Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee, Board of Trustees, University of Kentucky, Tuesday, June 14, 1977.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in regular session at 2:00 o'clock (Eastern Daylight Time) on Tuesday, June 14, 1977, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, and Mr. George W. Griffin. Professor Paul G. Sears, Secretary, Ex-Officio member of the Executive Committee, was present as was Professor Michael Adelstein, member of the Board of Trustees. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Dr. Robert Zumwinkle, Dr. Stanley Wall, Dr. Peter P. Bosomworth, Dr. John T. Smith, Dr. Donald B. Clapp, and Mr. Jack C. Blanton; Dr. Robert M. Drake, Special Assistant to the President; and Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel. Representatives of the various news media were in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened

The meeting was called to order at 2:03 o'clock. Following the invocation, pronounced by Mr. Sturgill, the Secretary called the roll and reported all members of the Executive Committee were present. The Chairman then declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:05 o'clock.

B. Minutes Approved

Without discussion on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the May 3, 1977, meeting of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary gave a brief resume of the items in his monthly report to the trustees and recommended it be accepted and filed. Without objection, it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

In order to correct an error in the recommended appointment of Mrs. Myrtle Fetner as an instructor in the Department of Accounting, College of

Business and Economics, (page 2 of PR 2), President Singletary said the phrase "(with tenure)" should be deleted and that the minutes should show this correction. He also called attention to the recommended appointment of Dr. Ronald T. Farrar as Director of the School of Journalism, and then recommended that PR 2 be approved.

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Cooper, and passed, PR 2 was approved as a whole and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3-I)

The first item in PR 3 recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs to sell to the University of Kentucky Athletics Association, at appraised value, a site between Harrison and Lexington Avenues near Memorial Coliseum. President Singletary explained that the Athletics Association is contemplating a gift of a facility which would be constructed on the site and owned and operated by the Athletics Association and he recommended approval of the sale of the property.

On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Professor Sears and passed without dissent, PR 3-I was approved. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3-II)

Noting that the parking situation at the Medical Center has been a major problem for a number of years, President Singletary recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the revision and reconstruction of the north parking lot of the Albert B. Chandler Medical Center. Following approval by the Council on Public Higher Education, the state will advance funds for the project to be repaid over a three year period from parking revenue.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded and passed, PR 3-II was approved. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3-III)

Each year contracts with the President and Vice Presidents providing for the terms and conditions of their employment must be executed. On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent, the Chairman was authorized to execute said contracts. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. University Extension Stipends (PR 4)

President Singletary noted that there were two parts to the recommendation in PR 4 relative to the stipend schedules for University Extension - (1) that the schedules in effect be increased; and (2) that the authority to establish and modify these schedules in the future be delegated to the President. He explained that the funds to cover these stipends, which are unusually low at the present time, come from money generated by University Extension and he recommended approval of PR 4 as presented. Both Professor Adelstein and Professor Sears endorsed the recommendation. Mr. Griffin moved approval and his motion was seconded by Professor Sears and passed without dissent. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Retirement Resolution (PR 5)

President Singletary indicated that under the University's Retirement Plan, which was adopted by the Board of Trustees on April 5, 1977, there is a provision which, upon approval by the Board of Trustees, would permit regular full-time employees of an agency for which the University serves as fiscal and payroll agent to participate in the plan. The Area Health Education System and the Kentucky Humanities Council have requested that their eligible employees be permitted to join the University's retirement plan. The University is fiscal and payroll agent for both groups and thus they satisfy the eligibility requirements. President Singletary, therefore, recommended approval of their request by the Board of Trustees.

On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Black and passed, the recommendation in PR 5 was approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Budget Revisions for 1976-77 (PR 6)

There being no questions, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed, the revisions for the 1976-77 Budget as recommended in PR 6 were authorized and approved. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

After indicating that the Finance Committee had met and reviewed the recommendations to be presented for action, Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Committee, recommended that the financial report for the ten month period ending April 30, 1977, be accepted and made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Authorization for Incineration of Paid Bonds and Coupons (FCR 2)

Mr. Clay moved that the Board of Trustees authorize Mr. Shelby Tussey, Controller Division, and Mr. Thomas McDonald. Internal Audit Division, to check the list of paid and cancelled bonds and coupons returned from paying agents from January 1, 1977, through March 31, 1977, to destroy these documents by burning in the incinerator of the Medical Center and to certify the correctness of the list as to incineration. His motion was seconded and passed with unanimous approval. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. License to Kentucky Authority for Educational Television (FCR 3)

The Kentucky Authority for Educational Television has requested the right to install a PBS Satellite Receiver Dish on a tract of land owned by the University located near the KET property on Cooper Drive. This new facility will improve the sound and picture quality as received from the Public Broadcasting System Headquarters in Washington D. C. and the Finance Committee recommends that this be done.

