



PREFACE

The first list of the issues of the Alabama press which is presented herewith is wholly the product of WPA relief labor. Workers on the staffs of the Historical Records Survey projects or special statewide imprints projects throughout the country have reported the titles in the first instance, and have provided, in the second instance, more complete descriptions in answer to requests from the national editorial office, which operates as a section of the Illinois Historical Records Survey Project. The copy has been compiled and edited in the latter office.

On this list, as might be expected, the major burden of field work fell to the Alabama Historical Records Survey Project, under the supervision of James \mathbb{E} . Rice who, from the start, took a special interest in turning up and recording in satisfactory form the materials for this compilation.

This list of Alabama imprints, has profited in much greater degree than has the check list for any other state, from the excellent work done by the imprints project in Michigan. In the Detroit office of this project the entire printed catalogue of the British Museum was read and checked for American imprints within the date limits established for the American Imprints Inventory. Titles of all such imprints were typed, and have been filed in the national editorial office of the Inventory. As will appear later, titles from this source figure largely in the present list.

The press made its first appearance within the limits of the present State of Alabama in 1807, while most of that area was still a part of Mississippi Territory and while the whole Gulf Coast, from the Mississippi River eastward, was still a part of the Spanish province of Florida. The earliest evidence of the work of a printer in the Alabama region was the crudely printed and unsightly little document which holds the first place in the present list of Alabama imprints. The name of the printer remains as yet unknown. The defective quality of his workmanship, for which he apologizes, is perhaps justification enough for his choice of anonymity.

The first newspaper press appeared in 1811, when John B. Hood, from Knoxville, Tennessee, joined Samuel Miller in establishing the Mobile Sentinel on May 23rd. This paper was begun at Fort Stoddert, several miles up the Mobile River. It took its name from the river, perhaps, rather than from the town of Mobile, which was not open to printers at that time.

Another early center of printing in Alabama was at Huntsville, in the extreme north, near the border of Tennessee. Here Thomas G. Bradford, earlier active in Ohio and in Tennessee, began the <u>Madison Gazette</u> about June 1812.

The following check list of Alabama imprints, which includes the period from the beginning of printing within the present boundaries of the state to 1840, presents 345 titles. Of these, 331 are described from extant copies in 97 different libraries and private collections in this country and England. Fourteen titles are now known only through reprints or references in other bibliographies and sales catalogs. It is hoped that the publication of this list will bring to light many new locations of titles already known, and especially, descriptions and locations of hitherto unknown material.

Of the 331 titles with known locations, 145 or 45% are known only from single copies. Private collectors hold 19 of these, of which 16 are in the State of Alabama. Libraries and semi-public collections in the United States contain 115 unique copies, while the British Museum has 11. In addition to the 16 "singletons" held privately in Alabama, public libraries hold 36, and there are also in Alabama 42 other titles, known in more than one copy, which cannot be found elsewhere in this country. Alabama libraries and collections altogether hold 183, or 55% of the various titles in this list.

It will doubtlessly be surprising to those interested in Alabama imprints to find that, as far as our present record goes, the largest single collection of these titles is not in Alabama, or even in the United States, but in the Department of Printed Books of the British Museum in London, in which 104 of our titles are located. The largest representation in this country is in the Library of Congress. where 83 titles were found, the largest collection in Alabama being that of the State Supreme Court Library which is credited with 77 titles. Other repositories, containing 25 or more titles, are: the University of Alabama, 59; the Birmingham Public Library, 55; Harvard College Libraries (including the library of Harvard Law School), 54; the Association of the Bar of New York City, 41; the Samuel Colgate Baptist Historical Collection, at Colgate University, 31; the New York Public Library, 30; the Alabama Masonic Grand Lodge Library, 30; the Alabama State Department of Archives and History, 28; the Massachusetts Masonic Grand Lodge Library, 28; the Henry E. Huntington Library, 25; and the New Jersey State Library, 25.

