





Gaseous Diffusion is an old technology that puts the "ummph" in uranium used to runclear power plants.

Uranium is an element found in the earth's crust that can be milled into an isotope suitable for generating electricative.

Uranium 235 is the desirable fisiscionable isotope, said George Ann Lookofsky, public affairs manager at the United States Enrichment Corp.'s Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant:

Uranium is an element found in the earth's crust and transported to a milling facility. There, it is mixed with fluorine to make a

solid substance called "yellow-cake" and shipped to gaseous diffusion plants in the United States and abroad.

At the plant, the cake is heated into a gaseous state called uranium hexafluoride. The gas is sieved through several hundreds of miles of pipes inside the plant until the uranium 255 is enriched to 2.75 percent. This enrichem to 2.75 percent. This enrichem to process takes about three to four days.

Then the uranium hexafluoride is cooled until it resumes its solid state and is shipped to the Portsmouth, Ohio, plant to be further enriched.



## Clinton makes historic visit

Navajo visit: President admits government has failed Native Americans, promises turn-around and bridges

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.—President Clinton promised better connections between experimental programment and protrunity elsewhere, even as he said the federal government has failed Native Americans in the past.

"Though many of your ancestors gave up fighting and gave up land and water and mineral rights in exchange for peace, security, health care and education, the federal government did not live up to its end of the deal," Clinton told thousands of cheering Navajos on Surrounded by tribal leaders in an impoverished Navajo reservation town. Clinton announced more than \$100 million in pledges from the computer industry for hard-luck communities nationwide. The money is part of the Clinton administration's effort to erase the digital divide' that separates poor and prosperous Americans in their access to the Clinton was flying to Chicago today for an afternoon speech before returning to Washington.

The president promised \$1-a-month telephone service to 300,000 Indian households.

No other star in the Hollywood sky has shone brighter and longer than Paul Newman. Almost fifty years have passed since he first strolled onto the screen with his trademark shuffle and helped the likes of James Dean and Marion Brando usher in a new approach to acting that defied the old Clark Gable/Cary Grant matinee idol hammines.

### Biotechnology a threat to consumers

There has been much debate between biotechnology companies and consumers over the safety of genetically engineered food.

If we were to believe such companies as Monsanto and Novaris Seeds, we would believe that they are angelic visionaries with a moral imperative to save the poor and the starving populace of the planet.

Unfortunately for these companies, their actions do not match their public relations strategies. These biotechnology companies have fought given the same products on the product of the planet.

At present, the FDA requires only that firms do their own safety assessment of new genetically engineered (GB) products.

Common sense, coupled with past examples, dictate that corporations will not adequately ponies to put GB products on the shocks of our grocery stores without giving the consumers any notice on the label or in the product ingredients.

Presently it appears as though the FDA is, to some extent, in bed with the biotech industry. Philip J. Regal, a biologist at the University of Minnesota, recently discussed public meetings announced by the FDA.

"They've been holding hearings like this for 15 years," he said. "They spend a lot of money holding meetings, listen and take lots of notes, maybe even invite a few scientists in to be the conscience of the republic. Then nothing changes."


