## FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

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### FOREWORD

On our fourth birthday, following our yearly custom, we present to the public which supports us, a complete accounting of all our affairs. The auditor's reports are given in detail, and each individual subscription is separately accounted for. We feel that the 1,361 people who have contributed financially will be interested in knowing just what has been done with their money. Therefore, in addition to the audits, we publish at the close of the Bulletin a complete statement of the nursing work. Donations in kind rather than money are also acknowledged, and a summary of the inventories for the year is given, with an estimated valuation of the property in the nursing centers and stables.

We hope very much that every supporter of the Frontier Nursing Service will read this report carefully and share our happiness in the record it gives of growth and stability. We are but four years old, and we have a territory of 350 square miles fully covered from five nursing stations, one of them also a twelve bed hospital and one a guest house and administrative headquarters. Our total investments in property, equipment, and our nineteen horses, represent a value of well over \$100,000, without lien. We have also in hand, or already promised, the first \$50,000 of our endowment. We have loyal district committees carrying on the work in the field, and supporting committees, besides the Kentuckians, in twelve large cities. We have many, many friends. Their financial support this year has exceeded by more than ten times that of three years ago when we made our first annual report.

There are two objectives the Frontier Nursing Service asks its supporters to keep in mind—one an immediate objective. We aim to treble our present territory and cover 1,000 square miles

within the next four years. This will give us the statistical data Dr. Louis I. Dublin of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, who will tabulate it for us, considers necessary in order to demonstrate adequately that the work of nurse-midwives in remotely rural areas does lower the death rate of women and young children, and raise the general level of health of the population.

Our second objective, once we have proved our purpose on a large enough scale to be convincing, is to raise an endowment which will enable us to carry our work into the length and breadth, height and depth of our American mountain ranges. Thus we have a double objective in mind—first, to give every individual in the area we cover the most perfect service at our command; second, to reach with this service all those millions of individuals who are now without skilled service of any kind.

The Frontier Nursing Service has suffered only one severe blow in the course of the year, and that was in the loss of its Chairman, Alexander J. A. Alexander. That Mrs. S. Thruston Ballard has consented to the ardent wish of the trustees and accepted the chairmanship thus left vacant, gives us an assurance of leadership in the future equal to our highest aspirations.

We enter upon our fifth year confident and eager.

Dr. Alexander was an example and an inspiration to all those who had the privilege of knowing him. His integrity was flawless; his honor, impeccable; his kindness, unfailing; and his faith, unassailable. He trusted in God, and served Him while life lasted. He could say with the psalmist of old, "Thou, O Lord, art a shield for me, my glory, and the lifter up of mine head." Dr. Alexander was faithful and dutiful in every relation in life, as son, husband, brother, father, as citizen of the state and member of the church. He was "Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto his life's end."

We, the members of the Frontier Nursing Service, will miss his leadership forever, but we shall always be grateful that we were given the opportunity of serving with him in a great cause; and we trust that, as time goes on, we may worthily carry on the work he faithfully aided from its beginning. We extend to Mrs. Alexander, to his sons, and to the other members of his family, our most profound sympathy, and the assurance of our realization of their great bereavement. May God bless them and comfort them and give them peace.

**REPORT OF THE NURSING WORK  
of the  
FRONTIER NURSING SERVICE**

**May 1, 1928—April 30, 1929**

The work of the Frontier Nursing Service during the past year was handled by 17 nurses, who worked a total of 141½ months. There was an average of 11.7 nurses on duty, of whom an average of 10½ nurses were doing midwifery as well as nursing. This includes the time spent on duty only and not vacations or sick leave or absence for study. The work done is outlined briefly as follows:

There were 5,098 people in 942 families attended during the year by the Service. Of these 580 were babies under two years of age, which have been seen at least once a month and as far as possible twice a month. These figures also include 865 children from two to six years of age and 1,761 school children.

The total number of children followed was 3,206.

