But to say that Britain and America per serepresent the former viewpoint and that Germany, Italy, and Japan represent the latter is not merely an oversimplification of fact—it is almost a misstatement of the truth.

The so-called Fascis nations are as yet merely near-Fascist, since Fascism does not permit the opposition to declare itself. There is an anti-Fascis force present, but it has been driven underground.

And the so-called democratic nations are only near-democratic. There is a strong Fascist force present, but it is clever enough to disguise itself in folklores that are familiar enough to be accepted without a great deal of objection.

Big Ben resounded the last stroke of nine o'clock Sunday night in London. The sound vibrated several seconds. A humming noise on the radio gree boulder then died out. Winston Churchill began his speech.

It was five mouths ago, he said, when he last addressed the empire over "the broadcast" and since that time the British government had madegreat progress. The island kingdom was a lort stronger, a lot better protected from invasion than it was in October. Hitler had missed his best chance for the invasion. best chance for the invasion.

Churchill continued his address, speaking pre-Churchill continued his address speaking pre-cisely with the carefully chosen words of the novelist. He reviewed the defense work of the Royal Air Force after the fall of France when Hilter threw a vast aerial fleet over the Islands. The prime minister then commended the now-legendary courage of the British people during the lighter air raids which followed the first attempt at invasion.

After three days of listless debate, the momentous "lend-lease" bill for aiding Britain by giving President Roosevelt broad powers of controlling credit and national arms production, was passed by the House Saturday night.

The vote was 260 to 165, a margin which was made high as possible to allow the administra-tion to-show almost unanimous support for Eng-

Alterations were: (1) A limit of \$1,300,000,000 worth of American defense items on hand, in production, or in appropriation. The house refused a proposal that the bill's total cost should be set at \$7,000,

000,000.

(2) Congress may rescind any of the powers granted in the bill by a simple majority vote.

(3) A time limit of two years on the presi-

ent's powers.
