






return of two teams-Utah and West Virginiawhich helped establish the Invitational as one of the country's top classics.

A highly ranked Utah team appeared in the second and third UKIT, losing three games by only 11 points. Kentucky defeated the Utes, 70-65, in '54 and split two NIT games in '44 and '47 to lead the series 2-1.

Probably more excitement than any UK opponent

Recalling the glory years of the UKIT is the ever has created occurred when Jerry West led West Virginia into the UKIT for a three year stretch, with the Mountaineers winning the title in 1957 and '59, and losing to the Cats in '58. The Mountaineers lost to Kentucky in the '62 and '64 tournament also, and trail in the series 10-4.

> Bowling Green is a newcomer to the tournament and has played Kentucky only once—a 63-61 loss in 1949 in Cleveland.



"Cawood Reflects"

(PUBLISHER'S NOTE: The popular "Voice of the Wildcats", CAWOOD LEDFORD, is in his 24th season as play-by-play announcer for the University of Kentucky. Cawood, sports director for WHAS radio and television since 1958, has been broadcasting since 1951. He is recognized as a sports authority throughout the nation.

CAWOOD LEDFORD



Kentucky has hosted its annual Christmas tournament—the University of Kentucky Invitational Tournament for 23 years. In 1953 the first tournament saw the Wildcats beat Duke 85-69 in the first round and LaSalle 73-60 in the championship game to start a tradition of winning its own tourney. The Wildcats have won 40 games while losing 6 in UKIT action.

The team I remember best is one whose successor is on the floor of Rupp Arena tonight—West Virginia. The Mountaineers brought Jerry West and company to town and in '57 and '59 took the trophy back to Morgantown. Jerry West was named High Point Performer (for two games) in 1958 with 48 points and again in '59 with 70 points.

West was one of the greatest ballplayers I ever saw. I'd have to rank him probably in the top five and I think in the UKIT, he has been the best player who ever came in here. West Virginia has probably given the best performance of any visitor in the UKIT.





Dr. David P. Gardner President University of Utah

DR. DAVID PIERPONT GARDNER—nationally recognized as one of America's outstanding educational leaders—became the 10th President of the University of Utah, August 1, 1973.


Born March 24, 1933, in Berkeley, California, Dr. Gardner attended public schools in his hometown and was graduated from Brigham Young University with a bachelors degree in 1955. He returned to California to earn his M.A. degree in political science and Ph.D. degree in higher education from UC Berkeley in 1959 and 1966, respectively.

In becoming the University of Utah's 10th President, Dr. Gardner pledged himself to "excellence, distinction and rigor in the academic program," a vow which is reflected in the diversity of the speeches and papers he has authored in recent years. Dr. Gardner is concerned with "Politics and the Urban University," "Emerging Forms of Post-Secondary Education," "Alternative Forms of Higher Education," "The Management of Conflict," "The University and Public Service," "Faculty Members and Campus Governance," "Telecommunications in a Changing Educational World," and "Campus Unrest: Tactics and Strategy of the Radical Student."

In 1970, testifying before President Nixon's Commission on Campus Unrest, Dr. Gardner recommended that undergraduate education be placed nearer the top of national educational priorities and that funds be sought to reform and enrich the

undergraduate learning experience.

Jerry Pimm University of Utah Head Basketball Coach

It's hard to follow in the footsteps of great coaches and a great basketball tradition but Utah Head Basketball Coach JERRY PIMM has had to do exactly that. And in his two years at the Ute helm he has proved he belongs in the same group with the outstanding coaches in Utah hoop history.

Pimm has compiled an enviable 36-17 record in his two years at Utah. Last year he led his team to a 19-8 season mark and second place in the tough Western Athletic Conference. For his efforts he was named District Seven Coach of the Year by his fellow coaches.

The popular Pimm has pleased Ute basketball fans with his exciting run and shoot style of play and it is obvious that his apprenticeship under former Ute coaches Jack Gardner and Bill Foster has paid off in some solid coaching credentials.

A native of Sioux City, Iowa, Pimm is rated as one of the top hoop teachers in the college ranks. During the summer of 1975 he twice went to South America to give clinics and lectures on American basketball techniques. Last summer he served as one of the coaches at the U.S. Olympic team tryouts and helped pick the team that captured the gold medal in the summer games in Montreal. He was also placed on the NABC committee involved with the Converse-ABC coaches clinics for this coming year.





