Gunn, H.M.  
Letter from.

A letter was read from an alumnus, Mr. H. M. Gunn, of Mt. Sterling asking if the college could not make some move toward securing recognition by the State Board of Education of California, as an accredited institution, in order that our graduates may become eligible to positions in the high schools of that state in accordance with the requirements of the California laws upon the subject.

Upon motion of Prof. Anderson, it was ordered that a committee of three should be appointed to take such steps as may be necessary to secure the eligibility of our graduates to positions in California schools.

President Patterson appointed Prof. Anderson, Mackenzie and Brooks.

In accordance with a suggestion, also from Mr. Gunn, it was ordered that two medals should be offered by the college to competitors in the next Blue Grass School Tournament for excellence in English and Plane Trigonometry severally, and that a scholarship be awarded for the best examination in Latin.

Upon motion of Prof. Norwood, seconded by Prof. Brooks, it was ordered that provision be made for issuing bulletin #15 of the college as a general engineering bulletin in Jan. 1904.

Pres. Patterson had a letter from one of the officers having in charge the Kentucky exhibit at the St. Louis exposition in 1904, requesting that if possible some contribution should be made by the members of the teaching body toward the success of the exhibit.

Prof. Norwood, having volunteered for the service, the subscription paper was placed in his hands.
