## Campus e-mail lockout continues

UK can help some set up temporary accounts to get "critical" mail

After three days of Internet headaches, UK continues to work to reopen its UConnect System and help some users obtain "critical" e-mail. Many of the 50,000 accounts in the U-Connect System — the school's online system for e-mail — began experiencing problems Monday afternoon, and as of last night, many users were still unable to log in.

UK has worked closely with software company Novell to find the glitch in the password authentication process, and some progress has been made, said Doyle Priskney, UK's chief technology officer.

"We've increased the priority, and we're just going to continue to focus on it." UK has restored access to some systems that use the U-Connect UD and password, such as wireless access, SWEB and student lockers, he said.

For those in a "critical situation," Priskney said UK could create temporary accounts so they can see their mail. To request such an account, call the UK customer Service Center at 257:1300.

#### Lauded **UK** history professor dead at 64

Most people describe UK Professor
Lance Banning as a soft-spoken person, a quiet student of history.
But what Banning wasn't saying,

Center. He was 64. He
