TO THE TEACHER

In any adult reading program, it is most important to find material that is easy to read and that is sufficiently motivated to get and to hold the interest of learner. Especially true is this fact, as it applies to teaching adults to read.

A controlled vocabulary is used to assure easy reading. Of the 137 words used in this reader, only 27 are not contained in the minimum word list for the first four grades. Numbers at right of each word indicate the grade of the word.

Words are introduced as new words in each lesson. The students are expected to learn to spell each new word and use it in a sentence. This will give them training in spelling and language.

The study of the phrases and new words should precede the reading of the lesson with a special drill on them at the end of the reading lesson.

It is suggested that the teacher write on the blackboard for special study, phrases and words that are difficult for the students.

New words are introduced step by step. To hold the interest of the student, the story form is used. Each lesson is built around a topic that is of common and local interest.

Spelling and language are a part of reading. Follow directions in each lesson for your spelling and language work.

Give the student practice in finding words in the dictionary and determining the appropriate meaning.

It is our hope that the teacher will encourage the student to present additional material on each lesson.

Ask the students to select words that appeal to them and give meaning of the words, and use them in sentences.


Thirty-nine phrases are given for special study before the reading lesson is started. Prite them on the blackboard and have them learned. Make phrase flash cards of the phrases. Make word flash cards of the words in each lesson. See word and phrase list.

This is Book I of a series for training selectees and others needing beginning training in reading. When Book I is finished, Book II should be studied. It gives direct training to selectees for registration purposes - is a study of his Registration Card.

(The teacher should write copy of words in first eleven lessons).




