Administrators displaced: After fire, workers temporarily moved across campus

The exact amount of damages has not yet been determined on the May 15 Administration Building fire.

Appraisers from the construction company's insurer, the State Fire and Tornado Fund, which UK pays insurance money to, and the Unitaged materials recovered from the building that have been moved to the Buell Armory, according to UK Vice President of Fiscal Affairs George DeBin.

There is no set time for appraisals to be complete, as DeBin said the process would be "purposefully slow" to ensure accuracy still being remove the propose the prop

A number of documents

have been removed and are in the process of being recovered, but the process will take time, DeBin said.

The fire began Tues.,
May 15, around 4 p.m. when a construction worker soldering copper eaves with a price of the process of the construction of the constructio

building's attic, said Lexington Fire Chief William

The fire spread through
the attic, third floor and

Firefighters made it to the
scene within minutes and began work to extinguish the
blaze.
When Ure President

"The entire building was
virtually flooded." Wethington said. "It was an absolute
soggy mess."

Tales from the fire



When firefighters first attempted to extinguish the fire, they were forced to do so with low water pressure.

The firefighters tapped two fire hydrants nearby, but the hydrants drew water from the same pool, according to Garry Beach, UK's Fire Marshal.

The problem was quickly solved after a phone call to Kentucky-American Water Company.

During the Administration Building fire, portraits of past UK Presidents James Patterson and Henry Barker were taken from the building, and moved to the outside. Bryan Caulk, a UK police officer, moved the portraits to cruisers to prevent the paintings from being damaged further by smoke outside the building and water mist. or cruisers to prevent the paintings from being damaged further by smoke outside the building and are currently in the process of being restored.

Besides the artwork in the building, there were also a number of rare documents stored in the legal counsel office, including some dating back to the 1700s.

"Hopefully, we can replace most of it, but there's some stuff that will be irreplaceable," Katherine Adams, an associate general counsel, said.

UK Legal Counsel Richard Plymale said the counsel's office also stored ancient maps of UK property and original contracts of past employees including athletic coaches.

Among the spectators at the scene of the fire was former UK President (UK Singletary said every president of the university had worked in the administration building.

"It's like losing a close personal friend," he said.

UK employees: After spring

choices now being processed

of controversy, health care

Employees' choices for health insurance plans are now being processed, according to UK Vice President of Fiscal Affairs George DeBin.

DeBin said statistics regarding the choices should be available Friday.

The increase in health benefits rates inspired a series of protests and petitions during the spring semester from staff members and student organizations.

It is unclear at this time how many employees opted to go with plans other than those provided by UK.

The deadline for turning in the health insurance form was extended by one week and a rate decrease was announced with the University picking up almost \$800,000 more than originally planned.

For registered students mailing their payment, tuition and fees, and housing and dining fees, for those living oncampus, must be postmarked on or before Aug. 1.



Reading the signs

For UK students parking lot entrance signs are a familiar sight. The signs inform students when lots are not patrolled and can prevent citations.

For some students, finding a place to park on campus can be one of the most strenuous activities of their day.

A valid parking permit is required to park in most places on UK's campus. At the entrance to each parking lot is a sign stating which type of permit is required to park, the hours the lot is patrolled and if it is a tow-away zone. Although a permit does not guarantee a parking space, it does give students the privilege to park in the designated areas.

Brian Hanners, an international finance and foreign language junior, insists park-ing permits are a must for UK students.

"Without a car on campus

ing permits are a must for UK students.

Without a car on campus I don't know how one could manage their free time outside of classes," Hanners said. "If you don't have a permit you are pretty much limited to staying on campus most of the time.

The time for purchasing parking permits is held beginning in the summer prior to the start of the academic year.

Permits are issued in accordance with availability and eligibility requirements determined by UK Parking Services.

Students are given the option of purchasing a permit for one semester at a time or for the entire year.
For students to obtain commuter permits, they must have at least 60 credit hours at UK and live outside a one-mile radius of central campus.
Students amplying for real.

Students applying for residential parking permits must live in University housing and have at least 30 credit hours.

Incoming freshmen are eligible to purchase K permits, which allow them to park at Commonwealth Stadium.

Since parking spots are limited, juniors, seniors and graduate students are given first priority.

