Administration



DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY
President, University of Kentucky

The University of Kentucky has become one of the major institutions of higher learning in the United States under the leadership of Dr. Otis Singletary, the eighth president of the University.

Dr. Singletary was named president of the University in August, 1969. He had previously served as executive vice-chancellor for academic affairs in the University of Texas System and director of the Job Corps program for the Office of Economic Opportunity.

Dr. Singletary, a native of Gulfport, Miss., holds degrees from Millsaps College and Louisiana State University.

As president of the principal institution of higher learning in the Commonwealth, Dr. Singletary is greatly concerned with the University's role as a land-grant institution, a "people's university" accesible to all who can profit from education.

In the nine years he has been

president, the University has grown to where there are now more than 22,000 students on the Lexington campus and more than 17,000 students in UK's 13 community colleges. The University has also become one of the major research institutions in the country.

Recognition of his service to the University was evidenced by the UK Alumni Association, which presented to Dr. Singletary its Alumni Service Award — an honor rarely bestowed upon a non-alumnus of the University.

Dr. Singletary is the author of two books and several monographs.

A Navy veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict, he is a commander in the U. S. Naval Reserve. He and Mrs. Singletary, the former Gloria Walton, have three children: Bonnie, Scot and Kendall.

The Singletarys live at Maxwell Place, traditional home of UK presidents.

Athletics Director

Expansion of the football training room and addition of a beautiful player's lounge at Shively Sports Center, new carpeting in the stadium football offices, a new basketball office complex in Memorial Coliseum, rearrangement of the baseball fences and a new surface for the running track are just a few of the recent improvements that signify the continuing progress of UK athletics since Cliff Hagan joined the Wildcat Staff eight years

Recognized nationally as a progressive, business-oriented and promotion-minded administrator, Hagan has seen and overseen vast improvements in all phases of an ever-expanding operation that has encompassed 16 sports since the men's and women's programs were

merged in July, 1978.

The merger, under Hagan's direction, has been orderly, with office space remodeled, and in some

cases created, to make room for the women's coaching and administrative staff.

The introduction of Hagan into the UK athletics administrative structure came in 1972, when he was named assistant to Harry C. Lancaster and given the task of implementing the Blue & White Fund for 57,600-seat Commonwealth Stadium and later for Rupp Arena. The fruits of his labors in this area have provided the additional financial support that has elevated the UK athletics program into a first class operation.

Hagan was named Athletics Director in July 1975 following Lancaster's retirement.

Hagan has also been an advocate of a strong scholar-athlete program, feeling "a genuine commitment to provide all the academic support and encouragement we can to help our athletes leave our campus with a college educa-

tion and a degree."

On the personal side, Hagan received one of his highest individual honors in 1978 when he became the first University of Kentucky basketball player to be installed in the Naismith Memorial National Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

He is married to the former Martha Milton of Owensboro. They have four children: Lisa, Laurie, Amy and Kip.

Serving Varied Interests of Student Body

Terry Hall arrived at Kentucky last September after an impressive five-year stint at the University of Louisville. She replaced Debbie Yow-Nance, head coach the previous four years, who resigned in mid-August.

Hall brought to Kentucky experience in various levels of women's sports. She directed all aspects of the Louisville program, including scheduling, recruiting, preparing the budget and supervising the athletes' housing.

The first full-time women's basketball coach at U of L, Hall compiled a 79-53 record during her five years there. Last season she guided the Lady Cardinals to their first Metro Conference championship and a 17-7 record. By winning her first seven games this season at Kentucky, Hall collected her 100th collegiate coaching victory. She also previously coached at Eastern Kentucky University.

In addition to her coaching duties, Hall is chairperson of both the Southern Region II Sports Committee and the KWIC Basketball Committee. Last year she was nominated to the national basketball committee and the Outstanding Young Women of America.

Hall graduated from Indiana State University in 1966 with a degree in Health and Physical Education. She earned a Masters' Degree in P.E. from Eastern Kentucky University.

Also in her first year at Kentucky is Lady Kats' assistant coach, Dorothy Jean "Dottie" Berry, a native of Atlanta, Ga. Berry earned a Bachelor of Science Degree at Georgia Southern College in 1974 and a Master of Education from Georgia State University in 1976.

Berry was head coach of the South Fulton Today girls' basketball team from 1975 to 1978 and was chairman of physical education, girls' basketball coach and volleyball coach at College Park (Ga.) High School.

Berry has extensive experience with summer camps and has served on the staffs of such widely-recognized camps as B/C Invitation Camps,

the Atlanta Superstars Camp and Hubie Brown's Basketball Camp.

DIVISION III

University level sports are divided into three divisions, ranging from varsity men's football and basketball in Division I to non-revenue producing sports in Division III. At Kentucky, efforts are made to accommodate the varied interests of the student body by providing competitive teams in numerous sports activities.

Scholarships are offered in all Division III sports, creating financial help for many students with talents in specialized endeavors.

Since athletic teams other than Division I do not attract a large amount of media attention, their coaches are seldom recognized publicly for the contributions they make to the lives of UK studentathletes. Therefore, the University would like to take the opportunity to identify these dedicated individuals.


