Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, March 3, 1980

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2:00 o'clock (Eastern Standard Time) on Monday, March 3, 1980 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. George W. Griffin, and Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Ex Officio Secretary. Absent from the meeting were Mr. Albert G. Clay and Mr. Homer W. Ramsey. Members of the Board of Trustees attending the meeting included Professor Michael Adelstein, former Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mr. Terry McBrayer, Mr. Mark Metcalf, and Professor Constance Wilson. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Jack C. Blanton, Peter P. Bosomworth, Donald B. Clapp, Raymond R. Hornback, John T. Smith, and Robert G. Zumwinkle; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; and Dr. Charles T. Wethington, representing Vice President M. Stanley Wall. Representatives of the various news media were in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 2:19 o'clock. Following the invocation, pronounced by Mr. Sturgill, the Secretary called the roll. A quorum being present, the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:20 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

Without discussion, on motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the January 29, 1980 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary called attention to his monthly report to the Trustees, copies of which had been distributed earlier, and recommended its acceptance. Without objection, it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Inasmuch as the items in PR 2, Recommendations of the President, were routine appointments and/or staff changes, President Singletary recommended it be approved. On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Griffin, and passed, PR 2 was approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

There were no supplemental recommendations.

F. Budget Revisions for 1979-80 (PR 4)

The proposed changes in the 1979-80 budget being of a routine nature, President Singletary recommended approval of PR 4 as presented. Mr. Griffin moved approval. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black, and passed without dissent. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Capital Construction Projects (PR 5)

President Singletary explained that there were four separate capital construction projects recommended in PR 5, three renovation projects and one contruction project for a new building. He recommended that the Board approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education the Phase III renovation of the Funkhouser Building at an estimated cost of \$800,000; the renovation of the Journalism Building at an estimated cost of \$500,000; a routine roof renovation at the Ashland Community College at an estimated cost of \$125,000; and the construction of a Development Building at an estimated cost of \$350,000. Funding for the Funkhouser, Journalism and Ashland Community College projects will come from funds previously allocated by the Board of Trustees for renovation projects. Funding for the Development Building will be provided from a private gift.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Griffin, and carried, the four capital construction projects as recommended in PR 5 were approved for transmission to the Council on Higher Education. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Amendment of Retirement Regulation (AR II-8.0-4) (PR 6)

President Singletary indicated that the proposed amendment of the retirement regulation is a "technical" amendment which is necessary to assure that University employees who continue to work beyond age 65 do not run the risk that their spouse will not receive survivor benefits under the supplemental retirement plan by virtue of their not having had the opportunity to elect such option until the time of actual retirement.

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, the amendment of the retirement regulation as recommended in PR 6 was approved. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Amendment to Medical Practice Plan (PR 7)

President Singletary noted that the proposed amendment to the medical practice plan adopted by the Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978 corrects an oversight. Salaries and bonuses paid to faculty in the College of Medicine for service in Veterans Administration Programs have never been considered income which must be assigned to KMSF, Inc. However, through oversight, the specific exclusion of same was not incorporated in the practice plan as originally adopted. The recommended amendment corrects this oversight and permits the exclusion of income paid to physicians by Veterans Administration or other non-University entities where the University's President has specifically approved the terms of an affiliation agreement providing for such payments as a part of total compensation.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Griffin, and passed, the recommendation in PR 7 was approved. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 8)

President Singletary recommended that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations pertaining to existing regulations and procedures in approving and/or reporting faculty and staff appointments be received for consideration and placed on the agenda for action at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Griffin, reporting for Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, moved that the financial report for the seven months ending Jnauary 31, 1980 be accepted. His motion, seconded by Mr. Black, passed and the report was accepted. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Authorization to Request Renovation Costs from Maintenance Fund (FCR 2)

Acting on the recommendation of the Finance Committee, Mr. Griffin moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs be authorized to request renovation costs from the "Maintenance Fund" as recommended in FCR 2 for the purpose of paying the costs of renovating the shower room and installing a new kitchen ceiling in the Alpha Gamma Rho Fraternity House. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, with all present voting "aye". (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Policy on Travel Advances (FCR 3)

The Finance Committee so recommending, Mr. Griffin moved that the Board of Trustees (1) authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer to provide, from private funds, travel advances to University employees, and (2) authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer to promulgate reasonable rules, regulations and procedures for the payment and repayment of such advances.

