

Coach Sharon Fanning Begins
New Era at UK

Sharon Fanning brings to Kentucky not only an exceptional record, but also a national reputation as an outstanding coach, recruiter and motivator. In 11 memorable seasons at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, Fanning's squads compiled a 189-129 mark, including five straight Southern Conference championships from 1982-1986. In 1984, the Lady Mocs went 26-5 and were runners-up in the National Women's Invitational Tournament.

And while her teams were reaping glory for the school, Coach Fanning was receiving personal honors as well. She was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 and 1985 and was nominated for Kodak's national Coach of the Year honors in 1984. In 1986 she was coach of the North squad in the U.S. Olympic Festival and last summer she was named to the staff of the USA Select team competing in Seoul, Korea in August.

Fanning join us," UK Athletics Director Cliff Hagan says. "She has all the qualities we were looking for to fill this position. She is not only an outstanding coach, but she is also a fine person who will be a good role model for our young athletes. We believe that her personality and drive will give this program the boost it needs right now."


The 33-year-old Fanning, a native of Chatanooga, completed her undergraduate degree at UTC in 1975 while competing in both basketball and volleyball. She received her masters degree in 1976 from the University of Tennessee, where she served as a graduate assistant coach to Pat Head Summitt for one year before returning home to build a program at her alma mater.

A noted speaker who is very active in civic affairs, Fanning also served as Coordinator of Women's Athletics at UTC since 1978. She is a current member of the National Women's Basketball Coaches Association Board of Directors.

Andy Barnes

Andy begins his first year at Kentucky after serving as an assistant to Coach Susan Yow at Drake University last season. At UK, he will focus primarily on recruiting. A native of Johnson City, Tenn., and a 1980 graduate of East Tennessee State, Andy taught and coached at the high school level for six years before joining the staff at Drake. From 1980 to 1984, he was assistant boys' basketball coach and head golf coach at Daniel Boone High School in Gray, Tenn. He then taught for one year at Sun Valley High School in Monroe, N.C., before returning to his native state to teach and assist in boys' basketball at Unicoi County High School in Erwin. He is married to Marsha Barnes.

Cindy Noble Hauserman

Cindy's experience as a great player at all levels of competition made her an exciting addition to the Lady Kats staff. A two-time Olympian, Cindy joined the University of Kentucky for her first coaching job in August, 1985.

A native of Clarksburg, Ohio, Cindy began an outstanding playing career at FrankfortAdena High School, where she earned All-America honors and was named the Outstanding Athlete in Ohio. She went on to similar glory at the University of Tennessee, where she earned Kodak All-America honors before graduating in 1983.

In the meantime, she was also establishing herself as a great international competitor. She was selected to the 1979 World University squad, the 1980 Olympic team, the 1983 Pan American team and the 1984 Olympic squad. She also played professional basketball for one year in Italy and for two years in Japan.

Cindy, who was inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame last year, is married to Mark Hauserman.

Sue Stanley

Sue joined the UK training staff in 1982 after serving for one year as Co-Ordinator of Sports Medicine for the Department of Intramural/Recreational Services at East Carolina University. Sue graduated from Ohio State University, where she earned a degree in Physical Educa-

tion in 1979 after serving for four years as a student trainer. She was graduate assistant at Purdue University, where she earned her Masters Degree in Physical Fitness and Exercise Physiology in 1981.

A native of Smithville, Ohio, Sue serves on the Board of Directors for the National Athletics Trainers Association.

Lee Reedy

Lee joined the Lady Kat staff in December, 1983. She was previously employed by Bartholomew County Welfare Department and Columbus East High School in Columbus, Indiana. A native of Whitesburg, Ky., Lee is married to Bob Reedy and has two children.

Lee Youster

Lee has been assistant strength coach at Kentucky for three years. A 1980 graduate of Yankton College, he remained at his alma mater for two years as football and strength coach. He then served as a graduate assistant strength coach for two years at South Carolina and as an assistant strength coach at Oklahoma for one year before coming to Kentucky. Lee is 29 years old and single.

CLIFF HAGAN Director of Athletics



As Cliff Hagan enters his 12th year as its director, the University of Kentucky Athletics Association is undergoing an era of unprecedented growth.

Recently-completed projects include the \$6 million E.J. Nutter Football Training Facility, the Hilary J. Boone Indoor Tennis Center, the lighting of the Shively Baseball Field and the resurfacing and seating expansion of the Shively Track. In addition, the \$5.5 million Harry C. Lancaster Aquatics Center is nearing completion, bringing the total expenditures in capital expansion projects to nearly \$15 million.