Utah Players to Watch

JEFF JONAS-4

Probably the best "little" man ever to play for Utah, JEFF JONAS will be one of the top point-guards in the country this season. He already holds the school record for assists in one season (223) and a career (469) and will add to those totals this season. Add to his excellent passing and floor play the ability to score (11.1 ppg last season) and the habit of making things happen on the court and you have an indispensible part of the Ute team. Coach Pimm has called "JJ" his "coach on the court" a term which best sums up the hustling Ute floor-general. Because of his leadership ability Jonas was named captain this year. Jonas is an excellent free throw shooter hitting over 84% of his charity tosses last season. During WAC games he missed just eight shots from the line. Jeff was named to both the All-WAC Second Team and the District Seven First Team last season, but is a strong candidate for first team honors as well as All-American kudos this season.



JEFF JUDKINS-5

In only his second season of major college ball (his first as a starter) JEFF JUDKINS did what very few other players have done, that is lead a major basketball conference in scoring. "Jud" was the WAC's leading all-game scorer last season with a blistering 19.4 point per game average. He did it by shooting over 55% from the field, just seven-tenth's of a percentage point below the school record held by Jerry Chambers. His 524 points made him the second most prolific sophomore scorer in Ute history. Only Mike Newlin has scored more. Judkins' emergence as a scorer began on the Utes' trip to South America two summers ago where he was the leading scorer. Since then he has been unstoppable and there is no reason to think that his scoring barrage will not continue into this season. Scoring is not Judkins' only asset. He is an excellent rebounder for his height and was the third board man on the team last year with a 6.4 rpg average. A definite All-American candidate, Judkins was named an All-WAC First Team selection as well as to the All-District Seven first team. He was also named honorable mention All-American on several teams.



DR. JAMES G. HARLOW, President was named the 16th president of West Virginia University on May 14, 1967. He assumed the duties of the office on Sept. 1, 1967.

Born in Oklahoma City, Okla., on June 11, 1912, Dr. Harlow received a bachelor's degree in mathematics and a master's degree in physics from the University of Oklahoma.

Dr. Harlow received his doctorate in education from the University of Chicago in 1954. He served as assistant professor of physics, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and as professor of education and dean of the College of Education (the position he held when he accepted the WVU presidency) at the University of Oklahoma. He also was an associate professor of education at the University of Chicago from 1953 to 1958.

Long concerned with problems of community and industrial development, Dr. Harlow has worked with Chambers of Commerce in Norman, Okla., Oklahoma City, Okla., and Morgantown, W. Va. In Oklahoma City, he was for ten years executive vice-president of a Chamber-based educational development activity called the Frontiers of Science Foundation, an activity which received national attention and a formal commendation from the President of the United States.

Joedy Gardner West Virginia University Mountaineers Head Basketball Coach

A capable artist, a former jet pilot, West Virginia University coach JOEDY GARDNER has now turned his energies to creating a basketball masterpiece that will send WVU's hard-court fortunes soaring.


A planner, anxious to succeed, and willing to work hard for that success, Gardner has directed Mountaineer teams over the past two years which finished with 14-13 and 15-14 records. Both years West Virginia competed in the ECAC Southern Division tournament.

This season Gardner plays a major role in WVU's entry into the newly formed Eastern Collegiate Basketball League, which he feels will benefit the West Virginia program and specifically, college basketball in general.

Joedy Gardner knows that WVU can realize basketball success. He started on the West Virginia varsity for three years. His teammates included all-time greats Hot Rod Hundley and Jerry West.

After graduating from Ellwood City High School in Pa., he averaged 7.9 points a game for WVU with his 669 career points.

Along with Don Vincent and Lloyd Sharrar, he captained the 1958 WVU team that finished 26-2 and was ranked number one in the country by the Associated Press and United Press International. That year, Joedy played in all 28 games scoring 335 points at a 12.0 points per game clip.

TONY ROBERTSON-14


His manner, his style, his shooting ability, his smoothness, and his passing; they all add up to one thing—a class basketball player. That's TONY ROBERTSON, WVU's top returning scorer. That's Tony Robertson who averaged 17.9 points, 4.4 rebounds, and totalled 100 assists last year. That's Tony R. who may just be one of the finest players in the country this year.

Tony Robertson came to West Virginia University after spending two seasons at Eastern Arizona Junior College

where he was a standout performer.

