I was up to see Mr. Coltin today to "borrow" two stamps. He reminded me that you wanted photos. I told him that I had pictures & finger prints taken in at least six states on account of drunkenness. I hope that I may have instilled in him a germ of cynicism in regard to the present day "Crime War."

During your visit to N port, I believe that I explained to you that when I returned to the Dexter Hotel after four months in Bridgewater, all my clothing had been appropriated except the suit & overcoat which was in the cleaners, & which you redeemed for me. The suit will be appropriate for a shroud when Fair Harvard gets thru sawing me up. Clothing is fairly easy to replace, but not a Navy Discharge, a Testimonial Letter signed by the President, Merchant Marine Medal of W.W. II, the
