I received your dear welcome little letter I was so glad to get it for I had not had a letter from you for about a month I began to wonder what had become of my little girl you asked if I remember those little girls I don't just exactly remember what any of them looked like only Corrie Peters and she talked to me more than the others did when I was there but I remember all the little children in the home every night in my Prayers I am going to send you a box I think I will get it off the Middle of next week but I will write to you at the time I send your box it is pretty cold here we have had nice weather till now and it is snowing

to day the ground is white  
Ada I always forgot to tell you  
when I came home I went to see  
Mrs Banks and gave her the Pin Lap  
you sent her she was very much pleased  
she thinks you can sew nicely and I  
gave the little one to Erie Bayley and  
she thinks it is so nice she was asking  
me to day when you was coming  
home I have a class in Sunday school with  
eight little girls and they are very  
much interested about you they say  
you must go to see them all when  
you come home

I think I will close my letter for  
this time tell Jimy I will answer  
his Letter as soon as I can Grandpa  
Grandma and your Aunties send  
Love to Ada and Jimy I will close with  
Love to all the little ones and much Love

Gettysburg Pa May 11<sup>th</sup> 1870

Jennie received your kind and welcome letter and was glad to hear from you, I am well and hope you are enjoying the same health, It is a very rainy day and we can not go out and play, we enjoy ourselves very much, I send my love to you all, The blossoms are on the trees and it looks very nice, The boys all play "Shinny" and "Pig in the Pen," and "Hobby Trap" and some more plays, I will send you three more cards that I got for getting under Good, Mr and Mrs Hilton are both well and send their love to you We have sewing hour in the afternoon for the large girls and on Tuesdays and Fridays the little girls sew Please come and see us we would be

very glad to see you, I will write  
to gerrie and barrie Edark next  
week, I can not think of much this  
time, but I will try and think  
of more the next time I write,  
I do not play with my doll  
I want to see how nice I can  
keep it for I want to play  
with it when I come home,  
I sat in the seat with Sallie Farley  
and Eddie Slope in school, I will  
close by saying Good bye from  
your loving daughter Adair.