Mr. Clay moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer be authorized to execute a license with the Kentucky Authority for Educational Television granting the right to install a Satellite Receiver Dish on the property described in FCR 3. His motion was seconded by Professor Sears and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Lease of Hamilton House (FCR 4)

Mr. Clay explained that the Hamilton House located on South Limestone Street near the Good Samaritan Hospital has been occupied by students as a cooperative housing unit. In order to continue to use this facility for students it would be necessary for the University to do considerable renovation and repairs. The Finance Committee felt that the number of students living in the house did not warrant the major expenditures of funds required and, therefore, recommended that the request from the University of Kentucky Woman's Club to lease Hamilton House for a club meeting facility be approved.

Mr. Clay moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer be authorized to execute a ten year lease with an annual cancellation clause, subject to review every two years, with the University of Kentucky Woman's Club for the purpose of using Hamilton House for a club meeting facility. His motion was seconded by Professor Sears. President Singletary said he wished to add his endorsement to the recommendation since he felt that the Woman's Club was a very important part of the University community and provided many and valuable contributions. Without further discussion, Mr. Clay's motion passed. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Investment of Individual Restricted Fund Account Balances (FCR 5)

Mr. Clay noted that the University has not had a policy which would permit individual Restricted Fund account balances to participate in earnings from investments. In order to establish such a policy, he moved adoption of the policy statement in FCR 5. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed without objection. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Proposed Amendments to the Medical Staff Bylaws, Rules and Regulations (MCCR 1)

Mr. Black, Chairman of the Medical Center Committee, reported that the committee had met on Saturday, May 21, and approved for transmission to the Board of Trustees two proposed amendments to the Medical Staff Bylaws, Rules and Regulations. These amendments would bring the Bylaws into compliance with the recommendations of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals, and Mr. Black moved approval of the amendments as presented in MCCR 1. His motion was seconded by Mr. Clay and passed with the understanding that an editorial change would be made in the second sentence of Part II-B so that sentence would read: "He/she shall be administratively recommended for appointment by the Dean of the College of Medicine, in consultation with the Hospital Director and Department Chairmen." (See MCCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

I. Sale of Property to University of Kentucky Athletic Association

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer to sell to the University of Kentucky Athletic Association, at appraised value, a site between Harrison and Lexington Avenues near Memorial Coliseum fronting approximately 81 feet on Harrison Avenue and approximately 130 feet on Lexington Avenue.

Background: The Athletic Association is contemplating the gift of a facility which would be constructed on the site and owned and operated by the Athletic Association.

II. Construction of Parking Lot - Albert B. Chandler Medical Center

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the revision and reconstruction of the North Parking Lot at the Albert B. Chandler Medical Center.

Background: Parking for a number of years has been a major problem in the Medical Center area. A recent study of North Parking Lot has shown that certain revisions and reconstruction of this lot would gain approximately 180 additional parking spaces for visitor parking. Estimated cost is \$250,000. The State will advance funds for this project. Said funds are to be repaid to the State over a three-year period from parking revenues.

III. Authorization to Execute Contracts

Recommendation: that the Chairman of the Board of Trustees be authorized to execute contracts with the President and Vice-Presidents providing for the terms and conditions of their employment.

UNIVERSITY EXTENSION STIPENDS

Recommendation: that approval be given to the following changes in stipend schedules in effect in University Extension and that in the future authority to establish and modify these schedules be delegated to the President of the University:

1. Increase stipends to Instructors participating in the offerings to the Fort Knox Center, our off-campus classes, and in the evening class division by \$150 per three-credit course, making the new schedule to be:

Lower Division Course	\$810
Upper Division Course	\$870
Graduate Level Course	\$930

Total cost of these changes is estimated to be \$62,500.

- 2. To recognize the additional effort required to teach off-campus classes by providing a payment of \$5 per mile, one time, one way, to a maximum of \$500, with this payment reduced proportionally for scheduling arrangements which require fewer than one trip per week. This payment would be made only to regular UK faculty who teach off-campus classes. The estimated cost of this proposal is \$12,500 per year.
- 3. An increase of \$150 in the stipend payment for the development of three-credit correspondence courses, making the new stipends to be:

Instructor	\$600
Assistant Professor	\$700
Associate Professor	\$800
Professor	\$900

The additional cost of these changes is estimated to be \$4,500 per year.

Background: Our present stipends in University Extension are low in relation to what other are paying for similar services. The proposed changes will help our competitive situation somewhat but we hope to further increase these stipends in the future as a part of our efforts to enlarge our off-campus and evening offerings.

These particular stipend schedules have been brought to the Board in the past, but it will facilitate future administration of these programs if changes can be approved administratively.

RETIREMENT RESOLUTION

Recommendation: that employees of the Area Health Education System (AHES) and the Kentucky Humanities Council who are paid from funds for which the University of Kentucky is fiscal and payroll agent be permitted to join the University's Retirement Plan to the same extent as regular, full-time employees of the University are covered under terms of the Plan approved by the Board on April 5, 1977.

