



the honorable JOHN Y. BROWN, JR. Governor of Kentucky



JOHN Y. BROWN, JR., became Kentucky's 55th governor on December 11, 1979, succeeding Julian M. Carroll.

Born on December 28, 1933, Governor Brown graduated from Lafayette High School in his hometown, Lexington, and obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Kentucky in 1957. He graduated from the UK College of Law in 1960.

The Governor served in the U.S. Army from 1959-1965.

He has been named the Outstanding Young Man of America by the National Junior Chamber of Commerce (1965), as one of the Outstanding Civic Leaders of America (1967) and Louisville's Outstanding Young Man by the same group. Lions Club International named him to a recipient of the Outstanding American Award (1974) and he is the youngest person to be named to the University of Kentucky Hall of Fame.

He has three children, John Y. Brown, III (16), Eleanore (14) and Sandra (13). He is married to the former Phyllis George. They attend the Walnut Street

Church, Louisville.

## JAMES G. AMATO Mayor Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

JAMES G. AMATO took office as mayor on January 2, 1978. In doing so, he became the second mayor of the consolidated city and county governments.

A native of Lexington, Amato has been a practicing attorney since 1964. He is a member of the Fayette County Bar Association, the Kentucky Bar Association, and the Kentucky Law Enforcement. He formerly held positions as Alcoholic Beverage Control Commissioner for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Director of Citizens for Judicial Improvement, Inc., Municipal Court Judge and City Prosecutor.

As chief executive of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the mayor is authorized to supervise, administer and control all departments of government.

The mayor is elected on a non-partisan ballot every four years. He is assisted principally by the Chief Administrative Officer and commissioners of the six departments.

## DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY President, University of Kentucky

The University of Kentucky has become one of the major institutions of higher learning in the United States under the leadership of Dr. Otis Singletary, the eighth president of the University.

Dr. Singletary was named president

of the University in August, 1969. He had previously served as executive vice-chancellor for academic affairs in the University of Texas System and director of the Job Corps program for the Office of Economic Opportunity.

Dr. Singletary, a native of Gulfport, Miss., holds degrees from Millsaps College and Louisiana State University.

As president of the principal institu-

tion of higher learning in the Commonwealth, Dr. Singletary is greatly concerned with the University's role as a land-grant institution, a "people's university" accessible to all who can profit from education.

In the nine years he has been president, the University has grown to where there are now more than 22,000 students on the Lexington campus and more than 17,000 students in UK's 13 community colleges, and the University has become one of the major research institutions in the country.

Recognition of his service to the University was evidenced by the UK Alumni Association, which presented to Dr. Singletary its Alumni Service Award—an honor rarely bestowed upon a non-alumnus of the University.

Dr. Singletary is the author of two books and several monographs.

A Navy veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict, he is a commander in the U. S. Naval Reserve. He and Mrs. Singletary, the former Gloria Walton, have three children: Bonnie, Scot and Kendall.

The Singletarys live at Maxwell Place, traditional home of UK presidents.

## Athletics Department

## CLIFFORD O. HAGAN Director

Expansion of the football training room and addition of a beautiful player's lounge at Shively Sports Center, new carpeting in the stadium football offices, a new basketball office complex in Memorial Coliseum, re-arrangement of the baseball fences and a new surface for the running track are just a few of the recent improvements that signify the continuing progress of UK athletics since Cliff Hagan joined the Wildcat Staff seven years ago.

Recognized nationally as a progressive, business-oriented and promotion-minded administrator, Hagan has seen and overseen vast improvements in all phases of an ever-expanding operation that has encompassed 16 sports since the men's and



women's programs were merged in July of last year.

The merger, under Hagan's direction, has been orderly, with office space remodeled and in some cases created to make room for the women's coaching and administrative staff.

The indoctrination of Hagan into the UK athletics administrative structure

came in 1972, when he was named assistant to Harry C. Lancaster and given the task of implementing the Blue & White Fund for 57,600-seat Commonwealth Stadium and later for Rupp Arena. The fruits of his labors in this area have provided the additional financial support that has elevated the UK athletics program into a first class operation.

Hagan was named Athletics Director in July 1975 following Lancaster's retirement.