This past July, the UK Athletics Association Board of Directors approved a record \$9.3 million budget for the 1987-88 fiscal year. In a time when many athletic departments are facing budget crises, UKAA continues to be totally self-supporting, with no tax dollars from the University's general funds.

Hagan, a native of Owensboro, replaced the late Harry C. Lancaster as athletics director on July 1, 1975. Since then, UK athletics has enjoyed a tremendous amount of success, both on the playing field and in the classroom.

Hagan has seen UK basketball teams win an NCAA championship, an NIT championship and make another appearance in the Final Four. The football Wildcats have appeared in three bowl games. Last season, six UK teams appeared in their respective NCAA championship events.

Academically, Hagan helped establish the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS). The University of Kentucky was the first university in the nation to open an academic center for student-athletes. The efforts have paid off, as UK led the Southeastern Conference last year in the number of student-athletes named to the league's various Academic Honor Rolls.

Hagan's involvement in college athletics extends beyond the University of Kentucky. He serves on the Executive Committee of the Southeastern Conference and is also on the

Executive Committee of the NCAA Division 1A Athletics Directors Association.

A two-time All-American basketball center at UK (1952, 54), Hagan helped the Wildcats win 86 of 91 games during his career. Included in his career is a 1951 national championship under legendary coach Adolph Rupp.

As a senior, Hagan helped lead UK to a perfect 25-0 record and the Southeastern Conference title. That season, Hagan averaged 29 points per game and led the nation in rebounding (13.5 rpg).

After graduating from UK in 1954 and serving two years at Andrews Air Force Base as a commissioned officer, Hagan began a highly successful National Basketball Association career with the St. Louis Hawks. In 10 seasons, he posted 12,433 career points in 672 games (18.5 ppg) and played in five NBA All-Star games.

Hagan played on St. Louis teams which claimed six division titles. In 1958, Hagan helped lead the Hawks to the World Championship by defeating the Boston Celtics. He also set a NBA single game record for most field goals in a quarter (12). Hagan was voted All-Pro from 1957-62.

Between basketball seasons at St. Louis, Hagan earned his M.S. degree from Washington University in 1958.

He also had a stint as player-coach of the Dallas Chapparals during his professional basketball days. In fact, Hagan was chosen as the Texas Professional Coach of the Year in 1968. His record at Dallas was 109-90. In 1975, Hagan was named to the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame. Three years later, he became the first UK player inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Hagan is married to the former Martha Milton of Owensboro. They have four children — Mrs. Lisa Thaxton, Mrs. Laurie Hill, Mrs. Amy Burdette and Kip, a recent graduate of Transylvania University.

PRESIDENT DAVID P. ROSELLE



Dr. David P. Roselle was named the ninth president of the University of Kentucky in March 1987.

Dr. Roselle comes to UK from Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va., where he served as provost four years. The position of provost at Virginia Tech is the number two administrative position at the university, which has more than 22,000 students.

A native of Pennsylvania, Dr. Roselle has a Ph.D. in mathematics from Duke University. He has been a mathematics professor and researcher at the University of Maryland and Louisiana State University. He became a professor of mathematics at Virginia Tech in 1974 and held that faculty appointment during his entire tenure there.

He also served as dean of Virginia Tech's graduate school and dean of research and graduate studies.

Dr. Roselle is known as an innovator. At Virginia Tech he implemented a university-wide core curriculum, helped secure increased support for sponsored research and was recognized nationally for his initiatives in computing and information systems.

In 1978, he was recognized by Virginia Tech for his teaching excellence.

Dr. Roselle has held a variety of leadership positions in national mathematics organizations and served as executive secretary of the Mathematical Association of America for nine years.

He has made numerous invited addresses in his field and is widely published as a mathematics scholar. He has been editor of two books and was on the editorial board of a third.

Dr. Roselle is married to the former Louise Dowling of Manhasset, N.Y., and they have a son, Arthur, 16, and a daughter, Cynthia, 15.

Meet the Players



Bebe Croley

One of the most talented players in Lady Kat history, Bebe is expected to be one of the top players in the Southeastern Conference this season and should be a strong contender for All-America honors. She led the Lady Kats in scoring last season with an average of 17.7 points a game, which ranked her fourth in that category among SEC players. She was also fourth in the SEC in free throw percentage (78.6), sixth in steals per game (2.6) and ninth in rebounding (7.1).

