has indeed been very ill, & is still very
weak & exhausted - & on the last frt.
night I have been very disturbed & anxious,
for at one time it seemed as if I might
lose her. But the doctors declare the fever
to have been but a mild attack, which
in her case has tried her the more be-
cause, unfortunately, she had so resolute
a struggle to pull back again, having been
very

very weak & run down since the birth of
our baby some six months ago. She has
been very ill the last day or two,
however, she has pulled up wonderfully,
& is now considered quite out of
danger. ~~although the chances of~~
~~her getting~~ So I feel that perhaps
by next Wednesday it would not be unwise
for me to try & feel happy once more.

I showed her your pink Kite letter & she
said I must certainly go. But I fear
the number of people from the anxiety
of the last fortnight has profited me