Hagan also has been an advocate of a strong scholar-athlete program, feeling "a genuine commitment to provide all the academic support and encouragement we can to help our athletes leave our campus with a college education and a degree."

On the personal side, Hagan received one of his highest individual honors last May when he became the first University of Kentucky basketball player to be installed in the Naismith Memorial National Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

He is married to the former Martha Milton of Owensboro. They have four children: Lisa, Laurie, Amy, and Kip.

## FRANK HAM Assistant Director of Athletics

FRANK HAM became Assistant Director of Athletics in July 1975 soon after Cliff Hagan succeeded Harry C. Lancaster as Director of Athletics.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Ham came to the University in 1969 as administrative Assistant to footpall coach John Ray, and was reassigned to the Athletic Director's staff in 1972 when Ray resigned.

Ham graduated from high school at Niles, Michigan, and completed his undergraduate work at Indiana University and coached high school football and track at John Adams High in South Bend in 1944-46 and then returned to Olivet as athletic director and head football and basketball coach.

In 1951, he became assistant to the president at Olivet, with responsibilities in public and alumni relations. He was in private business from 1954 until 1968.



## SUE FEAMSTER Assistant Director of Athletics



SUE FEAMSTER joined the athletics association July 1, 1978, with the merger of the men's and women's programs. Feamster had been the director of women's athletics prior to her appointment as assistant director of athletics.

A native of Frankfort, she came to the University as a graduate student in 1970, was named assistant director of campus recreation in 1972 and director of women's athletics in 1974.

Feamster graduated from Franklin County High School where she was an outstanding tennis player and athlete. While in college she earned letters in tennis, field hockey, basketball and track from Indiana University and Kentucky State University, where she earned her B.S. degree and graduated with honors.

## LARRY IVY Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance

Adding a new dimension to UK athletics was the appointment three years ago of LARRY IVY as Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance.

Ivy, who came to the University as Director of Housing in 1969, is involved primarily with the administration and management of financial aspects, and develops and initiates policies for accounting procedures and related business management activities of the department.

## JOE B. HALL Head Basketball Coach

JOE B. HALL is beginning his eighth season as coach of the Wildcats, coming off a year in which he took a team depleted through graduations and molding them into a contender for the SEC title and receiving an invitation to enter the National Invitation Tournament. The team finished with 19 wins and 12 losses.

Since becoming head coach in 1972, succeeding the legendary Adolph F. Rupp, Hall has accumulated a record of 154 wins and 54 losses. His eleven year coaching record stands at 230-110. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five year mark at Regis College, a 19-6



LEONARD HAMILTON is beginning his sixth year at Kentucky after serving three years as assistant coach at Austin Peay. An outstanding recruiter with seemingly tireless energy, Hamilton has contributed heavily to maintaining a high level of young talent at UK. Specializing in coaching defense, Hamilton has had a positive impact on Wildcat defensive

JOE DEAN, JR., played against the Wildcats for three years at Mississippi State University, before serving as Bulldog assistant coach while earning a masters degree in physical education. An outstanding student, Dean was named to the 1976 Academic All-SEC second team. A native of Baton Rouge,

Hall became Rupp's top assistant in 1969 when Harry C. Lancaster was named athletics director. His record as freshmen coach was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshmen Champions by Baskethall News.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U. S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base, in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under

DICK PARSONS, in his eighth year as Joe B. Hall's No. 1 assistant, returned to the University as baseball coach in 1969. Before giving up his position to join the basketball staff on a full time basis, he molded a baseball team (1971) which established or tied 15 school records. He is a graduate of UK where he played guard under former Coach Adolph F. Rupp.

Parsons came to the University in 1958 after an outstanding career as a four-sports star at Harlan High School, where


"A lot of good things have happened to me since I came to Kentucky, but most

## The Last Time

## Kentucky vs. Miss. State

It was almost one month ago today that Kentucky and Mississippi State met on the MSU campus in Starkville for the 59th time in their SEC history. Behind a 61.9 shooting percentage, the Wildcats handed the Bulldogs their worst defeat, 89-67, in the four-year history of Humphrey Coliseum. The UK win, combined with Georgia's 55-54 upset of Tennessee, gave Kentucky a three way tie for first in the SEC with the Vols and LSU.