Mr. Blanton, commenting on FCR 3 at the request of Mr. Griffin, explained that state law does not permit the use of state tax funds for travel advances and stressed that private funds would be used for this purpose.

Mr. Griffin's motion was seconded by Mr. Black, and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Meeting Adjourned

After determining that there was no further business to come before the meeting, Mr. Sturgill declared the meeting officially adjourned at 2:32 p.m.

Comments - Budget increases for Henderson Community College, College of Pharmacy, and University Extension's Community Education will be supported by additional student fee income generated by the respective continuing education programs. Summer school registration fees will fund the Office for International Programs' Mexico summer program. The Academic Affairs Enrollment Growth Reserve will be funded from additional student fees generated as a result of enrollment growth. An increase in federal appropriations will fund a budget increase for the College of Education's Teacher Education program and the Agricultural Cooperative Extension Service. Changes in the grant from the Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the UK Medical Center are reflected in the budget adjustments for the College of Dentistry, the College of Medicine, and the Student Health Service. An increase in the grant from the University of Kentucky Research Foundation will support additional activities of the Office of Sponsored Project Administration. A grant received from the Kentucky Arts Commission will support additional University Art Museum expenditures. The College of Education's Center for Professional Development will receive additional funding from gifts and grants and sale of publications to support additional programs. Guignol Theatre ticket sales income will support a budget increase for the College of Fine Arts' Theatre Arts. The budget change for the Margaret I. King Library will be funded by additional copy service income. Income from sale of international student identity cards will support the Office for International Programs' budget increase. The College of Home Economics' Lemon Tree Laboratory budget increase will be funded by additional revenue generated by the program's food sales. A program change from full-day to three half-days will result in a budget reduction for the College of Home Economics' Early Childhood Laboratory. The increase in funding available for renovation will come from the overrealization of estimated investment income during 1979-80.

CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education four capital construction project proposals. The projects are: 1) Phase III - Funkhouser Renovation; 2) Journalism Building Renovation; 3) Ashland Community College Roof Repairs; and 4) Development Building.

Background: 1) Phase III renovation of the Funkhouser Building involves air conditioning, heating, ceilings, handicap needs, safety defects, and lighting. The project cost is estimated at \$800,000.

- 2) The Journalism Building renovation is necessitated by the move of the University Printing Plant and the conversion of the space vacated for other uses and also to provide handicap access and eliminate safety hazards. The project cost is estimated at \$500,000.
- 3) The Ashland Community College project involves routine roof renovation of existing structures. The project cost is estimated at \$125,000.
- 4) The Development Building is to provide office and support space for the University's development function. Project cost is estimated at \$350,000.

Funding for the Funkhouser, Journalism and Ashland Community College projects will come from funds previously allocated by the Board of Trustees for renovation projects. Funding for the Development Building will be provided from a private gift.

AMENDMENT OF RETIREMENT REGULATION (AR II-8.0-4)

Recommendation: that AR II-8.0-4 be amended by deleting the words in brackets and adding the material underlined as follows:

Section III. Retirement Benefits

B. Minimum Annual Retirement Benefit and Supplemental Retirement Income

1. Group I Personnel

For each Group I employee (see I.A.1.) who was age 40 or older prior to July 1, 1964, and who was employed by the University prior to July 1, 1964, and who retires pursuant to the provisions hereof the University will provide an annual supplemental retirement income during the lifetime of the employee, where necessary, to assure a minimum annual retirement benefit. The minimum annual retirement benefit shall be the following percentage of the basic annual salary at the employee's normal retirement date (unless the employee is serving outside the country on a University project and, in which case, the salary to be used in the computation shall be the basic annual salary received at the University during the year immediately preceding such foreign service):

