Dr is this I appointed James B Walker my agent  
to sell a lot in mossont hickman county and  
to collect a note on James Drysdale in the year 1860  
He sold the lot 1860 which he states in his letter file  
among the papers. He died in the fall 1862. And  
owing to the war and derangements of the mail  
I could not hear from him, and when I did  
hear the estate was settle up and my claim  
debared by limitation. Now I wish you to have  
this claim renewed by a special act if it can  
be done or any other way that it can be done  
so let me know if any thing can be done

Mr J.C. Irvine Sir I avail myself of the opportunity of writing to you we are all well at this time the connections and friend are well times are hard here every thing is up to a good price though nothing to sell scarcely To the subject I have after a long struggle sold your lot in Moscow to H. & C. R. Ray for one hundred & fifty Dollars and have given them my bond for your title and I inclose this deed for you to acknowledge and send the clk's certificate and send your bond and all other writings that you have pertaining to said lot I have received \$75 & have taken their note for the other 75 payable in twelve months from this date I want you to let me no how I must send the money to you so you can get it and say how much I must have for my trouble I have not got that money out of M. A. Drysdall yet though I think I will get it before a great while If there is any alteration to be mad in y this deed make it to suit your self write soon and let me no have all the papers give my complime nts to all So nothing more at present
