, the Secretary called the roll and reported all members of the Executive Committee present. The Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:03 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the reading of the Minutes of the December 14, 1976 meeting of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report

President Singletary spoke briefly about some of the items in his monthly report to the Trustees and recommended that the report be received and filed. Without objection it was so ordered by the Chairman.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Cooper, seconded by Mr. Clay and passed, PR 2, Recommendations of the President, was approved as a whole

and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

President Singletary recommended that PR 3 be approved as a whole. On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent, PR 3 was approved and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

Following the approval by the Board of the four Research Professors for 1977-78 (Item I), President Singletary commented on the newly established research professorships and introduced three of the recipients of the 1977-78 awards; Professor Guy Davenport, Department of English; Professor William D. Ehmann, Department of Chemistry; and Professor William R. Markesbery, Department of Neurology. The fourth recipient, Professor Roger Wets, Department of Mathematics, was unable to be present.

F. Budget Revisions for 1976-77 (PR 4)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed, the Budget Revisions for 1976-77 as recommended in PR 4 were authorized and approved. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported the committee had met on the morning of March 8 and considered the various matters on the agenda. He moved that the Interim Financial Report for the period ending January 31, 1977 be accepted and made a matter of record. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Authorization to Request Renovation Cost from Maintenance Reserve Account (FCR 2)

Mr. Clay noted that there were sufficient funds in the maintenance reserve account to cover the \$3,000 cost involved in replacing the boiler at Sigma Chi Fraternity House, and moved approval of the recommendation in FCR 2. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Authorization to Request Renovation Cost from Maintenance Reserve Account (FCR 3)

Mr. Clay said that the Recommendation in FCR 3 for \$3,000 for renovation costs at the Sigma Nu House was of the same type as that approved in FCR 2 for the Sigma Chi House, and moved approval. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. External Auditor for Fiscal Year 1976-77 (FCR 4)

Noting that the firm of Coopers and Lybrand, Certified Public Accountants, has done a satisfactory job in auditing the accounts of the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976, Mr. Clay moved that the same firm be engaged to perform the examination of accounts for 1976-77 fiscal year under the conditions set forth in the recommendation in FCR 4. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Room and Board Rates for 1977-78 (FCR 5)

At the request of Mr. Clay, Vice President Blanton discussed the proposed adjustments in room and board rates, noting that the rates had not been increased since 1975. Mr. Blanton said that the upward adjustments resulted primarily from increased labor, food and utility costs and the present rates are not sufficient to meet these high operating expenditures.

Mr. Clay read the recommendations under each part of FCR 5 and moved their adoption. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Resolution Renaker Estate (FCR 6)

Mr. Clay made the following motions: 1) that the Board formally accept the monies, securities, real property and other items accruing to the University by virtue of the will of Violette B. Renaker, deceased, and express its appreciation therefor; and 2) that the Board authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer to dispose of the real properties coming to the University from this estate and located in California and Texas together with the surface rights (not including mineral or oil or gas rights) to the real property located in Oklahoma. Mr. Griffin seconded Mr. Clay's motion and it passed without dissent. (See FCR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Correction in the Minutes of March 12, 1976

Mr. Clay said that on March 12, 1976, FCR 5, Collateralization of Bank Accounts, was approved by the Finance Committee. This action required the University of Kentucky bank accounts to be collateralized by securities having a market value equal to 100% of the average daily ledger balance of the account in the preceding fiscal year. Through error, FCR 5 stated the requirement to be 110% of the average daily balance.

The Finance Committee intended the requirement to be 100% and agreements were subsequently negotiated with Lexington banks on this basis. The Board of Trustees should be aware of this error and approve its correction. Mr. Clay moved that this be done. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent.

N. Investment Committee Report (ICR 1)

Mr. Griffin moved that the quarterly report on changes made in investments for the period ending December 31, 1976 be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Clay and passed. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Meeting Adjourned

After first determining that there was no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made seconded and carried, Mr. Sturgill declared the meeting adjourned at 2:40 p.m.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

I. Patent Assignment

Recommendation: that authorization be given to the proper officials of the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees to execute an assignment on behalf of the Board of Trustees to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation of the following application for Letters of Patent of the United States and the invention represented thereby: George A. Digenis, Manvendra B. Shambhu and Michael C. Theodorakis, Serial Number 696, 802 filed June 16, 1976.

Background: George A. Digenis, Manvendra B. Shambhu and Michael C. Theodorakis have invented certain improvements in Radiodiagnostic Agent. They have assigned their rights to the invention to the University. In accord with usual practice it is recommended that the University assign the patent to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation.

