Upon motion of President Patterson seconded by Judge Barker and duly carried, it was resolved that no fees, either tuition, matriculation or gymnasium be refunded to any student after the lapse of six weeks from the date of their entrance, unless by action of the Executive Committee.

At this point the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock A. M.

Upon suggestion of Judge Kinkead, Mr. Hillenmeyer, a student was permitted to come before the Board and make a statement concerning the issual of a College Annual for the present year, in which he asked for an appropriation of \$300, and offered to give the Board a bond signed by his father, to save the College harmless from payment of any sum by reason of the issual of this annual over and above the appropriation asked for.

Mr. Hillenmeyer retired.

Thereupon Judge Kinkead offered the following resolution,-

Resolved that the sum of \$300.00 be appropriated in aid of the students getting out a college annual for the current year, on condition that Mr. Hillenmeyer execute a bond, with his father as surety, to the Trustees of the College, to save the College harmless beyond the amount of this appropriation, and that this bond be submitted to the Chairman of the Board and Business Agent for approval.

Said motion was seconded by President Patterson, and upon being put upon its passage, the vote on roll-call, stood as follows:-

After Prof. Mathews withdrew there arose an informal discussion as to whether any of the funds accruing to the Experiment Station, growing out of State Legislation, could be used for the purpose of supporting the Department of Agriculture; and after said discussion was over, Mr. Metcalfe offered the following resolution.

Resolved that a Committee composed of Mr. McChord, Judge Lafferty, Judge Terrell and Mr. Hopkins be appointed to investigate the legal status of the funds accruing to the Experiment Station, in connection with this college and report to the next meeting of this Board a plan by which any portion of those funds can be used in other channels, for the benefit of the Agricultural Department of the College, than those in which they are now used.

Said motion was seconded by President Patterson on condition that Mr. Metcalfe's name be added to the committee.

We your Finance Committee report, that after a whole days careful examination of the accounts of the Business Agent from Dec.lst 1905 to Nov. 1st 1906 both of the College proper, and the Girls' Dormitory, we find them correct and kept with conscientious and painstaking care, for which the Business Agent and Assistant are entitled to much praise.

We think that in order to have uniformity of purpose as P.130 between the College and the Experiment Station, that the same committee should examine the accounts of both. We also think it would be more business like if the accounts presented by officers and employees, excepting salaries, were required to be audited by said Committee or the Executive Committee or the Chairman of the Executive Committee, before they are paid.

We believe that in conformity to the provisions of the charter that all officers and professors both in college proper

and in Experiment Station should be paid their salaries in full in money, and not allow any perquisities. We know that the allowance of such perquisites has been usual heretofore and that the recipients are not in any way to blame, for receiving them, but as such usage might grow into an abuse, and also because the law requires we recommend as strict compliance with the charter in this respect, at the same time giving full money allowance for perquisites given up.

At this point Mr. Hopkins made an oral report for the Committee on the President's Report as follows:-

We have not prepared a written report, but desire to make an oral report, if acceptable to the Board.

The first suggestion the President makes in his Report is that the name of the college be changed to University. We are of opinion that this would require an Act of the Legislature, and approve the suggestion with that modification.

To this part of the Report endorsing the President's suggestion as to a change of name, Mr. Metcalfe noted his dissent.

The second recommendation is in regard to athletic exercises such as base-ball and foot-ball, and especially in connection with foreign teams or what is known as prize match games. The committee is unanimously of the opinion that all such games should be prohibited and that athletic exercise of this kind should be limited to games between different teams of the college with each other; but that no teams should be permitted to go abroad to play, or to have match teams to come upon the grounds to play with them.

The reference of the unfortunate occurence on Halloween night, we do not think calls for any response from us, as that matter is now closed.

The suggestion that the dormitories on the college grounds should be discontinued as such and used for other college purposes is a question which is referred to the Legislature, this Committee being of the opinion that this Board is unauthorized under the law as it now stands, to make such a change. We suggest that at the next June meeting a Committee be appointed, and directed to look after this matter before the Legislature.

At this point President Patterson offered the following resolution:

Resolved that there be appointed a Committee on Athletics to consist of Mr. Hopkins, Mr. Metcalfe, Mr. McChord and Judge Kinkead, to investigate the condition of college athletics, college amusements, and college fraternities, and report to the Board at its next June meeting.

Mr. Nicholas reported for the Committee on Finance orally as follows:

The committee reports that it has examined the Report of the Treasurer, and finds same to be correct.

At this point upon motion duly made, seconded and carried the Board adjourned sine die .
