

SYNOPSIS OF THE TESTIMONY OF WHARTON GOLDEN

on the 3rd. Trial of Caleb Powers.

- ✓ Vol. 3- 656 Was in only one conspiracy which was at the Anderson Hotel on the night of Jan. 23rd., 1900.
- ✓ " 3- 657 It was not agreed there Goebel would be killed. I supposed he would just be mobbed.
- ✓ " 3- 661 Did not at no time or place enter into any agreement or arrangement with Culton, Youtsey, Jim Howard, Harland Whittaker, Combes, Hockersmith, Berry Howard, or John L. Powers to assassinate or kill Goebel.
- " 3- 671-2 In the Examining Trial and on the trial in 1900 did not tell about any second key or seeing John Powers give Youtsey another key.
- ✓ " 3-675-6-7 No one in Cromwell's room when I went to Capitol Hotel.
- ✓ " 3-679 Details what Campbell promised him before making the statement at Capitol Hotel.
- ✓ " 3-680 What Cromwell promised him.
- ✓ " 3-682 Went to see Jim Horine to find out if he had told what I had said to him.
- ✓ " 3-683 Details what he said in October 1901 that he told Campbell at the Gibson House.
- " 3-685-6 What he testified in October, 1901, about "sarcastic way, &c.," and did not make this statement in examining trial.
- ✓ " 3-692 Went under the name of McDonald while at Mulloys.
- ✓ " 3-694 Frequently at Col. Campbell's office As many as 20 times
- ✓ " 3-698 Worked for Arthur Goebel in his ware house in 1900.
- ✓ " 3-699 Walter Day present when Powers talked to him about witnesses.
- ✓ " 3-700-1-2 What he said on this subject in October, 1901. "Talk with Powers and Walter Day."
- ✓ " 3-709 Did now know that Goebel was to be shot on that day.
- \* " 3-710 Now a single man that came to Frankfort on Jan. 25, has been indicted for shooting Goebel.
- " 3-717 Said on examining trial that Powers said on Jan. 30, "I may want you to go to the mountains."
