

10. When an institution has in addition to the college of liberal arts, professional or technical departments, the college of liberal arts shall not be acceptable for the approved list unless the professional or technical departments are acceptable and of approved grade.

MINUTES OF THE SENATE MAY 9, 1921

The Senate met in the Little Theater Monday, May 9, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of March 21 and April 11, and Council minutes of April 15, read and approved.

A recommendation from the Rules Committee in regard to delinquent students, was presented. After some discussion, it was referred to the Committee for further consideration.

The following recommendation from the College of Arts and Sciences was approved:

"At its meeting on May 3, the Faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences voted to recommend the following course to the Senate:

35. Industrial Education. To meet the needs of teachers now in service, it is necessary to offer an Informational Extension Course with the following features: It shall consist of six periods, each one hour and thirty minutes in length, and shall receive credit as follows:

a. For persons who are entitled to admission to the University, the half credit earned will be applied as Baccalaureate credit.

b. For those who have less than 15 credits of high school work, a certificate of completion carrying no credits whatever is issued by the University of Kentucky.

Note: These six periods of non-resident work will give as a maximum 540 recitation minutes for one-half credit earned, while nine recitation periods of resident work give a maximum of only 450 recitation minutes per one-half credit. In point of time this is a gain of 20% over resident work."

Miss Simrall presented a recommendation from the Social Committee that the Senate approve the establishing of an honorary Home Economics organization with the object of obtaining a charter from Phi Upsilon Omicron, National Honorary fraternity. The Senate approved the organization.

The following recommendations from the Rules Committee were approved:

Bege
1. Concerning the Dropping of Students on Probation

"At the end of his semester of probation the student will be dropped unless he has made a standing of .7 on his entire semester's schedule, or grades of A, B and C in 12 credit hours of work."

2. Commencement Honors

a. Students are graduated "With High Distinction" who attain a standing of 2.6 or higher.