Section IV. Survivorship Option

- A. Employees eligible for supplemental retirement income pursuant to Section I, E. or III, B. may elect a spouse survivor option as to such benefits [at the time of retirement].
- B. The election may be filed at any time prior to the month in which the employee attains age 65, or thereafter at any time prior to retirement.
- C. If the survivor option is elected, supplemental retirement income will be reduced to an amount which is the actuarial equivalent (as determined by TIAA at the time of retirement) of a joint and two-thirds benefit to the surviving spouse payable for life.
- D. Election of this option is revocable prior to the beginning of the month in which the employee attains age 65 unless, at an earlier date, benefits have been paid or accrued pursuant to said election. In all other cases the election is irrevocable.
- E. Election of this option [is irrevocable and] may not be exercised posthumously.

F. Survivor benefits pursuant to the provisions of this section are not payable, even though an election has been filed prior to retirement, unless the employee has (1) attained normal retirement age or (2) been granted disability retirement pursuant to Section II, C. 1.

Background: This amendment is necessary to assure that University employees who elect to continue in employment beyond age 65 do not run the risk that their spouse will not receive survivor benefits under the supplemental retirement plan by virtue of their not having had the opportunity to elect such option until the time of actual retirement.

AMENDMENT TO MEDICAL PRACTICE PLAN

Recommendation: That Section II., B. of the Board of Trustees resolution regarding the medical practice plan, adopted June 20, 1978, be amended to read as follows (underlined materials has been added):

B. Applicability to Income from Professional Services

The plan is applicable to all professionally generated clinical income of members of the plan regardless of where services are performed. Non-clinical income and/or income from the following specific sources are excluded from the plan:

- 1. Payments for occasional service to governmental agencies or non-profit health or education-related organizations after both the dean and the departmental chairperson concur that such service is of academic benefit to the University.
- 2. Prized, defined as gifts in recognition of personal past achievements and not for services rendered.
- 3. Royalties, defined as proceeds for contributions as authors or inventors (the latter subject to University patent policy).
 - 4. University-sponsored continuing education services.
- 5. Honoraria, defined as payments by agencies outside the University for occasional lectures and similar public appearances beyond normal responsibilities and which are not in return for other services, whether given directly or indirectly.
- 6. Special administrative stipends, defined as payments by the University for administrative assignments beyond normal academic responsibilities.
- 7. Fees from a profession unrelated to that which is the qualification for University appointment, provided such fees are generated on non-University time.
- 8. Salaries, fringe benefits and Public Law 95-201 (Pay Comparability Act) bonuses paid by the Veterans Administration or other non-University entities pursuant to affiliation agreements specifically approved by the President of the University.

Income from excluded activities and sources remains subject to University policies and regulations.

Professional fees will be charged in accordance with an appropriate fee schedule for all services rendered with exception for professional courtesy discount or waiver granted by individual practitioners. All income and rights to income derived from professional practice as defined herein by members of the plan will be assigned to the entity administering the plan to be billed, collected, received, held and administered by such entity in accordance with the provisions of the plan. Professional practice income received directly by members shall be reported and remitted to such entity immediately upon receipt.

Payments to the College of Medicine by University Hospital or affiliated institutions for administrative services rendered by faculty are excluded from the plan, but income billed and collected by the Hospital for services rendered to patients by hospital-based physicians who are members of the plan is specifically included.

Background: Salaries and bonuses paid to faculty in the College of Medicine for service in Veterans Administration Programs has never been considered income which must be assigned to KMSF, Inc. However, through oversight, a specific exclusion of same was not incorporated in the practice plan as originally adopted. The recommended amendment corrects this oversight in the original draft and permits the exclusion of income paid to physicians by certain other affiliated entities where the University's President has specifically approved the terms of the affiliation agreement.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received at this time for preliminary consideration and, at the next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees, be included on the agenda for action.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

<u>First Amendment</u> - Change the second paragraph of Part VIII, A, 1 (page 27) of the Governing Regulations to read:

[The vice presidents, the Dean of the Graduate School, the dean of the colleges, the directors of the community colleges, the chairmen of departments (University System), the chairmen of divisions (Community College System) and every administrative officer of the University who is to report directly to the President or whose initial salary is in excess of \$15,000 per annum shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees, acting upon the recommendation of the President. Except in the case of those administrative officers who will report directly to the President, the President shall seek recommendations from an appointee's superior officer prior to recommending an appointment or reappointment by the Board of Trustees. All administrative officials and employees other than those described above may be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the appropriate person or persons superior in rank to the appointee. The President shall report his action to the Board of Trustees. The President may delegate the power to appoint administrative, non-academic and classified personnel whose appointments are not made by the Board of Trustees to other appropriate administrative officials.]