Students that entertain visitor on campus need to acquire parking passes for their stay if they wish to park in campus lost.

Prince withdraws from NBA draft and will return to UK





The returns of Tayshaun Prince for his senior year and junior Marvin Stone have fans dreaming of another natititle for the Cats.

A senior season: With Prince leading the Wildcats, the pressure will be on Tubby Smith to produce another national championship

Tayshaun Prince will stay at UK for one more season, and one can only imagine the possibilities.

After Prince's mother said last week that the SEC's reigning Most Valuable Player removed himself from the NBA draft, the visions of a Cat trip to the Final Four in 2002 are more vivid than ever.

more vivid than ever.

The news has helped Cat fans quickly relieve the pain of an unexpected ousting by USC in last year's Sweet Sixteen.

But by the same token, the return of "The Prince" will make any similar defeat next

make any similar defeat next season even more unaccept-able for the UK faithful. While it is undeniable that Prince will help UK, his return could create some rifts in Big Blue Heaven.

The pressure on Smith to win has been huge since the Cats' NCAA title win in 1980. A 5-5 start last season had Cat fans up in arms.

The expectations created by Prince's return will only amplify that potentially brutal sentiment toward Smith.

The team's talent with Prince is broad and balanced, and, as far as fans are concerned, there is no excuse for failure.

UK's 2002 roster may be more daunting for opponents than any squad in the Smith era.

The return of Jules Camara to the lineup has come along with Marvin Stone's decision not to transfer. Combined with the talents of Prince, Jason Parker, Marquis Estill, Erik

Daniels and rugged freshman Chuck Hayes, UK has arguably the deepest front line in the na-

ly stacked with proven and fu-ture stars.

Gerald Fitch, J.P. Blevins
and Cliff Hawkins will share
time at the guard positions.
Highly-regarded freshmen
like McDonald's All-American
Rashaad Carruth and Kentucky Mr. Basketball Josh Cartier give Smith even more options on the perimeter.

This is even before factoring in the possibility that AllSEC selection Keith Bogans
could follow Prince's footsteps
and come back to Lexington.

The situation facing Smith is reminiscent of Rick Pitino's 1995 team that lost a NCAA regional final to North Carolina. Pitino was said to have had more talent for the next season than he knew what to do with, and UK was everyone's favorite for the title. Fortunately for Cat fans, Pitino was able to mold the 12-deep Cats of '96 into one of the most dominating teams of the decade.

With Prince still at his disposal. Smith has the task of keeping the rabid Uksakethall fans happy by succeeding like Pitino.

Fight for your right to party

Lexington City Council tries to take advantage of vacationing students, drafts party plan

While students at UK have been celebrating the end of the

While students at UK have been celebrating the end of the semester, members of Lexington's Urban County Council have been doing their best to stop these sort of celebrations from happening next year. The council is considering an ordinance that would drastically affect UK students.

The ordinance, the Lexington Area Party Plan (LAPP), should not be considered until the majority of UK's student body arrives in the fall. This decision will impact the campus community, and all students should have the opportunity to be informed and voice their opinions.

Under LAPP, people hosting parties in Lexington who are cited for causing a disturbance, would be prohibited from having parties for one year. It specifically targets people living around UK. This is too extreme. LAPP would make it so residents of a property could not host anything that could cause any type of disturbance complaint. The ordinance's definition of a disturbance includes littering, excessive noise,

cause any type of disturbance complaint. The ordinance's definition of a disturbance includes littering, excessive noise, possession of alcohol by minors and unruly behavior.

The Kernel is not advocating destructive behavior. To get respect, students have to show it as well, but LAPP unfairly discriminates against college students. Students deserve equal rights, along with equal responsibility.

LAPP was originally named the College Area Party Plan but was changed to either make the ordinance politically correct or to just broaden its scope. Name change or not, the ordinance obviously targets college students.

One of the arguments in support of this ordinance is it

One of the arguments in support of this ordinance is it will prevent police from being repeatedly called to the same place and being taken away from the "real" crime, but it must be remembered that students pay for police services just as other citizens do. Their rights should not be stripped

away just to make it more convenient for police officers.

The council must keep in mind that many UK students vote in Lexington. LAPP will not be forgotten during the next election.