II. Consolidation of Two Academic Divisions at Henderson Community College

Recommendation: that the Division of Biological Sciences and Related Technologies and the Division of Physical Sciences and Related Technologies at Henderson Community College be combined into a new Division of Natural Sciences and Related Technologies.

Background: The community colleges are organized on a division basis as basic educational units. The Division of Physical Sciences and Related Technologies at Henderson regularly has only four or five full-time faculty. The faculty and the Director feel that the programs in these divisions can be strengthened by combining the two divisions.

III. Appointments and/or Other Staff Changes

Recommendations: (1) that approval be given to the appointments and/or other changes which require Board action; and (2) that the report relative to appointments and/or changes already approved by the administration be accepted.

SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

I. University Research Professorships

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the naming of Professor Guy Davenport, Department of English: Professor William Ehmann, Department of Chemistry: Professor William R. Markesbery, Department of Neurology; and Professor Roger Wets, Department of Mathematics as University Research Professors for 1977-78.

Background: In April 1976 the University Senate recommended to the President the establishment of one-year Research Professorships as soon as possible and that priority be given to the goal of establishing permanent Research Professorships as funds become available. At its meeting in May 1976 the University of Kentucky Research Foundation voted to support four one-year Research Professorships to be activated in the fall of 1977.

A committee, chaired by the Dean of the Graduate School and Director of Research, was appointed by the President in August 1976 to develop criteria for the selection of Research Professors. Early in the fall of 1976 the Dean of the Graduate School sought nominations for the awards, indicating the criteria which had been developed by the committee, and named a five member committee from various sectors of the University to screen the nominations and recommend six to eight names to the Graduate Dean, who in turn submitted this list to the President with his recommendations for the awardees. The President is charged with the responsibility of making the final selections and submitting the names of the individuals chosen to the Trustees for approval.

The purpose of the University Research Professorships is to enhance and encourage scholarly research productivity, provide an opportunity for concentrated research effort for selected faculty members, recognize outstanding research achievement by members of its faculty, emphasize its research function, and to publicize its research accomplishments in order that the research function of the University be appropriately recognized and understood.

II. Candidates for Degrees- Community College System

Recommendation: that the degrees and certificates specified on the attached list be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed.

Background: At the November 19, 1965 meeting of the Board of Trustees authorization was given to the awarding of the Degrees of Associate in Arts, Associate in Science and Associate in Applied Science, and of certificates for those who complete prescribed programs of two years or less of college work. The candidates on the attached list are recommended to the President and the Board by the Community College Faculty and Vice President.

III. Appointments and/or Other Staff Changes

Recommendation: (1) that approval be given to the appointments and/or other changes which require Board action; and (2) that the report relative to appointments and/or changes already approved by the administration be accepted.

Background: The following recommended appointments and/or other staff changes require approval by the Board of Trustees in accordance with Part VIII-B of the Governing Regulations of the University. These recommendations are transmitted to the Board by the appropriate Vice President through the President and have his concurrence.

Under the Governing Regulations the authority to make certain appointments and/or other staff changes is delegated to the President or other administrators who are required to report their actions to the Board. This report follows the recommendations requiring Board approval.

3. Comments - The proposed increase for Germanic Languages will be supported by a private grant. An increase in ticket revenue will fund expenditure increases for Theatre Arts and Women's Intercollegiate Athletics. Increased student fee income from community service and continuing education programs will support additional expenditures for Madisonville Community College, Elizabethtown Community College, Social Professions, Kentucky Cheerleading Clinic, Nursing, and Medicine. An increase in federal appropriations will fund the Vocational Education expenditure change. Changes in sales and services income will support expenditure adjustments for the Dental Clinics and the Office of Research and Engineering Services. Increases in state appropriations will support the increase in the Reserve for Enrollment and Special Projects. The expenditure increase for the Agricultural Experiment Station is supported by a state grant increase. Additional county appropriations will fund the Agricultural Cooperative Extension budget increase. Additional grants from the Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the U.K. Medical Center will support increases in Colleges of Dentistry and Medicine. Private fund balances will support increases in general expenses and in the Annual Giving Program.

EXTERNAL AUDITOR FOR FISCAL YEAR 1976-77

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees engage the firm of Coopers & Lybrand, Certified Public Accountants, to perform an examination of the accounts of the University of Kentucky, the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, The Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center, the University of Kentucky Athletics Association, Health Care Collection Service, Inc., and the University of Kentucky Credit Union, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1977, and render reports for a fee, including expenses, of not more than \$55,000.00.

Background: The firm of Coopers & Lybrand examined the accounts of the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1976. The audit was both thorough and timely. The experience of the members of the firm in the examination of accounts of colleges and universities enables them to render an audit report which verifies the fiscal status of the University and evaluates the integrity of fiscal controls. The firm also possesses the ability to evaluate policies, procedures and practices utilized in fiscal management. This ability is especially valuable to administrative officers responsible for the conduct of financial administration.

