Poverty center gains \$1.48 million for research

The UK Center for Poverty Research will use funds to study relief programs

The UK Center for Poverty Research has received a \$1.48 million grant from the US. Department of Health and Human Services to research the effectiveness of poverty relief programs.

UK acquired the grant after winning a competition of written proposals by degree-granting universities with graduate programs. Other national research centers at the Universities of Michigan, Wisconsin-Madison and Washington-Seattle also competed.

"The grant will go to support graduate student, faculty and academic research," said James Zillak, a professor in the Gatton College of Business and Economics and director of the UKCPR. With this new research money, the UKCPR plans to show how poverty is increasing throughout the Kentucky and the southern region of the UKCPR. States, comprised of 16 states from Florida to Texas.

that can simmer for an extended period of time. Traditional ground beef or turkey chili goes nicely with sour cream, cheese and spaghetti. For future meals, store leftover chili in plastic bags or Tupperware. You can thaw the chili out in the refrigerator or microwave it for extended meals throughout the week.

Recipe: Busy Day Chili

2 teaspoons of vegetable oil
1 pound of ground turkey or ground beef
1 chopped onion
1 chopped yellow pepper
1 package of chill spices
4 cups of vegetable juice
2 14-ounce cans chill-flavored chunky tomatoes
1 can of dark red kidney beans

Heat oil in a large pot. Add turkey or beef, yellow pepper and onion. Cook over medium heat until the meat is no longer pink. Add remaining ingredients reduce heat to medium-low and stir occasionally. Let simmer for 5 to 7 minutes (or longer if desired). Do not let the chili reach a rolling boil.

Top with sour cream and cheese.

Presently, a driver in the university's general motor pool must be a UK employee, be at least 25 years old and have a valid driver's license and have five years' driving experience to drive 15-passenger vans. UK's most hat travel about 250,000 miles each year.

"It's important people understand the risks associated with using these vans." Tyson said. "If you're going to drive them like a passenger car, you're going to get into trouble."