Besides nursing care has been given to 454 very sick people, of whom 18 have died and 399 have recovered.

There have been 23 patients transported to hospitals in Lexington and Louisville, on passes given them and their nurses by the Louisville & Nashville Railroad.

The nurses paid 14,799 visits and received 6,761 visits at the nursing centers. They were on duty 30,763 hours.

The little hospital at Hyden, in the six months since it was opened, has been occupied 927 days by 32 patients, an average of a little over five patients a day.

**GROUP WORK**

There was an estimated attendance of 2,477 at the ten large gatherings in which the nurses took part, where they spoke or handled exhibits.

At 489 special conferences, special medical clinics by doctors, etc., there was a known attendance of 930 men, 1,867 women and 3,871 children—a total of 6,668.

## MIDWIFERY

The nurse-midwives have delivered 101 women in childbirth (including two miscarriages) during the year, and have given them pre-natal and post-partum care. There were three premature stillbirths. There has been one maternal death, due to a heart condition. The patient was under medical care, although no doctor could be gotten in time for the actual delivery.

Medical care was obtained with great difficulty during the winter, owing to the illness or absence of the two nearest physicians. For one abnormal obstetrical case we were over thirty hours in getting assistance and twenty-one hours for another. The doctors were, as always, splendidly cooperative when they came, and answered the call at the earliest moment possible. One physician, from Bell County, who came in for an emergency eclamptic (the one who was twenty-one hours getting to us), had not been in his bed for two nights in succession. His territory covers a thousand square miles.

The best testimony we could give that the nurse-midwives of the Service have carried on superbly under these conditions, is found in 100 mothers safely brought through their ordeal by the Service and 100 unbroken homes.

The midwifery cases closed during the year were 136. In addition to the 101 delivered by the nurse-midwives, 2 were delivered by doctors, 15 by native midwives and 3 moved away.

There were admitted 141 new cases. Forty-four midwifery cases are registered at the present date and carried forward as expectant mothers.

## REPORT OF THE ARRIVAL OF TWO BABIES DURING A FLOOD TIDE

We had a big flood Friday and Saturday night—the biggest I've ever seen here. It smashed everything along the banks of the river on each side, including the swinging footbridge at Hyden. It started at noon on Friday. The river was so low you could almost have waded across the ford, but by six o'clock it was rising rapidly. At nine that night a man came for me from Wolf Creek. He had to swim down the road from the mouth of Camp Creek part way, and we couldn't get back that way at all; so we went up Hurricane Creek and across a new trail to Wolf—the most terrible trail I have been over and in the worst storm.

Needless to say, the baby was born when we arrived, but as the father had come all that way for me I couldn't but go back with him—but it was the worst trip I had. We even had to swim Coon Creek four times, and he waded up to his neck nine times in all.

Well, I got back next day. I had to leave the horse on Camp Creek and walk back beyond the school and down to the mouth, where I had lunch. It was a sight to see. The river was up to the B's front gate—hardly a treetop in sight, and all the bottom fields a sheet of water. Well, after lunch I walked up high on the mountain and waded waist deep across Hurricane with Tom H. and Jim M. carrying the saddle bags and all of us holding hands.

I got home at 2:30 P. M. and had just got bathed and was falling off to sleep, when Marion came up and said if I would go across the river to the M's one of the men would take me over. It certainly wanted the movie camera to finish that picture.

I tell you it was exciting. To start with, they had to take the boat out of the bushes, and Lewis and Jayhugh and Tom and Jim carried it to a good starting place, and Jim took me over. The moon was high by this time. Five men were on the other side on a raft ready to catch the rope. But the river was so swift the boat skimmed past like a piece of driftwood. But Jim is a corker of a boatman and landed us safely away below the ford right into the M's bottom field, arriving in time (8 P. M.). I got an eleven pound boy at 2 A. M. Sunday morning. So everyone is very happy.
