These powers of regulation could conceivably extend to a requirement that all editorial matter be submitted for approval—but to date they have not been exercised to that extent. In the past month there have been several paragraphs cut out of an editorial, several elters which have not been allowed to run, and occasional "advice" to the editor to moderate this, or to state that differently.
