The NAACP has been involved in the Haitian plight since 1915 when James Weldon Johnson spent three years monitoring the American occupation of that country.


The tragedy of Haitian bodies washing ashore reminds us of the unequal treatment accorded these freedom seekers by the U.S. Government.