At Eastern Arizona, Tony scored 21 points per game as a freshman and added eight rebounds and five assists a game. His sophomore year was equally fruitful as he averaged 23 points a game and raised his rebound average to 10 a game while still managing to hand out six assists a contest.


His second year, participating in the Dodge City Tournament under coach Chuck LaVetter, Eastern placed second and Tony set records on the way. His 93 points and 42 field goals were the most ever scored in the western classic, and placed him on the all-tourney team. He also made the honorable mention list for All-America that year.



BOB HUGGINS-35

He is a fierce competitor, a successful competitor, on the court and in the classroom. A returning two-year starter for the Mountaineers, **HUGGINS** is also a standout student with nearly a perfect 4.0 grade point average.

A smart floor leader, Huggins averaged 6.9 points last year,

and passed out 53 assists.

His style includes tough face-to-face defense, smooth outside shooting, and the ability to power inside on drives to the basket

Bob improved his field goal efficiency to 47 percent and his free throw accuracy to 80 percent last year and one of WVU's co-captains for this season. Coach Joedy Gardner sees him as an intelligent, capable leader who will play a major role for the Mountaineers in 1977.

Huggins started nearly every game in 1975 too. He scored 8.8 points per game and had his best game with a 20-point

effort against Rutgers.

Bob was a transfer student from Ohio University three years ago where he lettered as a freshman.







Dr. Hollis A. Moore President Bowling Green State University

As the seventh president of Bowling Green State University, DR. HOLLIS A. MOORE is entering his seventh year of the "Decade of Distinction" he talked about when he came

to Bowling Green in 1970.

The past six years have been sprinkled with "firsts." The College of Health and Community Services, the first new undergraduate college to be established in the University in 38 years, was authorized in 1973 to prepare students for a wide variety of health careers. The College of Musical Arts became Bowling Green's fifth undergraduate college in January, 1975. The School of Speech Communication, offering programs in Speech Disorders, Theatre, Interpersonal and Public Communication, and Radio-TV-Film, as well as interdisciplinary programs, was established in 1975. The School of Nursing, which is fully accredited by the National League for Nursing, was established within the College of Health and Community Services in 1975.

The University Division of General Studies was created in 1974 to provide more opportunities and options for freshmen and to enhance the quality of counseling. The number of University-funded scholarships awarded solely on the basis

of academic merit has quadrupled since 1973.

JOHN WEINERT'S enthusiasm for people and his love for the game of basketball will be evident to anyone who meets him this year as he accepts the challenge of coaching a major-college team after 10 years of success in the collegedivision ranks.

Weinert came to Bowling Green after coaching four years at St. Joseph's College of Indiana where he was credited with

producing a coaching "miracle."

It was there that he inherited a basketball program that had only won 30 per cent of its games over a 25-year span in the Indiana Collegiate Conference (ICC). In four years under Weinert, the Pumas went 34-14 in the league and won

the championship in 1975.

Weinert's four-year record at St. Joe's was 72-39 and included seasons of 20-10 in 1974 and 21-7 in 1975. His 1974 team won the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional championship and his 1975 team posted the best record in St. Joe history while winning the ICC and finishing second in the NCAA Midwest tournament.

He started his collegiate head coaching career at Ripon College of Wisconsin in 1967. In six seasons, he guided Ripon to a 76-55 record that included back-to-back 17-5 records and a pair of Midwest Conference championships in 1971

and 1972.





Dr. Otis A. Singletary University of Kentucky President



Cliff Hagan Director of Athletics

"I've been preparing for this all my life," CLIFF HAGAN said before taking over as athletics director at the University of Kentucky in 1975. Hagan succeeded Harry Lancaster as director after serving as assistant director for three years.

Hagan's path to the athletics directorship began in Owensboro, Kentucky, where he established a then state high school tournament record of 41 points in leading Owensboro to victory over Lafayette in the championship game of the 1949 state high school tournament.

At UK, he played on teams that won 86 of 91 games and an NCAA championship (1951). The 1954 team, undefeated in 25 games, elected not to participate in the national tournament.

Frank Ham Assistant Director of Athletics

FRANK HAM became Assistant Director of Athletics in July 1975 soon after Cliff Hagan succeeded Harry C. Lancaster as Director of Athletics.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Ham came to the University in 1969 as Administrative Assistant to football coach John Ray, and was reassigned to the Athletic Director's staff in 1972 when Ray resigned.