For the second straight game, Kentucky placed all five starters in double figures, led by senior guard Kyle Macy's 20 points and forward Fred Cowan's 17. Dirk Minniefield, LaVon Williams and Sam Bowie added 14, 12, and 10 points, respectively. Minniefield handed out a game high 13 assists for the victors.

"Yes, it was a good win for us," commented Kentucky coach Joe B. Hall. "It's an important hump to be over because its always tough to win on the road, and we were in a slump coming in here."

Building up a six point halftime margin, 43-37, a sellout crowd of 8,830 MSU fans looked on as the Cats methodically picked apart the Mississippi State 2-1-2 zone.

Freshman sensation Jeff Malone provided excitement for Bulldog fans by hitting on 12-of-21 shots and three-of-five charity tosses to tally 27 points. Center Rickey Brown added 22 points for the Dogs as they dropped their fourth consecutive SEC game. Brown connected on only nine-of-22 field goal attempts.





## Mississippi State

Starkville, Mississippi

Currently in its second century of progress, Mississippi State has gained a far-reaching reputation for its innovations, research, and an expanding curriculum since it was founded on Feb. 28, 1878.

Its first president, Stephen D. Lee, took the first small steps which led to today's giant strides at MSU in the field of education in Mississippi. But the university has not rested on its past laurels.

The addition of the College of Veterinary Medicine and the School of Agriculture represents an investment of \$30 million and gives the university one of the most well-rounded curricula in the country. Located in the rolling hills of Northeast Mississippi's prairie region, just a few hours drive from the most distant point in the state, Mississippi State University is the largest institution of higher learning in the Magnolia State and one of the fastest growing schools in Dixie.

In 1895, only two courses, agriculture and mechanical arts, were available to the 213 students then enrolled.

Prior to that date, agriculture was the only course offered from the initial opening on October 6, 1880 (the school actually was founded two years earlier), when 136 students of college grades came by train, buggy and on foot, to launch Mississippi's land grant college.


During the past decade MSU has enjoyed its greatest building program. Recently occupied is the \$2 million McCool Hall, which houses the School of Business

and Industry. McCool Hall faces the parade grounds, adjacent to the Union. The Cobb Institute of Archeology, opposite Hilbun Hall, has also been occupied in the mid-1970's.








Most other stations that play rock and roll limit their play list to a few best sellers, a few pick hits of the future and a few golden oldies.



program. Before, I cared only about myself. Now, I've learned to care about others, and it has taught me to be more considerate. It just made me realize there are other people in the world besides me. The discipline required by Coach Hall has been a strong influence on me."

Of the three seniors, Jay Shidler's career has had the most ups and downs, mainly due to the pressure he put on himself including being heavily critical of himself when he didn't play like a world beater. After a let down midway through the four years, Shidler came back and became a main cog of the team the past two seasons. Through his eventful career, he has remained probably one of the most popular players to put on a Kentucky uniform.

Looking at his tenure at UK, Shidler says, "I really hope the people of Kentucky know how much I appreciate the way they've treated me. I really don't know why the fans like me, but I'm not complaining. I love it. It just hurts me that I've not been able to give them all

they deserve.
"I've learned a great deal since I came to Kentucky and the fans have been so nice. I just want to repay them."

He has.

In the Cats' drive toward the national title in 1978, Michigan State almost upset the apple cart in the regionals. However, in the final seconds with the game hanging on a thread, Kyle Macy maneuvered an opponent into committing a foul and drew two shots at the freethrow line. 
### **Sports** Information


### **Basketball Trainer**

The University of Kentucky and the Lexington Center provide for your convenience and welfare, a First Aid Station on the Purple Concourse. Persons with any type of chronic medical problem are requested to leave their name and seat location with the nurse on duty at the First Aid Station. Rupp Arena will normally open one hour prior to any scheduled event. Please do not leave the arena until the conclusion of an event or game or at halftime if you plan to re-enter. No "Passout" tickets will be issued and you will not be permitted to re-enter.

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all foods and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above. Arena personnel are instructed to enforce this rule in the interest of safety.

#### **PUBLIC ADDRESS**


Messages for the public address an-nouncer are acceptable only in emergencies and must be approved by the Sports Information Director at University of Kentucky basketball events.


