of ninety pounds, on the question of whether or not it would force the gas from the well into the plant of the Louisville Gas & Electric Company at Maytown, and you said that you believed it would not of itself with the present equipment they have there? I wish you would explain what you meant by that? (Defendants objected BY MR. HARKINS: I never made any such query as to the Louisville Gas & Electric Company-BY MR. MAY: The Pennagrade Oil & Gas Company, then, whatever it was. Go and take the Louisville Gas & Electric Company's name off of it then-BY MR. HARKINS: We are running our business. The compressors as I understand are too high to take in the low pressure. Q. Now, is there a method known to modern operators by which gas on a pressure of ninety pounds could be drawn from the well, and even less, by the proper equipment? Yes. A. Q. Explain to the jury what it is? A lower compressor would take it. A How low a rock pressure would it take out of the well? A. Even ten pounds.
