Friday 20: Insight Movie Night

Fabulous: The Story of Queer Cinema

The Insight Group invites everyone to our Friday night movie on Friday, June 20 at the Pride Center, 389 Waller Ave. We will have snacks to share.

Picking up where "The Celluloid Closet" left off, Fabulous! The Story of Queer Cinema shows the explosion of outand-proud film making in the U.S., from Kenneth Anger's Fireworks (1947) right up to Brokeback Mountain."

Over the course of 81-minute running time, this documentary highlights queer cinema landmarks from the mid-20th century to the present. Where "The Celluloid Closet" focused more on the behind-the-screen stories of gay talent and the hidden homosexual subtexts in Hollywood's golden years, "Fabulous!" celebrates the films featuring unequivocally gay characters or those made by out directors on homosexual themes.

The landmarks are here including John Waters' early movies and coming-out stories such as "Making Love" (1982) and "Desert Hearts" (1985). But there are also lesser know films like "dykesploitation", soft porn originally made for a straight male audiences but now embraced as kitsch fun by lesbian and gay viewers.

A major focus of the film is the 1990s with the explosion of New Queer Cinema. It covers the controversies over the National Endowment for the Arts support for Todd Haynes' "Poison," Tom Kalin's "Swoon". It also touches on controversies within the gay community over negative images of LGBT people in films.

The last 20 minutes takes the story up to the "Will & Grace" present, featuring gay characters on television, and straight actors who regularly win awards for playing

gay, lesbian or transgender characters. John Waters quips that it would be radical to see a gay actor playing a gay character these days.



Discussion on Gender Michigan Womyn's Music Festival

The Michigan Womyn's Music Festival has greatly influenced how I think and live. One big factor is seeing thousands of women, mostly lesbians, looking so delightfully varied. I will notice different aspects in different years. My first year I was 39 and needed to see all those women between 40 and 80 that were joyfully part of that community.

Every year there is a workshop or two that keeps me thinking for months - if not years. The first year I attended I had been out for less than a year and was still married. That year the workshops for womyn over 40 showed me that many women had been married and often took some time to get divorced. It took me a little while, though, to actually tell people I was married with children.

Last year I attended a workshop that was structured to be a discussion among several generations of women on the topic of gender identity, including butch/fem, trans identities defined in a number of different ways, gender queer and more. Women who were of different ages, and coming out in different time periods, were encouraged to come and talk about how they look at gender identity and expression.

There were many different opinions and stories shared during that workshop and I was only able to write down parts of the conversation, some of which I will share here. These are not necessarily completely accurate quotations, but i did try to capture the essence. I did not always record the age of the various speakers, but I will share what I made note of.

Person about 50. "As a young teen I didn't see any women that I thought I could grow up to be. I came to the Michigan Festival for the first time when I was 19. I saw women who were like me and I found the future open up; perhaps I would be like that older woman or something like this one.

My identity as a lesbian became more specifically butch after that. Now, going on thirty years later, I consider myself gender queer. I did consider, for a while, that I might be transsexual but I wanted to continue to be a part of this strong woman's community. And I am glad I kept my breasts because women I want to be in relationship with, like breasts. Gender queer works for me."

60+ years "I came out in my early twenties and found family in the bars in Chicago. I had to choose butch or fem and it seemed pretty obvious that I was butch and I was comfortable with that. But a few years later I was becoming a feminist and I learned that the "butch role" was considered by some of my feminists friends to be mimicking straight men. Because of that I consciously tried to be androgynous for a while. When I came to Michigan for the first time I saw many butch women who weren't androgynous and I realized that I could just be myself here, whatever that was. I now believe that I am not mimicking men even if I wear men's clothes a lot of the time. Butch and male are not the same for me. If I knew more about the trans option when I was 25, I might have taken that route. At my age now, I am glad I did not do that.

34 year old woman - with beard. "I have loved coming to Michigan for the last 15 years. I started growing facial hair during puberty and my mother hated it. She also had facial hair but I was more "masculine" in a number of ways and she continually made negative comments about it. I found Michigan a place where I could be myself and learned that women I was attracted to, were attracted to me. But the last few years have been difficult in a new way. Women ask me if I am taking "T" and someone actually followed me to the showers. I think we need to focus on rejecting any binary system. Many of us just don't fit into that and shouldn't have to. If we could continue these conversations in

many places, maybe we can have more accepting communities that don't make people fit into boxes. I would like to see Michigan be accepting of transwomen who wish to present as women - in whatever way works for them."

27 year old. "I thought I was a boy when I was young, like three to five. My parents told me I was a girl but when I didn't agree, they didn't argue with me but called me a tom boy. When I went to public school they asked me to go along with the girl label for a while and it became ok with me. Some trans people have this experience also but I did not feel the strong gender disconnect that many of them experience. Going through puberty was not bad for me. Close to that time my mom provided me with information about sexual orientation. One ftm (female to male) friend has told me recently that he thinks I should consider trans, that butch isn't "enough." I seems a little like what some of you

experienced - pressure to be butch or fem, not in the middle, or to be andro, not on the edges. We need to stop pressuring each other. I am happy as a butch lesbian. We should continue these discussions each year."

42 year old "I do love that we have womyn only space. There are many festival and having one be womyn only is important to me. Sexism is still very real; racism isn't over, sexism isn't When I first came here there over. were transwomen at the fest and that was ok. I have written the festival staff several times on this issue. I hope they will consider allowing women who have surgically transitioned to be here, with no checking of anatomy. But I would also ask that people who still have penises not be as public as several were last year. That is going to delay any changes in policy.

NEED ADVICE? GO TO HELENA HANDBASKET

Q... Dear Helena, I'm in love with a man at work. I don't know if he is straight or gay. He speaks to me and smiles at me. When he smiles and looks at me with is gorgeous blue eyes, I go weak. Should I come out to him and go for it or just suffer in silence?

HH... Baby doll, do you think you are the first one to fall for a guy at work? It happens honey. You are going to have to handle this carefully since it is at work. Some places will actually fire people if they become involved with a fellow employee. Just continue to be nice and ask a few pertinent questions such as where he likes to go out when he is on a date or ask him what "type" he is interested in. If he says long legged blondes with big boobs then you'll know he's straight. If you really feel bold, you can always tell him he has the bluest eyes you've ever seen.
