Reagan left out a one-year dead-line for South Africa to begin dis-mantling apartheid or face tougher sanctions, and instead ordered a commission to monitor progress to-ward reform in South Africa.



Reagan's sanctions finally bring action against apartheid

After a summer of discontent in South Africa. President Reagan has finally imposed his own version of sanctions against the white-majority government — a wise departure from his previous position

from his previous position.

Reagan's measures, designed to head off a congressional bill he had opposed, include a ban on the sale of Krugerrands, most new bank loans and the shipment of nucle-

gerratus, most new bank loans and the supment of modera ar and computer technology used to enforce aparthield. He also announced requirements for most American business-es in South Africa to follow fair employment practices. In the news conference yesterday where he made his move. Reagan said he was not abandoning his "construc-tive engagement" policy, just making it "active construc-tive engagement"

tive engagement." Dolicy, just making it "active constructive engagement."

One hopes that comment was simply window dressing, designed to cover up the apparent failure of "constructive engagement." Ever since the South African situation began to turn especially nasty, Reagan has confined himself to tempered criticism of the Pretoria government — what he thought was quiet diplomacy to persuade the governing whites to share power with the black majority. If this is "constructive engagement" the policy is a failure. Although he claims there has been "great improvement over what has ever existed before," including his second was been swayed by Reagan's criticism or his exhortations to negotiation.


The president deserves some credit for recognizing this situation, even though he may not acknowledge the short-comings of his policy. International critics of apartheid—and South African blacks, too—have attacked the Reagan administration for bolstering apartheid even while verbally criticizing it. President Reagan's limited economic sanctions should defuse that criticism and remove a potential embarrassment for the United States.

Sanctions were actually the only next reasonable move. However, some people, including administration officials, have stated that sanctions will have no significant impact on the South African economy. But it would be best for critics to wait and see what effect the measures have before dismissing them.