The vice presidents, the chief administrative officers of educational units (deans, directors, and chairpersons) and every administrative and professional employee of the University who is to report directly to the President or whose position is at Level 16 or above in the Administrative and Personnel Classification System shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees, acting upon recommendation of the President. Except in the cases of those individuals who report directly to the President, the President shall seek recommendations from an appointee's superior officer prior to recommending an appointment or reappointment by the Board of Trustees. Non-faculty employees other than those described above may be appointed by the President upon recommendation of the appropriate person or persons superior in rank to the appointee. The President shall report all appointments at Levels 12 through 15 in the Administrative and Personnel Classification System to the Board of Trustees. The President may delegate the power to appoint personnel whose appointments are not made by the Board of Trustees to other appropriate administrative officials.

Background: Existing regulations and procedures pertaining to approving and/or reporting appointments or reappointments of vice presidents, chief administrative officers of educational units, administrative and professional employees, and all other non-faculty employees are related to salary levels which were appropriate in 1964 but are currently impractically low. Also, a new Administrative and Personnel Classification System has been implemented. In approving this amendment, the Board of Trustees would be adopting the new policy stated in this amendment to supplant not only the policy stated in the above bracketed paragraph but also pertinent portions of the following policy statement which was approved by the Board on February 24, 1964:

Approval by the Board of Trustees is required for all appointments to positions with the rank of associate professor or above, for promotions, for the granting of tenure, and for salary changes above \$12,000 for non-academic personnel and \$15,000 for academic personnel. All other appointments and/or changes may be made by the President and reported to the Board.

<u>Second Amendment</u> - Change Part VIII,B (page 29) of the Governing Regulations to read:

[All appointments, reappointments and promotions of the academic staff above the rank of assistant professor, or its equivalent for this purpose, or which carry tenure, shall be made by the Board of Trustees, acting upon recommendation of the President. Appointments, reappointments or promotions below the rank of associate professor and salary adjustments below \$15,000 may be finally approved by the President. He shall report his action to the Board of Trustees. The President may delegate the power to make appointments, reappointments and promotions that do not require approval by the Board. The President, following consultation with the Senate Council or the Community College Council as appropriate, shall establish such review systems as are appropriate to assist him in making informed judgments concerning academic appointments, promotions and granting of tenure.]

All appointments and promotions of faculty to positions which involve an actual or equivalent academic rank of associate professor or professor, tenure, or an initial salary above \$30,000 shall be made by the Board of Trustees, acting upon recommendation of the President. Appointments and promotions of faculty to positions which involve an actual or equivalent academic rank below associate professor and an initial salary not exceeding \$30,000 may be finally approved by the President who shall report such actions (except those relating to graduate teaching and research assistants) to the Board of Trustees. The President may delegate the power to make appointments and promotions that do not require approval by the Board. The President, following consultation with the Senate Council or the Community College Council, as pertinent, shall establish such review systems as are appropriate to assist the President, or other appropriate administrative officials designated by the President, in making informed judgments concerning academic appointments, promotions and granting of tenure.

<u>Background</u>: Existing regulations and procedures pertaining to approving and/or reporting faculty appointments and promotions are related to salary levels which were appropriate in 1964 but are currently impractically low. In approving this amendment, the Board of Trustees would be adopting the modified policy stated in this amendment to supplant not only the policy stated in the above bracketed paragraph but also pertinent portions of the policy statement approved by the Board of Trustees on February 24, 1964, which is provided in the background material for the first amendment.

POLICY ON TRAVEL ADVANCES
