The faculty met at the usual time and place those present being the President, Prof. J. G. White, Poyer, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Brooks, Mackenzie and Winford White.

The minutes of the last meeting were read rapidly. Pres. Patterson read a letter from Mr. T. V. Munson of Denison, Texas, making inquiry as to the conditions under which he might receive the degree of Ph.D. from this institution. After an informal discussion of the matter, it was ordered upon motion of Prof. Brooks that a com. be appointed to consider this matter and also the general question of conferring the Ph.D. degree by this college. The president appointed upon this committee Profs. Brooks, Mathews, Miller, Mackenzie and J. G. White.