Bebe is 14th on the all-time Lady Kats scoring list with 937 career points, and if she keeps up her current pace, she should easily finish as one of UK's top five all-time

scorers.

A first-team Parade All-America as a senior at Henry Clay High School in Lexington, Bebe suffered a stress fracture as a freshman and played in only half of the games in her first year. But as a sophomore, she started in 22 of 27 games and was the fourth-leading scorer on the team.

Last year she began her junior season by being named the first unanimous MVP in the 10-year history of the Lady Kats Invitational tournament. She excelled in every phase throughout the season, starting in all 28 contests and scoring in double figures in all but three. During a two-game homecourt stint she hit 13-of-17 from the field and finished with a career-high 32 points against Alabama, and then scored 30 points on 14-for-17 from the field in the next game against Florida.

Bebe has twice represented the University and the USA in international competition. In 1985, she played for the U.S. in the Jones Cup competition in Taiwan and in 1986 she was a member of the USA Select team that competed in the Canadian Invitational.

After struggling with a severe knee problem as a freshman and sophomore, Michele finally enjoyed her first full season last year as a junior.. She played in 24 of the team's 28 games and, although she never received a starting assignment, finished as the Kats' fifth-leading scorer with an average of 4.6 points per contest.

Her outstanding high school career at Clearwater Central Catholic ended tragically

when Michele tore the anterior cruciate ligament of her left knee in the semifinals of the Florida state championship. She underwent extensive knee surgery before coming to Kentucky, and has necessitated arthroscopic surgery twice since.

A versatile player who could help at either guard or forward, Michele will be relied on for her exceptional scoring and passing ability this year.

Monique Taro

Monique possesses all the skills necessary to be a standout player at both ends of the court. Although she was recognized for her great scoring ability in high school, she has excelled more as a defensive player at Kentucky, displaying good speed, quickness and intensity.

Still, she can be an explosive scorer, and has hit double figures several times even though she has never appeared as a starter at Kentucky. Her career free throw percentage of 88.8 is a good indication of her shooting touch. She is a classic zone buster when her shot is "on."

Monique is regarded as one of the all-time great players in West Virginia high school history. As a senior at St. Francis High School, she was honored as West Virginia Player of the Year and was named to Parade magazine's fourth team All-America list. Her 2,835 career points in high school are the most ever scored by any male or female in that state. Her jersey, No. 14, has been retired at St. Francis.

A good junior season could bring Jodie SEC honors as well as national recognition. Last season, she was second on the team in assists and her 12.1 scoring average ranked her 20th in the SEC. She started in all 28 Lady Kats games and scored in double figures 19 times. A good outside shooter, she is expected to be an even better scoring threat with the new three-point goal this season.

A good athlete with great instincts for the game, Jodie began her college career in impressive fashion, being named to the Lady Kat Invitational all-tournament team only three games into her first season. She scored a career-high 29 points against Dayton that year and was ninth in the SEC in assists while averaging 10.9 points. In the summer of 1986, she played on the Gold medal-winning South squad in the U.S. Olympic Festival. This summer she played on the USA Junior Pro team that competed in the Jones Cup tournament in Taiwan.

At Austin High School, she became the alltime leading scorer in Indiana state girls' basketball history with 2,095 career points. She also holds the state record for points in a single season, with 789, which she scored during her senior season. She was named Indiana's "Miss Basketball" for 1985.





INDIANA INVADES; BEBE SCORES 1,000TH POINT

Senior forward Bebe Croley, who Monday night became the 11th player in Lady Kat history to reach the 1000-point plateau, leads an unbeaten Kentucky squad against a tough Indiana team tonight in the Coliseum. The game marks the end of a five-game, season-opening homestand. Friday, the Lady Kats make their first road trip to Bowling Green to challenge 12th-ranked Western Kentucky.

Croley, who scored 18 points in a 78-69 win over Tennessee Tech, now has 1,010 points, and needs only 14 points tonight to pass Sandy Harding and become the 10th all-time leading scorer at Kentucky. At her present scoring rate, Bebe could become UK's fourth all-time scorer by the end of her career.

Against Indiana, Kentucky won't have an easy time keeping its unbeaten record (4-0) intact. The Lady Hoosiers are 2-2, but losses came to No. 1 Tennessee and to Cincinnati in the Lady Bearcats' tournament. Since those losses, Coach Jorja Hoehn's squad won its own tournament, beating Marquette 79-47 and Middle Tennessee State 65-59.


