It took a hook shot from Elliot for the Cats to score their first points, which came four minutes into the second half, but the shot sparked a 9-0 Cats run that brought them within two points.

With undefeated Louisville clinging to a one-possession lead, senior Katie Olson drew a couple of fouls and sank a jump shot to put her team up by eight.


UK again hit a scoring spurt, notching seven unanswered to inch within one point.

"It has hurt us," DeMoss said of Roddy's absence. "You fhave to) learn to play without players."

So far the Cats have shown an inability to do that. And unless someone steps up, a season that started with so much promise is in danger of fading into disappointmenen.



community, (the university) will be impacted," Newberry said. "There won't be any particular role for the university to play right now. Once we get into the engineering assessment, that will be necessary in order to figure out how to address the surface-water issues. Some things may be neces-sary, but I don't have any thoughts on that right now."

mowement said the complaint against Lexington is hardly unique, though it will very likely be expensive and take a long time to complete. Repairs and improvements to make the systems adequate are estimated to cost as much as \$300 million alone, not counting fines levied for the violations.

"Many municipalities around the country have been sued by the EPA or are in the process of being sued for similar claims," Bender said. They can be costly and can take as many as 15 to 20 years to resolve."


