

And Universities," some students commented that this seemed

First, last year's nominations for listing were greeted by some
criticism from students. No doubt all who received the nomination deserved it, but still there were comments, letters-otheditor and questions criticising the method of selection, the
comission of certain names, and so forth.

Second, the National Association of Deans of Men has decide
against making "Who's Who" a part of its program.