ROOM AND BOARD RATES, 1977-78

1. Adjustment of Room and Board Rates--Undergraduate Residence
Halls--Regular Semester

Recommendation: That the semester room and board rates be adjusted to \$773 for the three meals, seven days per week plan (20 meals per week), \$690 for the choice of any two meals, seven days per week plan and \$641 for the choice of any two meals per day, five days per week (Monday through Friday).

Background: The present room and board rates (\$700 for the three meals, seven days per week, \$600 for the choice of any two meals, seven days per week and \$560 for the choice of any two meals, five days per week) are not sufficient to meet the higher operating costs and financial demands of the Housing and Dining System. The proposed adjustments result primarily from increased labor, food and utility costs. These rates cover debt service, all operating costs, and funds for replacement of furniture and equipment. The present rates have been in effect for two years.

II. Adjustment of Room Rates--Undergraduate Residence Halls--Summer School

Recommendation: That the Summer School rates be adjusted to \$180 for double occupancy and \$225 for single occupancy effective the 1978 summer session.

Background: The present rate is \$160 for double occupancy and \$200 for single occupancy. The summer rate is based on the same weekly rate as the regular semester with the single rate being 125% of the double occupancy rate. The calculation is based on a 16 week regular semester and an eight week summer session.

III. Adjustment of Apartment Rates for Married Student Housing

Recommendation: That the monthly rental rate be adjusted to \$115 for the efficiency apartments, \$130 for the one-bedroom apartments and \$140 for the two-bedroom apartments effective September 1, 1977.

Background: The present monthly rates (\$105 for an efficiency apartment, \$120 for a one-bedroom apartment and \$130 for a two-bedroom apartment) were established in 1975. The proposed adjustment results primarily from increased labor and utility costs. The rental rates include basic furnishings and utilities.

IV. Adjustment of Single Graduate Apartment Rates--Cooperstown

Recommendation: That the monthly rental rate for graduate efficiency apartments in Cooperstown be adjusted to \$117.50 (\$58.75 per student for double occupancy) and that the one-bedroom rate be adjusted to \$132.50 (\$66.25 per student for double occupancy).

Background: The present rates are \$107.50 for an efficiency apartment and \$122.50 for a one-bedroom apartment. The rate for the graduate apartment is the same monthly rate charged for married apartments with an adjustment for custodial supplies which are provided for graduate students but not for married students.

V. Adjustment of Single Graduate Apartment Rates--Commonwealth Village

Recommendation: That the monthly rental rate for graduate efficiency apartments in Commonwealth Village be adjusted to \$130.00 (\$65.00 per student for double occupancy) and that the one-bedroom rate be adjusted to \$150.00 (\$75.00 per student for double occupancy).

Background: The present rate of \$120.00 for the efficiency apartment and \$140.00 for the one-bedroom apartment is not sufficient to meet the higher operating costs and financial demands of this facility. The proposed adjustments results primarily from increased labor and utility costs.

VI. Adjustment of Conference and Guest Housing Rates

Recommendation: That the room rates for conference groups and guest rooms be adjusted as follows, effective the Summer, 1978:

RESOLUTION - RENAKER ESTATE

Recommendations:

- (1) That the Board formally accept the monies, securities, real property and other items accruing to the University by virtue of the Will of Violette B. Renaker, deceased, and express its appreciation therefor.
- (2) That the Board authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer to dispose of the real properties coming to the University from this estate and located in California and Texas, together with the surface rights (not including mineral or oil or gas rights) to the real property located in Oklahoma.

Background:

Violette B. Renaker died testate on June 10, 1973, a resident of Harrison County, Kentucky. By the terms of her Will, the residue of her estate was left to the "Medical College of University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky, to establish a Fund for Scholarships to train General Practitioners. This is to be known as the A. J. Beale Fund (Dr. Andrew Jackson Beale, Cynthiana, Kentucky) born 1829."

The Final Settlement of this estate has now been approved by the Harrison County Court.

In addition to cash, securities, and certain oil royalty interests, the assets of the estate coming to the University include an orange grove in California, four small parcels of property in Texas, and a farm in Oklahoma.

The California orange grove is producing no net income (taxes and maintenance exceed income); the properties in Texas produce very little net income and the rental of the surface rights in the Oklahoma property is relatively minimal. Thus, the Finance Committee recommends that authority be granted to sell the University's interests in the real property, except for the oil, gas and mineral interests in the Oklahoma property so as to maximize the income to the University from this estate.
