The Gay Straight Alliance for Youth is looking for volunteers willing to go to school GSA meetings in the fall. This year GLSO GSA facilitators developed training materials for student leaders and presented a series of empowerment workshops to teach them how to organize and motivate their fellow students. Not all GSA student leaders were able to come to the workshops; we want to take the materials to them in their schools.

Several of the school GSAs do not yet have advisers for next year. We might encourage teachers to become advisor in their school, if they knew there was a volunteer from the community willing to help. We have training materials on how to get started, how to attract new students, how to lead meetings and so forth. We also have discussion guides, team building games, DVDs and other materials.

Volunteers would need to have time in mid-afternoon to visit schools. Or idea is to have people willing to visit a specific school frequently in the fall and then periodically during the school year. 