Background: Employees of the Area Health Education System and the Kentucky Humanities Council are not University employees but they were made eligible for inclusion in the University's Retirement Plan adopted by the Board on April 5, 1977. Eligibility for the Plan is conditioned upon "regular, full-time employment with the University or, upon approval of the Board of Trustees, with an agency for which the University serves as fiscal and payroll agent".

The AHES and Kentucky Humanities Council employees meet the terms and conditions for coverage under the University's Retirement Plan in that the University acts as "fiscal and payroll agent" in performing accounting and management functions and payment of salaries and fringe benefits for these employees. Funds to provide the retirement benefit are provided by AHES and the Kentucky Humanities Council under terms of our agreements with these agencies.

Comments - Additional student fee revenue generated by the University Extension's Continuing Education, Extension Class, and Independent Study programs will fund the increased expenditures in the respective programs. Expenditure increases for Elizabethtown, Jefferson, and Madisonville Community Colleges will be supported by additional student fee income generated by the Colleges' community service programs. A budget reduction for Eagle University is due to a decrease in enrollment and student fee income. Hopkinsville Community College's community service expenditure reduction is reflective of a decrease in testing service income. Additional student fee income will fund the expenditure increase for the Community College System's Off-campus classes. Additional grants from the Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the U.K. Medical Center will fund the College of Allied Health Professions' Dental Hygiene program expansion and the College of Medicine's Pain Clinic. Increases in vending machine and student fee scholarship income will support additional student aid requests.

INVESTMENT OF INDIVIDUAL RESTRICTED FUND ACCOUNT BALANCES

Recommendation: The following policy is recommended to establish guidelines by which individual Restricted Fund account balances can participate in earnings from investments.

- (1) It is the policy of the University that available current Restricted Fund balances of the University be invested in a single pooled account in accordance with Investment Policies--Current Funds, FCR 7a, as approved by the Board of Trustees, December 8, 1970.
- (2) In those cases where donors or other external agencies have stipulated under the terms of the gift instrument that all or part of the principal be held for investment for a certain period of time, such gift or portion thereof is by definition a term endowment and shall be recorded in the endowment fund group.
- (3) Upon request of University administrators, approved by the appropriate department chairperson, individual Restricted Fund account balances may participate in earnings from pooled investments, under the following considerations:
 - a. A minimum cash balance of \$10,000 is required for participation in the pool unless this minimum is waived by the Treasurer.
 - b. The funds so invested shall participate in the pool for no less than one year.
 - c. Investment for individual Restricted Fund account balances will not be made except on approval of the Treasurer.
- (4) Each fiscal year, at June 30, the annual investment yield for the pooled investment account will be calculated. Investment income will be allocated to individual Restricted Fund account balances that have participated in the pooled investment account by applying the average annual yield to the amounts previously set aside for investment purposes, considering the length of time each account has participated in the pool.

- (5) Earned investment income exceeding the amounts allocated to individual Restricted Fund accounts will be credited to General Fund Unrestricted Revenues. Distribution of earnings will be determined by the Controller in accordance with paragraph (4) above.
- (6) Retroactive participation in the investment will not be permitted.

Background: Generally, it is the policy of the University of Kentucky to invest available Restricted Fund balances with the earned income credited to General Fund Revenues. Restricted Fund balances may, upon budget approval, be expended for current operations in accordance with purposes and restrictions established by donors at the time of the gift. There has been no concerted effort in the past to determine how long cash will remain in individual Restricted Fund accounts before budgeted expenditures are actually made.

Certain donors, and in some instances University administrators, have requested that available balances in specific individual accounts be separately invested with earned income credited to those accounts. Generally, the amounts invested have been involved for short periods of time. Recently, there has been an increase in such requests particularly from the Medical Center.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO MEDICAL STAFF BY-LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve amendments to the Medical Staff By-Laws, which govern the organization of the medical staff of University Hospital, as follows:

Part II. Organizational Structure

Add the following as Part II-B:

The Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs as Chief of Staff must be a physician licensed to practice in the State of Kentucky and hold an academic appointment in an appropriate clinical department. *He/she shall be administratively appointed by the Dean of the College of Medicine, in consultation with the Hospital Director and Department Chairmen. He/she will be responsible to the Dean of the College of Medicine for maintaining effective liaison with the administration of the University Hospital on behalf of the education programs of the College and patient care programs of the Hospital.

The present Part II-B will become II-C and Part II-C will become II-D.

Part II. Qualifications of Medical Staff

Add the following new paragraph in Part III-B between paragraph one and paragraph two:

Clinical privileges for family practitioners in specialty departments or services must be recommended by the Department of Family Practice and approved by the Chief of the specialty service.

Background: In order to comply with recommendations of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals, it is necessary that two sections of the Medical Staff By-Laws be amended. The original by-laws were approved by the Board of Trustees in September, 1971; minor revisions were approved in May, 1976.