Now in his eighth year as president of the University of Kentucky, DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY is a Mississippian whose route to the Bluegrass State curled through Louisiana, Texas, North Carolina and Washington, D. C.

He came to Lexington from a position as University of Texas vice-chancellor for academic affairs. Previously, in Washington, he had been director of the U. S. Job Corps in the early stages of its development before moving to the American Council on Education as vice-president. He had gone to the capital in 1964 after three years as chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The UNC appointment terminated Dr. Singletary's first association with the University of Texas, this a seven-year stay that saw him, as a young historian, rise rapidly in rank from instructor to full professor and begin the shift to administrative work, first as associate dean and later as assistant to the president.

The Kentucky president, and his wife—the former Gloria Walton, met when both were students at Millsaps College. He later earned master's and doctoral degrees at Louisiana State. The Singletarys have two daughters, Bonnie and Kendall, and a son, Scott.



Larry Ivy Assistant Director of Athletics For Finance

Adding a new dimension to UK athletics was the September appointment of LARRY IVY as Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance.

Ivy, who came to the University as Director of Housing in 1969, will be involved primarily with the administration and management of financial aspects, and will help develop and initiate policies for accounting procedures and related business management activities of the department.



Ioe B. Hall

University of Kentucky Wildcats Head Basketball Coach

IOE B. HALL'S record as Wildcat head coach for the past four years stands at 79-36. During the 1976 season his team won the National Invitational Tournament and ended the year with a 20-10 record.

Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman Coach to Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director Feb. 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His ten-year coaching record is 155-92. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five-year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 79-36 four-year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and is a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball

Spectators must keep off the court at all times. Spectators must use the arena stairs and vomities. There are no public facilities located on the arena floor level. Public facilities in Rupp Arena are located on the entry concourse level. You will find all refreshment stands, drinking fountains, public telephones, restrooms, vending machines and first aid on the concourse level.

LIQUORS

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all food and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above. Arena personnel are instructed to enforce this rule in the interest of safety. PUBLIC ADDRESS

Messages for the public address announcer are acceptable only in emergencies and must be approved by the Sports Information Director at University of Kentucky basketball events.

SIGNS

Signs and barriers are restricted in Rupp Arena in accordance with policies established by arena management and public safety officials.

GENERAL TICKET POLICY

- All persons must have a ticket

- No pass out checks permitted at any exit

- All sales final

- Tickets cannot be refunded or replaced if lost, stolen or destroyed.

- The University of Kentucky Athletic Association reserves the right to revoke tickets by refund of purchase price.

- Holder of tickets to University of Kentucky athletic events agrees to abide by Arena and University

Policies.

- For Arena events other than University of Kentucky basketball all tickets are sold by the Lexington Center Corporation and its authorized outlets. Box Office hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday and commencing 90 minutes prior to the event on event days. No telephone reservations. Checks will not be accepted within seven days of an event.

"The Last Time"

The last time the Wildcats faced the Bowling Green Falcons was January 11, 1949. Kentucky outlasted Bowling Green 63-61 before an all-time record crowd of 13,113 in the Cleveland, Ohio Arena.

The Wildcats were sparked by All-American guard, Ralph Beard, who led the scoring with 20 points. He was followed by Wallace (Wah Wah) Jones who collected 14 points. Kentucky lost the services of both Alex Groza and Cliff Barker who fouled out.

The largest crowd ever to see a basketball game in the state of West Virginia until that time, 13,323 fans, watched Kentucky beat West Virginia 106-100 on December 7, 1970 in Maggantage.

Tom Parker paced the Wildcats with 24 points followed by Kent Hollenbeck with 23 and Tom Payne and Mike Casey each with 19 points. The Cats shot 52.0 per cent. — West Virginia — 40.6. The Mountaineers led by Dick Symons made 26 personal fouls allowing the Cats to rake 28 points from the free throw line.

After a rally in the final three minutes, Kentucky edged Utah 70-65 December 21, 1954 in first round UKIT action. UK, ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll extended its winning streak to 29 games, while Utah, ranked No. 2 in the AP poll saw a nine game winning streak snapped. The game was Coach Adolph Rupp's 500th win.

Phil (Cookie) Grawemeyer was high point man for the Wildcats with 27 points. He was followed by Bob Burrow with 15, Billy Evans with 9 and Jerry Bird with 8 points.




