I am sorry  
that circumstances are  
such that I have not been  
able to send you a report of  
my work, but the building  
of Hopewell Ch. and pastoral  
work have kept me so  
busy that I have neglected  
I have nothing special to  
report, but will say that  
I have been keeping up  
preaching at Hopewell  
twice per month, preaching  
in the afternoon then every  
2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sabs in each month.  
This makes three sermons  
on each of these days.

There have been no additions since my last report. Sabbath School is well attended every Sabbath afternoon.

The Ch. is completed except seats, lamps & stove. We have neither of these yet. It is a neat frame building 40x30 ft.

We have nothing encouraging at Jeff<sup>ton</sup> except good attendance both sabbath school and preaching.

They are very much behind with my salary and I doubt whether they will ever get up.

We take up collections for all the causes and they seem to do better in that line than they do for the

Pastor.

We keep up regular preaching twice per month, morning and night, at Beulah, but we have had only two additions there since my last report; and as they have gone to a distant state, (Ohio) we have dismissed them (a very valuable family to us there)

Here also a good Sab. school is maintained and good attendance at preaching both morning and night.

I spend one day each week in pastoral visitation.

The Beulah Ch. is up with my salary, but they have had to draw a head on the subscription, so the officiers tell me.



Rev. E.W. Bedinger D.D.  
Dear Bro-

We are striving to build a house of worship at Hopewell, but as you know the people out there are too poor to build without considerable help. The church at Jeffersontown will raise at least one hundred dollars & I think more, exclusive of the Hopewell neighborhood. That neighborhood is doing all it can, very few are able to give any money, but are able and willing to do work which they have determined to do. They can get out & haul lumber &c. which they will begin to do next Monday.

If we can get this amt from these funds, we will do the very best we can to beg the balance from Churches & individuals. I will say as to the church & erection fund that I do not think it would be wise to let us have it on the lone plan, as this people will not be able to pay it back. Hence I hope that you will assist us in securing the above amount as a donation. I have been at work for them now over 12 months & have never rec'd a cent - as a compensation, but on the other hand, have taken a part of my salary

But we will need more money than we can raise among these people.

The building is to be frame, 30x40 ft. Judge Hale of Louisville donates a lot about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  acres, near the Palomville Pike on which to build. We have something like half timber enough, or perhaps nearly enough donated to make the lumber, work to get it to the ground, rock for the foundation &c all secured. But it will take some where near \$600.00 to pay Carpenter & furnish other materials.

We have a little over one hundred dollars in money promised. Now Dr. as we

are in a strait-between two, life and death, and as this people are struggling hard to build them a house of worship, a blessing they have never enjoyed, and a privilege which they earnestly desire, that <sup>the</sup> old may have a shelter, and that their children, like ours may have a house where to learn to love and serve the blessed Master, will you not use your influence to secure for us one (\$100<sup>00</sup>) hundred dollars from the Sustentation Fund and also one hundred (\$100<sup>00</sup>) from the Church Erection Fund, making \$200<sup>00</sup> to help build this little church in this needy place?

to help them. After we  
get the ch - build, we will  
be on better footing and  
I think thy Ch. & will begin  
to do something. I have  
refused to lay any burden  
on them, because I did not  
want to hinder the work  
there. If we can raise more  
than will take to finish  
up our building we will  
return it to the Name M. Co.  
for some other poor com-  
munity. Whatever can be  
done, please do it as  
soon as possible as we  
want to build right away.  
With earnest prayer for  
the blessing of the Lord upon
