The number of students applying to UK has increased over the past few years, herring said. This year UK's office of admissions received 8,100 applications, of which only 75 percent were accepted, he said.



BUCHAREST, Romania — Greece's deputy foreign minister and five others were killed late Tuesday when their executive jet hit heavy turbulence and plummeted thousands of feet before leveling off, Romanian officials said. Deputy Foreign Minister Yiannos Kgranidiotis, his son and four others were killed, said Romanian Transport Minister Traina Bassex. He said five others injured had been hospitalized. The pilot was unhurt and was able to land in Bucharest, Bassecu said. Romanian television reports said Kranidiotis and the others possibly suffocated or suffered heart attacks after their aircraft suddenly depressurized as it rapidly lost altitude.

Students Protest in Jakarta

DILI, Indonesia — In the Indonesian capital of Jakarta, nearly 1,000 students tried to march on parliament Tuesday, demanding the resignation of President B.J. Habibie and the end of military involvement in politics - and blaming both for the bloodshed in East Timor. Protesters clashed with police firing plastic bullets and tear gas. "The military kill people in East Timor. We students must challenge them," said one protest organizer. Hundreds of thousands of East Timorese are estimated to have fled in the wake of a campaign of violence, launched by the Indonesian armly and pro-Indonesian militia after the province voted on Aug. 30 to secede from Indonesia.

Forbes Tours Pregnancy Center

CLINTON TOWNSHIP, Mich. — Republican presidential candidate Steve Forbes said today that one of his first acts, if elected president, would be to sign a ban on a type of late-term abortion. "Life begins at conception and should end only at natural death." Forbes said during a campaign stop at a Christian-based pregnancy counseling center. He said the late-term procedures, which critics call "partial birth" abortions, should be banned, except in the case where the life of the mother was at stake. He said he would sign the ban regardless of whether it included exceptions for cases of rape or incest.

Russia Beefs Up Security

MOSCOW — Police in black bulletproof vests swarmed through crowded places in Moscow on Tuesday, challenging visitors to identify themselves after two explosions in five days killed more than 210 people in the Russian capital. Across the capital, soldiers swept apartment building basements and storehouses, searching or explosives like those suspected in the two apartment building blasts. Many officials have linked the apartment building blasts on Monday and last Thursday to the fighting in Dagestan. Muslim fighters from the region want to establish an independent Islamic state, and they have threatened attacks elsewhere in Russia.

Senators Give 'Silver Sewer'

WASHINGTON — Two days after Fox television's "Ally McBeal" won an Emmy for best comedy, the network was singled out by Sen. Joseph Lieberman and William Bennett for what they said were too many shows with vulgar, sexual content. Bennett and Lieberman — culture critics who for years have tried to persuade the music, TV and video game industries to produce more wholesome fare — gave Fox their third annual "Silver Sewer" award today. "Nothing seems too cheap or degrading to be played for a laugh," said Lieberman, D-Conn.

NEW YORK —Blue-chip stocks tumbled to-day after reports of strong retail sales and a soar-ing trade deficit reignited fears that interest rates will rise. The Dow Jones industrial average end-ed down 120.00 at 10.910.33. On the New York Stock Exchange, decliners led advancers 2,150-847. The Nasdaq Composite closed up 23.52 at 2668.29.





Elizabeth Fremd and izabeth Fremd and Janeie Hackett-Smith claimed that during the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 school years, two groups of fifth-grade students in the school district who had scored

who had scored exceptionally well on the state tests were barely able to read. The Eastern Elementary School students were simply not capable of performing in the classroom at a level anywhere near that which they had tested, the two tested the two terms and fackett-

tested, the two teachers said. Fremd and Hackett- Smith swed in Sheby Circuit Court in 1997. Circuit Court Judge William Stewart ruled that the two were not entitled to a jury trial under the state's "whistle-blower" statute. He did, however, agree to see what I2 community members would decide to see what I2 community members would be decided with Fremd and Hackett-Smith, saying they believed cheating occurred at Eastern Elementary on the statewide kipis text, and that

on the statewide KIRIS test, and that local officials did not investigate in good faith and covered up the cheating

Interestingly, while students from many other countries have become accustomed to receiving a public university education at little or no cost, U.S. students continue to accept the privatization of public universities as a natural, desirable development.

Even UK students face rapidly rising tuition rates and have put up no fight. Have we come to expect this?

Tuition rates across the nation have been rising dramatically since the early 1980s and there is no end in sight. While students are transient, passing through the institutions of higher education within the span of about four years, the administration, the Board of Trustees and the Council for Postsecondary Education

rest comfortably in their seats of power for much longer, as they dictate university policy. Indeed, UK's decision-making process has become too centralized, bureaucratic, self-interested and undemocratic, as evidenced by the dubious attempt to extend President Wethington's contract during the summer while most students were away. If only simple questions were asked, then surely we could find the answers. For instance, why do tuition rates continue to rise faster than inflation? Perhaps we should ask other questions: namely, to what extent do higher tuition rates subsidize research costs? Interestingly, transnational corporations have thus far provided a substantial portion of the newly allocated research money.

Will the tuition of students

Will undergraduate instruction suffer as a result of this realignment of priorities? Certainly the money collected from these higher tuition rates will go somewhere.