Indiana is led by forward Cindy Bumgarner, who is averaging 18.2 points and 16.2 rebounds. The 6-2 forward is the only Lady Hoosier scoring in double figures this season.

The game will mark the return of former Lady Kat Nancy Cowan, who played at Kentucky during the 1984-85 season before transferring to Indiana. A native of Crown Point, Indiana, Cowan has seen limited action with Indiana this season.

Kentucky leads the series with IU 10-4, but has split the last four meetings. The Lady Kats won at Indiana last season, 63-61.

Mountain Girl Makes Big-City Impact

Debbie Hoskins is a young girl from the mountains of Eastern Kentucky who is already making a big-city impact both on the court and off at Kentucky. As a player at Harlan High School last season, Debbie led the Green Dragons to a 25-7 record and a berth in the state tournament, where she was named to the all-tournament team. That honor capped off a stellar high school career that produced 2,100 points, more than any other player has scored in Harlan County history. She was also named first-team all-state as a senior, after being chosen honorablemention all-state as a freshman, sophomore and junior.

"I have a lot of good memories from high school," Debbie says.

And she is now beginning to build memories for her college. Three games into her freshman season she is the sixth-leading scorer on the team with an average of 6.7 points a game. In the dramatic season-opener against Louisville, she was called on to perform under pressure, as three Kentucky starters were each tagged with their fourth fouls only three minutes into the second half. In 15 minutes of action, Debbie hit six of 11 shots and scored 12 points to help Kentucky pull away to a 98-77 victory.

"That was exciting," Debbie said.

And Debbie has turned heads off the court, too, with a flair for flashy, yet elegant dress that has generated many flattering comments. Earl Cox, the noted newspaper columnist and TV sports show host, recounts this story from the Girls' State Tournament in Bowling Green last spring:


"Debbie's team had been eliminated from play but came back to watch the rest of the games," Cox said. "When she walked into the gym, she had on a stunning dress and looked so striking that everyone in Diddle Arena quit watching the game so they could turn and look at her."

Debbie has modeled for local department stores in Harlan and continues to model occasionally as a hobby while pursuing her education at Kentucky. But right now, basketball and classes are taking up enough time, she says.

When Indiana takes the floor tonight, Debbie will be seeing very familiar faces. She had verbally committed to play basketball at Indiana in the spring before changing her mind and signing with the Lady Kats.

"I loved their coach (Jorja Hoehn) and the players and the campus," she said. "I really wanted to go there. But then I thought, 'It's six hours away from Harlan and I get homesick. Everybody at home wanted me to be a Lady Kat, too, and they knew they could follow me in the newspapers if I was playing here. I'm real happy with my decision now."

And so is everyone else, too...except maybe Indiana.

GYMNASTICS "EXCITE NITE" FRIDAY IN COLISEUM

What do you get when you combine Santa Claus, Mr. Peanut, 5,000 Wildcat fans, fabulous give-aways, celebrity guests, and the UK gymnastics squad? The answer is the Fourth Annual University of Kentucky Gymnastics Excite Nite.

When the idea was first conceived seven years ago to build interest in UK gymnastics, Excite Nite was a simple preseason exhibition. Now it's a fun-filled family event. Coach Leah Little has built the exhibition into a holiday extravaganza, which includes appearances by the 1987 National Champion Kentucky Wildcat Cheerleaders, Santa Claus, Champions Against Drugs and Begley's Beauty Board.

Several free prizes will be awarded, including a trip for two to Jamaica, a bookcase waterbed, a \$200 shopping spree, a video cassette recorder, and a weekend getaway for two at the Hyatt Regency.

The Lady Kats return seven gymnasts from the 1987 squad along with four freshmen. Senior cocaptain Robin Leggett returns as Kentucky's strongest vaulter, holding the Kentucky record with a 9.55 in the event. Leggett is coming off an impressive season last year, placing sixth in the vault at the Purina Cat Classic and scoring a 9.5 in vault at the Mideast Regionals.

Senior co-captain Kendall Lucas and sophomore Susu Seaman return to lead the Lady Kats on the uneven bars. Lucas currently holds the uneven bars record (9.55) and was a finalist in the event at the 1987 Purina Cat Classic. Seaman also recorded last season's highest all-around score, 37.3.

