PREFACE

The Inventory of Federal Archives in the States, is one of the products of the work of the Survey of Federal Archives, which operated as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration from January 1, 1936 to June 30, 1937, and has been continued in Kentucky since that date as a state project of that Administration.

The plan for the organization of the Inventory is as follows: Series I consists of reports on the administration of the Survey, acknowledgments, and general discussions of the location, condition, and content of federal archives in the states. Succeeding series contain the detailed information secured by workers of the Survey, in inventory form, a separate series number being assigned to each of the executive departments (except the Department of State) and other major units of the Federal Government. Within each series No. 1 is a general introduction to the field organization and records of the governmental agency concerned; the succeeding numbers contain the inventory proper, separate numbers being assigned to each state in alphabetical order. Thus, in each series, the inventory for Alabama is No. 2, that for Arizona No. 3, that for Arkansas No. 4, etc.

For each local office information regarding each series, or unit of related records, is presented in the following order: title, inclusive dates ("to date" indicating an open file at the time the information was secured), general description of informational content, description of the system of filing or indexing (if any), a statement of frequency and purpose of use, form of the record itself (bound volumes, sheets in folders, etc.), linear footage, description of the containers, physical condition of the records (not stated if satisfactory), location by room number or other identifying information, and finally, the number of the Form 58SA on which this information was originally recorded by a Survey worker and from which it was abstracted for the Inventory. This form is on file in The National Archives. When it contains substantial information on addenda sheets which has not been included in the mimeographed abstract, indication of this is given by use of the reference "Soe addenda."

In Kentucky the work of the Survey was undertaken by Judge Samuel C. Williams, with Mr. John Wilson Townsend as his assistant, from its inception until October 1936. Since that time Mr. Townsend has been in charge of the project. This Inventory of the records of the Department of the Navy in Kentucky was prepared in the Louisville office of the Survey and was edited before final typing by Dr. Henry P. Beers of the Division of Navy Department Archives of The National Archives. It is reproduced in mimeographed form through the facilities of the Historical Records Survey.

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ASHLAND

NAVY RECRUITING SUBSTATION
Post Office Bldg., 17th and Winchester Ave.

This office was established in July 1936, being located in its present quarters. It is under the direction of the main station at Louis-ville of the Central Recruiting Division to which office all reports are submitted.

LEXINGTON

NAVY RECRUITING SUBSTATION Post Office and Court House

This agency is one of four substations in Kentucky which function under the main station at Louisville, which is under the jurisdiction

of Central Recruiting Division.

The area of jurisdiction for this substation consists of the following twenty-seven counties: Anderson, Bath, Bourbon, Boyle, Casey, Clark, Estill, Franklin, Fleming, Fayette, Garrard, Harrison, Jessamine, Jackson, Lincoln, Lee, Madison, Mercer, Menifee, Montgomery, Micholas, Powell, Robertson, Rockcastle, Scott, Wolfe, and Woodford.

The Lexington office was opened in the tower room of the old Post Office Building, at the corner of Main and Walnut Sts., on December 31, 1925. It remained in the tower until May 8, 1926, when it was moved to Room No. 304. It was removed to its present quarters in the new Federal Building, corner of N. Limestone and Barr Sts., on December 21, 1934.

Very few records have been accumulated in this office. Regarding its policy of sending them to bureau headquarters, this is done by request of Washington, and they are sent through the Louisville office. At different intervals this agency has been temporarily closed,

opening again when its quota called for more recruits.

LOUISVILLE

NAVY RECRUITING SUBSTATION
Post Office and Custom House, Broadway, 6th to 7th Sts.

This substation was first established in the Post Office Building, Leth and Chestnuts Sts., on December 9, 1905. A later location was in the McDowell Building at Third and Walnut Streets. It was moved to its present quarters in the New Port Office and Custom House on November 21, 1932. Since the survey was made, all records which were stored in Room 24 were destroyed by the flood waters of the Ohio River in January 1937. All records are kept on file for a period of two years and then, upon authority from Washington, those so authorized are destroyed.
