## National companies showcase mapping technology

In observance of Geography Week, UK is hosting an event tomorrow show-casing new technology that may help accomplish the school's Top 20 Business Plan.

GIS Day is a worldwide event that showcases geographic information systems, which are used to store, create, analyze and manage spatial data. GIS takes information about geography and communicates it visually.

"What we're doing here, it's huge," said Michelle Ellington, a GIS analyst in UK's Physical Plant Division. "Most people are probably using it and don't even know it."

GIS is used for mapping technology such as finding directions on the Internet or using automotive navigation systems. Fourteen UK groups will attend the event to give demonstrations on their uses of GIS in an effort to raise awareness of UK's GIS community. Representatives from Microsoft Virtual Earth, Autodesk, government entities and engi-

neering firms will also be on eampus.

"For students, it is important to see a leading technology that can open doors for career paths," Ellington said. "For faculty, it can show the possibilities GIS can offer."





# Author's smear of UK professor is misinformed, unfair

After a national pundit smeared an insulted a UK professor for no good reason in a recent book, a bit of truth and reason is in order. In "The Professors: The 101 Most Dangerous Academics in America," David Horowitz accused UK professor of Islamic Studies Ishan Bagby of having connections to a co-conspirator in the 1993 World Trade Center and of being a "dangerous" mofessor.

Student evaluations may have been a good place for Horowitz to check Bagby's reputation as a professor. The semester before Horowitz's book was published, 70 percent of Bagby's students strongly agreed that the material was presented effectively, and 89.5 percent strongly agreed that he had a good knowledge of the

subject and encouraged class participation, according to course evaluation data available on-line (www.uky.edu/IR).

Such overwhelmingly positive figures are hardly indicative of someone who imposes his views on students or is in any way "dangerous"

views on students or is in any way "dangerous in the classroom." It can't even imagine him being considered that dangerous," biology junior Yahya Ahmed said in a Nov. 10 Kernel story, "He doesn't really impress his views on anyone or try to manipulate anyone's mode of thinking."

And Horowitz's statement that Bagby is dangerous outside the classroom — specifically by being connected to co-conspirators in the 1993 WTC bombing — also falls flat.

Bagby's alliance with Siraj Wahhaj, the leader of the Muslim Alliance of North America, who was accused with little evidence as being a co-conspirator in the bombing, was where Horowitz targeted his accusation.

But Wahhaj's accuser, a prosecutor in Omar Abdel Rahman's trial, didn't take the time to figure out which people out of a list of 200 names were actually co-conspirators, so he lumped them all together as being "alleged co-conspirators," according to the Kernel story. There seems to be a trend. Wahhaj, the leader of a Muslim alliance, knows a Muslim who was guilty of conspiracy against the U.S. government, and therefore is accused of being a co-conspirator. Bagby is a Muslim professor, knows other Muslims, and therefore is accused of being one of the "most dangerous profes-

sors" in the nation.

By this logic, any Muslim who associates with other Muslims must be "dangerous."

This book was written by a bestselling author and was distributed to bookstores across the nation. What does this say about our country? What kind of stereotypes is Horowitz promoting?

try? What kind of stereotypes is Horowitz pro-moting?

"Basically he views any professor that is pro-Palestinian, pro-Islam, pro-women as bein, dangerous." Bagby said of Horowitz.

Instead of warning the nation of "danger-ous" professors with different cultures and opinions, we, as a nation founded on freedom and individuality, should be encouraging these professors to share their views. Isn't that, after all, what cademia is about: sharing and dis-cussing ideas.





"I think it's a very solid class, and we are very excited about it," DeMoss said. "The first thing we were looking for out of this class was frontline players. We needed depth in the front line, with Jennifer Humphrey graduating and Sarah Elilon lening a senior needs when they are senior needs when they are proposed to the senior se

next season."

Dunlap, a 6-foot-1 power forward, attends Brentwood Academy in Nashville, Tenn., and is the most touted of the

bunch. She is the No. 14 re-cruit in the country, accord-ing to the All-Star Girls Re-port recruiting service.

As a junior, Dunlap aver-aged 14 points and eight re-bounds, and she helped lead Brentwood to its first state championship. Victoria is a tremendous

"Victoria is a tremendous athlete with a great work ethic." DeMoss said. "I think she's multitalented. She can shoot, take it off the dribble or post up. She will be able to really step in and help us."

Bett, a 6-5 center from Gadsden City High School in Gadsden, Ala., chose UK over Florida, Auburn, Alabama and Mississippi State. She averaged 16 points and 11 re-bounds last season.
"Catina is a true center

"Catina is a true center who can alter shots defen-sively and do things for us at that five spot," DeMoss said.
"She has good presence on both ends of the floor. She's very mobile and agile for her size. That presence in the paint will be a key asset for us."

Smith, the 38th-ranked player in the country, is a point guard from Winter Haven High School in Flori-da.

"Amber is the epitome of a point guard," DeMoss said. "She is a great leader and is quick off the dribble and can

shoot the three."
Smith's team won the Class 5A state tournament in 2004, and she helped lead Winter Haven back to the state finals again as a junior. She averaged 11 points and nine assists last season.
Morrow averaged 12 points, 3A assists and 3.2 steals a game last season and DeMoss sees her filling another of the team's needs. "I look for Carly to fill that 3-point shooting void after Nastassia Alcius and Demoy Pfeiffer graduate." DeMoss said, Alcius and Demoy Pfeiffer graduate."
