

Die Kosten für die Ausbildung und Ausrüstung trägt jeweils der Betrieb, dem der Herangezogene angehört. Gehört er keinem Betrieb an, ist der führende Betrieb Restenträger.

Ist ein Werkluftschubetrieb führend, dann wird damit die Beitragspflicht nach § 8 der L. Dv. nicht auf solche geführten Betriebe ausgedehnt, die nur wegen ihrer räumlichen Verbindung mit dem führenden Betrieb, nicht aber wegen ihrer Eigenart zum Werkluftschutz gehören.

Slept in in bad tonight. Calmer bawling lightly & on & that old stately barn house smell. A hole at my time gave me a little headache very very bad kind. Are told to day that we're get many more from tomorrow. Killed a sheep tonight.

When the partitive noun is the direct object of a negative verb, SOME or ANY is expressed by de alone. Examples: Nous n'avons pas de maisons. --- We do not have any houses. Il n'y a pas de livres. --- There are not any books.

SOME or ANY as a pronoun - en. It must be expressed in French, even when omitted in English. The En stands directly before a Verb. Ex: Have we some? -- En avons-nous? Louise has not any. -- Louise n'en a pas. There is some in the house. -- Il y en a dans la maison.

ADJECTIVES: Regularly add s to form the plural. e to form the feminine.

Ex:	M. Sing.	M. Pl.	Fem. Sing.	Fem. Pl.
	grand	grands	grande	grandes
	petit	petits	petite	petites
	important	importants	importante	importantes

All adjectives ending in e in the masculine do not change in the feminine.

Ex:	M. Sing	M. Pl	Fem. Sing.	Fem. Pl.
young	jeune	jeunes	jeune	jeunes
useful	utile	utiles	utile	utiles

All Adjectives must agree in gender and number with the noun they modify.

Ex: Le garçon est grand. -- The boy is great. La fille est grande. -- The girl is large. Les maisons sont grandes. -- The houses are large. Les livres sont petits. -- The books are small. La maison est grande mais les chambres sont petites. -- The house is large but the rooms are small. Les garçons sont utiles mais les filles ne sont pas utiles. -- The boys are useful but the girls are not useful.

A Noun followed by SOME or ANY, expressed or understood, may be called a "Partitive Noun."

The words which in French express the idea of SOME or ANY is called a "Partitive sign." A pronoun that expresses the idea of SOME or ANY is called a "Partitive Pronoun." EXAMPLES: -- (General) Les hommes sont utiles dans les maisons. -- Men are useful in houses. (Part) Il y a des boîtes (boxes) sur la table. -- There are some boxes on the table. (Gen. Partitive) Les femmes sont utiles. -- Women are useful.

"Partitive sign" de plus the Definite Article, de alone or en. A Partitive sign is always used before each noun of a series. EX. Il y a des filles, des garçons, et des femmes dans la maison. -- There are girls, boys, and women in the house.

SUPPLY THE PROPER PARTITIVE SIGN:

Avez-vous filles l'homme a maisons. Montrez-moi argent.
Avez-vous élèves Robert? J'ai beaucoup livres.
