I have been in the receipt of your  
of favour of the 23 Inst last for some time, but owing  
to the difficulty of procuring the paper you desired  
My answer has been very long delayed

I had supposed his pedigree in manuscript and his  
his printed bills were among my papers, but upon the  
most diligent search I could not find them - Since  
- desirably wrote to several gentlemen to be told how  
to get his horse to send me his bills - and yesterday they  
arrived in time, one of which there will be inclosed

Yor R. him as you will see, is a horse of fine size  
& stamony, of fine constitution and near as Natty healthy  
a number of large colts & of great symmetry - I am using  
one of his colts as a carriage horse, the first animal  
I have ever seen 16 hands high and near as Natty gray

Yor R. him has had quite a barren field here in  
which to distinguish himself as a breeder of race  
horses - having had but few mares bred to him of  
pure blood - Major Marshall all of Lewis County bred  
a fine Quarter Horse to him and got a colt which  
has uniformly distinguished himself - having won seven  
races closing none as I am informed - This is the only  
colt of his, which has been trained
