White House, GOP hold budget talks

WASHINGTON — GOP leaders are hopeful WASHINGTON — GOP leaders are hopeful that they will strike a budget agreement and send Congress home for the year by Wednesday, Republicans began moving toward some of President Clinton's demands on purchasing park lands, abortion and other issues. Nonetheless, White House and congressional negotiators yesterday wrangled over education funds and restrictions on mining and other industries. The disputes now cover only four of the 13 annual spending bills for the fiscal year that began Oct. 1 after months of battling over how to allocate the projected federal surplus.

Vietnam flooding death toll at 456

HUE, Vietnam — Millions of people Sunday began to collect their shattered lives following Vietnam's worst flooding in at least a century. After more than a week of rainstorms, forecasters said conditions appeared to be improving. But waters remained high as the remains of the tropical depression moved north and rainfall worked its way downstream, isolating the ancient city of Hue. The death toll has climbed to 456, with 94 missing. All available military personnel are involved in the country's biggest relief operation, with thousands of tons of emergency food en route to the region.

Scientists grow heart valves

ATLANTA — In search of better spare parts, scientists for the first time have grown heart valves from scratch in a test tube, then show that they work like nature's own—at least in animals, researchers said yesterday. The approach, called tissue engineering, is intended to create a fresh source of heart valves to replace those that wear out or are faulty from birth. Using the recipient's own cells, researchers hope to construct valves that will grow as the recipient does and work without blood-thinning drugs.

Agassi beats teen, wins Paris open

PARIS — Andre Agassi beat Russian teenager Marat Safin today to win the Paris Open. The French and U.S. Open champion had a little too much savvy for the unseeded Safin, winning 7-6 (7-1), 62, 46, 64 in 2 hours, 32 minutes. Agassi raised his game when it mattered, winning five of seven break points, compared to only three of 13 for Safin.

Tiger wins again

Four in a row: Win in Spain makes Tiger Woods golf's first ever \$6 million dollar man

But Jimenez, cheered by a Spanish gallery so partisan that it brought back memories of the Ryder Cup, made a bogey on the last hole to fall back into a tie and allow Woods another chance.

He took advantage, as he has

The Spanish Civil Guard, an armed squad in their paramilitary sunts, held back the gallery in the fairway as Woods made his birdie in the playoff to earn another Si million paycheck and bring an end to one of the most memorable years in golf.

Woods has won eight times in his last 11 tournaments, including a victory against a world-class field in Germany. He became the first player since Johnny Miller in 1974 with eight PGA Tour victories in one season.

with eight PGA Tour victories in with eight PGA Tour victories at with four straight victories, a streak that started and ended with a World Golf Championship title, he earned \$6.6 million, nearly \$3 million more than David Duval.

Jimenez, bidding to win for the hird time in Spain this year, was equally relentless and put the heat on Woods with a birdie on the 10th. The cheers rumbled up to the 11th green, the highest point at Valderrama, with Gibraltar in clear view. "Jimenez." Woods whispered to caddie Steve Williams.

He responded by chipping in for eagle from 25 feet, then hitting an 8-iron from 198 yards on the par-3 12th into 8 feet for another birdie. "He's on a mission," Williams.

Woods could do no wrong. From under a forest of cork trees, he found an opening no larger than

"(Davis) had full permission to attend the wedding," Neely said. "He was dismissed from the team."




"Our lack of wide receivers just killed us," Mumme said after the loss. "We couldn't get anybody open."


Davis started the first eight games of the season. He ranked third on the team in receiving with 26 catches for 312 yards and one touchdown.

Let's learn about antitrust laws!

Just in case some of you decide on building ust in case some of you decide on building the next software giant, it might be important to bone up on the three major federal anti-trust laws: The Sherman Anti-trust Act, the Clayton Act and the Federal Trade Commission Act.

It is the principal law expressing our national commitment national commitme to a free market economy in which competition free from private and governmental

governmental
restraints leads to
the best results to
the consumers.
The Sherman Anti-trust
Act outlaws all
contracts,
combinations and
conspiracies that conspiracies that unreasonably restrain interstate trade. This includes agreements among competitors to fix prices, rig bids and allocate customers. The Sherman Anti-trust Art also makes it a Sherman Anti-trust Act also makes it a crime to monopolize any part of interstate commerce. An unlawful monopoly exists when only one firm provides a product or service, and it has become the only supplier not because its product or service is superior to to there, but by suppressing suppressing competition through anti-competitive conduct. Sherman Anti-trust Act violations are violations are punished as criminal felonies. The Department of Justice alone is empowered to bring criminal prosecutions under the Sherman Anti-trust Act.

The Clayton Act

It is a civil statute (it is a civil statute (it carries no criminal penalties) that was significantly amended in 1950. The Clayton Act prohibits mergers or acquisitions that are likely to lessen competition. Under the Act, the government overnment challenges those mergers that a careful economic analysis shows likely to increase prices to consumers. The Act also prohibits certain other business practices that under certain circumstances may circumstances may harm competition

The Federal Trade Commission Act

It prohibits unfair methods of methods of competition in interstate commerce, but carries no criminal penalties. It also created the Federal Trade Commission to police violations of the Act.

WASHINGTON — The nation's top antitrust official says the government is "looking at a full range of remedies" to punish Microsoft following a judge's ruling that the software giant misused its monopoly powers.

Despite U.S. District Judge Thomas Penfield Jackson's preliminary findings against Microsoft, however, both the government and the company expressed a willingness to consider an out-of-court settlement.

In an open letter, Mi-

In an open letter, Microsoft Chairman Bill Gates
said the company is committed to "a fair and responsible"
resolution. The company's
chief operating officer, Bob
Herbold, said on the Sunday

talk shows that "there's nothing we'd like more than to settle this case."

In Gates' letter, which appeared as a full-page advertisement in The Washington Post, he wrote that "Microsoft is committed to resolving this matter in a fair and responsible manner, while ensuring that the fundamental principles of consumer benefit and innovation are protected."

The letter, addressed "To Our Customers, Partners and Shareholders," also appeared on Microsoft's World Wide Web site, dated Friday, the day Jackson released his ruling.