Little considers this year's squad to be the strongest beam team ever to compete for the Blue and White, as four gymnasts return in this event. Seaman, Lucas, Cindy Jasper, a former Ky. State Champion and Heather Kirk all return along with freshmen Aaron Aldrich who was the 1987 YMCA national beam and all-around champion, and Chris Wallat an elite gymnast from Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Kentucky's long-standing beam record is threatened by this year's group of talented gymnasts.

The floor exercise will continue to be Kentucky's forte in 1988 as junior Theresa Schneider and recordholder Lucas both return in this event. Jasper, Leggett and Diane Sill are expected to add depth to this event. All four freshmen, Aldrich, Wallat, Courtney Smith and Donna Oeffinger, will also be contributors in the floor exercise which should be the Lady Kats' most consistent event.

Little, who has guided UK gymnastics for 14 years, feels strongly about this season's squad and the growth of the Kentucky program.







Memorial Coliseum is the proud home of one of the richest basketball traditions in the world. The historic old Coliseum was the host site for 24 Wildcat basketball teams that yielded two national champions and 16 Southeastern Conference champions.

Since the Wildcats moved downtown to 23,000-seat Rupp Arena in 1976, the Coliseum has been the exclusive home of the Lady Kats. Throughout their 12 seasons in Memorial Coliseum, the Lady Kats have added an SEC title of their own and compiled a 148-47 record there.

The highlight of the Lady Kats' era in Memorial Coliseum came on Feb. 5, 1983. On that cold Saturday night, 10,622 enthusiastic fans filed into the 11,500-seat gymnasium to watch Kentucky upset fifth-ranked Old Dominion. That crowd constituted the largest crowd to have ever watched a women's college basketball game in America. Iowa broke the record last season with an amazing attendance of 22,000, but Kentuckians will long remember the excitement of that evening. The Lady

Kats were ranked fourth nationally after the Old Dominion victory, and in their three remaining home games that season they averaged 7,600 fans.

Just as their male counterparts did before them, the Lady Kats have made Memorial Coliseum the home of a winning high-class program. Among their many wins is included a 31-game homecourt victory streak in 1981-82

Plans for construction of the Coliseum began in 1941, when Dr. H. L. Donovan became president of the University and recommended a building "that will properly take care of our athletics, our health services, our physical education and our recreation.

The Coliseum was completed in 1950 at a cost of \$3,995,000. The huge building was dedicated to serve as a memorial to the nearly 10,000 Kentuckians who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean conflict. The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building.



At Kentucky, the emphasis is on excellence. Did you know that:

• UK EDUCATES ONE-THIRD OF THE COLLEGE

STUDENTS IN KENTUCKY

Enrollment on the University's campus in Lexington is 21,000, while 29,300 attend UK's 14 Community Colleges throughout the Commonwealth. That represents about one-third of all students attending public or private colleges, business schools and universities.

• INCOMING FRESHMEN ARE BEST IN STATE

The average ACT score of enrolled freshmen in the fall of 1987 was 22.4, the highest for any public university in the state and three points higher than the national average.

• FRESHMAN CLASS INCLUDES MERIT SCHOLARS AND VALEDICTORIANS

The 1987 freshman class includes twelve National Merit Scholars and 72 high school valedictorians. The class also includes eleven Singletary Scholars, whose average ACT score is 31.3 and one of whom had a 34 on the ACT. There are 384 freshmen this year who have ACT scores of 27 or higher — ranking them among the top 10 percent of freshmen in the nation

• UK STUDENTS ARE WINNING NATIONAL HONORS

UK debaters won the 1986 national championship. The student newspaper, The Kentucky Kernel, was voted one of the top four collegiate newspapers in the nation. Two architecture students placed first and second in a national design competition sponsored by the Institute for Architecture Education. • ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM IS GROWING

The University's academic scholarship program has grown from \$70,000 a year in 1983 to an amazing \$850,000 in 1987.

UK HAS REACHED TOP CATEGORY OF RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES

The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching classifies UK as a "Research I" institution, the only such institution in Kentucky and one of only 45 in the nation.

UK HAS ENTERED THE WORLD OF SUPERCOMPUTERS

The University is now one of only 17 universities in the nation to acquire a "supercomputer." UK's IBM 300E supercomputer should be operational in early 1988. The new equipment, which will attract much more research funding and grants, will also be made available to undergraduate students, a rarity at any university.

• The College of Education's reading program faculty was judged one of the nation's ten best.


• The cancer research program at UK has been further enhanced by two new modern facilities for treatment and re-