Since we do not claim to have record of every Alabama imprint in each library, and since the holdings of other libraries are yet to be inventoried, these figures are not to be regarded as final. Further field work and correspondence may alter them materially. However, in spite of their provisional character, I believe bibliographers will find the figures exceedingly interesting.

The surprising number of Alabama imprints found in the British Museum is, we presume, accounted for by the active interest of British investors in certain banking operations in Alabama, and in visits to the state by representatives who sent back home many printed documents which have since been preserved in the distinguished national library of Great Britain.

The largest proportion of the imprints preserved to us and herein recorded may be classed as official documents, such as session laws, journals, court reports, and the like, of which there are 150. Sermons and the proceedings of religious groups make up the next largest group, with 67 titles. The Freemasons, always among the earliest frontier organizations to record their history in print, are responsible for another 34 titles, while 33 titles relate to the University of Alabama. The remainder fall into such general categories as: almanacs and directories, 13; political pamphlets, 14; poetry, 5; commercial announcements, 4; medical essays, 3; news bulletins, 3; school texts, 2; and works of fiction, 2.

We have referred to this as a first list of Alabama imprints. Strictly speaking it is. It should be recalled, however, that an excellent bibliography of publications relating to Alabama, which of course included many items printed in Alabama, was compiled by the distinguished Southern historian and archivist, the late Dr. Thomas McAdory Owen. His "Bibliography of Alabama" was published in the 1897 Annual Report of the American Historical Association, pages 777-1248. Of the 345 imprints in the present list, 128 were included in the Owen bibliography.

Other well known bibliographies referred to throughout the present list as Sabin, Evans, or Brinley will be readily understood as referring to the Dictionary of Books Relating to America by Joseph Sabin and others, the American Bibliography by Charles Evans, and the sales catalog of the library of George Brinley.

This list was mimeographed and bound by the Alabama Historical Records Survey Project.

Editing of the bibliography was done almost entirely by John Anderson of the imprints section of the Illinois Historical Records Survey Project, which operates under the supervision of Dr. Royal S. Van de Woestyne.

As usual, our obligations for assistance in assembling the materials for this list are numerous and extensive. The Keeper of Printed Books of the British Museum has been exceedingly kind in answering inquiries, which we made as infrequently as possible.

Our appreciation is gratefully acknowledged to Mrs. Marie Bankhead Owen; Director, Department of Archives and History of the State of Alabama, and sponsor of the Alabama Historical Records Survey Project, for her interest in and cooperation with the work of the Survey, and to Miss Mary Mullen, Librarian of this Department; to Mr. William G. Harkins, Assistant Librarian, University of Alabama; and to Mr. Travis Williams of Alabama Supreme Court Library.

Members of the Alabama staff who made important contributions in connection with checking the titles of the list include Miss Velma King, Miss Katherine Carkhuff, and Mrs. Dorothy Spangler.

We are under obligation to the authorities of all the libraries in which many Alabama imprints are located for cooperation in our record of them. The assistance given us by Prof. Eldon R. James, librarian of the Harvard Law School Library, Mr. F. O. Poole, librarian of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, Mr. Edward Starr, curator of the Samuel Colgate Baptist Historical Collection, Mr. Gerald D. McDonald of the New York Public Library, and Mr. Willard O. Waters of the Henry E. Huntington Library, is most cordially appreciated, as is also the cooperation of Mr. George A. Schwegmann, Jr., director, in checking all titles against the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress.

It is hoped with some degree of confidence that this list will be found helpful by Southern historians and by other scholars interested from any point of view in Alabama. It is of course realized such a list is imperfect in many particulars but time and use, and contributions by many correspondents, are essential to its amplification and improvement. We have found that the very issue of a list like this one calls attention to the interest and value of the local imprints of a state, and brings out of hiding, as it were, much material which would not otherwise be put on record.

Notes of additional titles and locations of Alabama imprints are therefore most earnestly solicited, in order that they may be included in a possible revision of or supplement to this list, which may be brought out at some later date. 
