the first Letters I have had since the
seventh of December from you I began

tell her I did not get her letter she will
have to write it over and send it
Grandma sends two envelopes one for ada
and one for jinny that is all Good night from

Ada I met Elmer Gibson and his Mother last Saturday on the street and she wants to send Elmer back to the homestead but she says his Guardian told her they wold not take him back I told her I was surprised that she had kept him home so long but she says he was sick so long after he came home and I told her to write to Philadelphia to Dr Bourne about it and she wanted me to mention it in my Letter to you Let your teachers read this tell Jimy to write to Mother whenever it comes his turn ada ~~the~~ in this Letter you will find two little ribbons your Aunt mil sends them to you to dress your doll with George is well he is in bed fast asleep now I think i will close for this time with Lots of Love to my Little Son and Daughter your Loving Mother

he would like so much to see you
Georgie has had the ague this summer
again but he is better now he is in
bed fast asleep he will answer your
letter sometime again it is getting
late and they are all in bed but me

Dear Mother


I received
