



Welcome, Commodores

Down through the ages from the distant past have come hordes of Commodores from the fertile plains of Tennessee at scattered intervals to make disastrous raids into the bluegrass meadows of central Kentucky. And occasionally, in retaliation, Kentucky Wildcats have gone over the border to wreak vengeance on those ruthless Commodores but every Wildcat invasion has resulted in failure.

Natural rivals in athletics because of geographical location, Vanderbilt and Kentucky have met sixteen times on the gridiron since the season of 1896 when the Wildcats braved the Commodores in their own drydock at Nashville. The Kentuckians limped back to Lexington under a 6 to 0 defeat.

In all this long series, which has reached traditional proportions, Kentucky never has been able to hang a defeat on Vanderbilt, although in 1919 the Wildcats and the Commodores battled to a scoreless tie on Stoll Field.

Andy Gill, now coaching the high school team at Rockford, Ill., was the Kentucky coach that year. One of the star Vanderbilt players that season was a huge tackle, Josh Cody, now the head football coach at the University of Florida.

Both coaches of the teams meeting here today are alumni of the universities their teams represent. For Kentucky, the coach is Ab Kirwan, captain and halfback of the Wildcat team of 1925. For Vanderbilt, the coach is Ray Morrison, captain and quarterback of the team of 1910.

S. A. "Daddy" Boles, Kentucky's graduate manager of athletics, attended Vanderbilt with Morrison in 1910 and the two were close friends. Five years later, Morrison was the football coach at Southern Methodist University while Boles was coach at Trinity College, in Texas. Their teams met in 1915 and the Boles-coached Trinity team defeated the Morrison-coached Southern Methodists. His success, however, in later seasons at S. M. U. was so great that when "Uncle Dan" McGuggin retired as head coach of the Commodores, Morrison was recalled to his alma mater.

In the stadium here today are many alumni of Vanderbilt. Many of them make their home in Lexington. Others live in different sections of the State. Quite a few came up from Tennessee.

We are glad to welcome these Vanderbilt alumni to the game today. We are happy to welcome the Vanderbilt team and all its supporters as well as the faithful followers of our own Wildcats. May the game result in a real battle with the best team winning and may the series between Kentucky and Vanderbilt continue into infinity.

From early season games, the two elevens may be closely matched. The Commodores have defeated Washington University and Western Kentucky Teachers by close scores, while Kentucky has defeated Maryville and Oglethorpe by topheavy margins. However, Kentucky's oppositions in those first two games was not nearly so powerful as that faced by the Commodores.

Both Kentucky and Vanderbilt are members of the Southeastern Conference. This is the first conference game for each team and naturally each team today is striving for its initial conference victory of the season.

The Commodores defeated the Wildcats 12 to 0 last September in a rainstorm at Nashville.

Coach Ray Morrison Vanderbilt



Ray Morrison, all-time Vanderbilt quarterback who returned to his alma mater in 1935 after making football history as the ringmaster of the Southern Methodist University Aerial Circus, is beginning his twentieth year as a college football coach and his fouth year at Vanderbilt.

For the team he produced at Vanderbilt last year Ray Morrison was selected by the Southern sports writers and Southeastern Conference coaches as the coach "who did the best coaching job of the year in the Southeastern Conference."

Coach Morrison has the distinction of having served two colleges as head football coach at two different times each. He was at S. M. U. in 1915 and 1916 and went back in 1922 to stay until 1935. He acted as head coach at Vanderbilt in 1918 when Coach Dan McGugin was absent and returned in 1935 under a five-year contract.

Coach Morrison was captain and quarterback of the Commodores in 1911. Thus both Vanderbilt and Kentucky are coached by their own alumni, as Ab Kirwan, the Wildcat coach, was captain and halfback of the Kentuckians in 1925.
