Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 11, 1984.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 1 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Tuesday, December 11, 1984 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Roll Called

Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 1 p.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Thomas P. Bell.

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Robert T. McCowan (Chairman), Mr. Thomas P. Bell, Mr. William R. Black, Professor Timothy A. Cantrell, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler (Honorary Trustee), Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. Timothy B. Freudenberg, Mr. Ronald G. Geary, Mr. George W. Griffin, Jr. (Secretary), Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Henry E. Hershey, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, Mr. R. Larry Jones, Professor James D. Kemp, Mr. T. A. Lassetter, Mr. W. Bruce Lunsford, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. James L. Rose, Mr. Bobby Watson, and Professor Constance P. Wilson. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Mr. James O. King, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher, and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. David I. Carter, Associate Vice President for Business Services; Mr. Edward A. Carter, Associate Vice President for Planning and Budget; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; Mr. Henry Clay Owen, Controller and Treasurer; Dr. Paul G. Sears, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School; and Dr. Jack C. Blanton, Vice Chancellor for Administration, Lexington Campus.

Members of the various news media were also in attendance. The Secretary reported all members present, and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 1:04 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion made by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones, and passed, the Minutes of the October 16, 1984 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees were approved as written.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary called attention to his monthly report, copies of which were distributed earlier and suggested that the Trustees might wish to read it at their leisure. He then recommended that the report be accepted and, without objection, it was so ordered.

President Singletary made three announcements which were not included in his monthly report: (1) reminded the Board members of the annual University Senate party today from 4:00 to 6:00 at the Alumni House and encouraged the Trustees to attend; (2) announced that the Kentucky Rhodes Scholarship Selection Committee would meet this evening and that the eight candidates would be interviewed tomorrow from which no more than two could be selected to represent the Kentucky District at the Great Lakes District Committee in Chicago; and (3) announced that two meetings of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on the University of Kentucky/University of Louisville Merger have been scheduled: Wednesday, December 19, 1984 at 11:00 a.m. in the Old Board Room, Administration Building, and the second meeting has been scheduled immediately following the meeting of the Executive Committee on January 22, 1985. He added that additional sessions will be scheduled in order to provide an opportunity for various groups/individuals, as well as Board members, to make known their views.

D. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

After noting that the personnel actions in PR 2 were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended its approval. On motion made by Professor Cantrell, seconded by Mr. Freudenberg, and passed, the appointments and staff changes recommended in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3A)

President Singletary recommended that G. Kendell Rice be named Director of Admissions, effective January 7, 1985. He then called on Chancellor Gallaher who reviewed Dr. Rice's experience and credentials and said that he was pleased to endorse President Singletary's recommendation that Dr. Rice be appointed Director of Admissions. Mr. Geary so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Rose and unanimously carried. (See PR 3A at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Recommendation on Central Administration (PR 3B)

President Singletary recommended that the position title of Director of University Computing be changed to Associate Vice President for Information Systems Planning and Policy and Director of the University Computing Center. He further recommended that the title of Dr. J. Robert Heath be changed from Director of University Computing to Associate Vice President for Information Systems Planning and Policy and Director of the University Computing Center. He explained that the change in title clarifies the fact that this position is assigned both University-wide and sector responsibilities. President Singletary expressed his appreciation for the good job being done by Dr. Heath. He then asked Dr. Heath to stand and be recognized following which he was given a round of applause. Mr. Rose so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and unanimously carried. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

G. 1984-85 Budget Revisions (PR 3C)

With President Singletary so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Black, seconded by Professor Wilson, and carried, the proposed routine revisions in the 1984-85 budget were authorized and approved. (See PR 3C at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 3D-1 and PR 3D-2)

Mr. Larry Jones moved that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations which were received by the Board for preliminary consideration at the September 1984 and October 1984 meetings (PR 3D-1 and PR 3D-2, respectively) be approved. Mr. Jones' motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and passed without dissent. (See PR 3D-1 and PR 3D-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

Candidates for Degrees - Lexington Campus and Medical Center (PR 3E)

Without discussion, Mr. Hershey moved that the President be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name was listed in PR 3E the correct degree to which he or she is entitled. His motion was seconded by Mr. Freudenberg and passed unanimously. (See PR 3E at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Acceptance of Gift from Marion Thomas Brooks Estate (PR 3F)

President Singletary indicated his pleasure in recommending that the Board accept the gift of \$644,262.24 from the estate of Marion Thomas Brooks, a 1922 alumnus of UK's College of Agriculture. He explained that Board policy requires gifts in excess of \$100,000 be accepted by the Board of Trustees. Professor Kemp so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Watson and unanimously carried. (See PR 3F at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Report on Gifts and/or Grants (PR 3G)

The report on gifts and/or grants covering the period from July 1, 1984 to September 30, 1984 was accepted and ordered made a matter of record as recommended in PR 3G. (See PR 3G at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Announcement of New Humanities Program for Education Students

President Singletary announced that the University has received a \$142,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities which will enable the Honors Program and the College of Education to begin a cooperative program for the teaching of humanities to students majoring in secondary education. He added that the three-year grant would enable more education majors to become involved in the Honors Program for outstanding students. President Singletary then introduced Dr. Raymond Betts, Director of the Honors Program, and Dr. Edgar L. Sagan, Dean of the College of Education. Dr. Betts stated that the NEH grant shows the significance of the Honors Program to the

University in particular and to the State at large, and further emphasizes the University's commitment to humanities instruction within the Commonwealth.

M. Candidates for Degrees - Community College System (PR 4A)

Mrs. Hayes moved that the degrees and certificates specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed. Her motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and passed unanimously. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Naming of University Building (PR 5A-1)

President Singletary indicated his pleasure in recommending that the Board of Trustees approve the name THE GAINES CENTER FOR THE HUMANITIES for the new Center for the Undergraduate Studies in the Humanities.

President Singletary again expressed his appreciation for the many contributions of Mr. and Mrs. John R. Gaines. Mrs. Gaines was present, and President Singletary asked her to stand and be recognized following which she was given a round of applause.

On motion made by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Brereton Jones and carried, approval was given to the naming of the new Center for the Undergraduate Studies in the Humanities THE GAINES CENTER FOR THE HUMANITIES. (See PR 5A-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Naming of University Building (PR 5A-2)

President Singletary said it also gave him much pleasure to recommend that the Board approve the name HARRY C. LANCASTER ACQUATICS CENTER for the new acquatics center on the Lexington Campus. He pointed out that the University of Kentucky Athletics Association Board of Directors initiated the recommendation which, in turn, was forwarded to the Committee for Naming University Buildings. Mr. Ramsey so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Watson and unanimously carried.

President Singletary introduced Mr. Lancaster saying, "He is a wonderful man whom we have all known and loved". He continued, "His contributions to the athletics programs at the University through service as both coach and athletics director are well known". Mr. Lancaster was asked to stand and be recognized, following which he was given a round of applause. (See PR 5A-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Patent Assignment (PR 5B)

On motion made by Mr. Griffin, seconded by Mr. Black and passed, the routine patent assignment as recommended in PR 5B was approved. (See PR 5B at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Appointments to University of Kentucky/Business Partnership Foundation (PR 5C)

Upon motion duly made, seconded, and carried, approval was given to the appointment of Mr. Roger E. Mick and Mr. James L. Rose to the Board of Directors of the University of Kentucky/Business Partnership Foundation for four-year terms beginning January 1, 1985 and ending December 31, 1988. (See PR 5C at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Appointments to University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation (PR 5D)

With President Singletary so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones, and passed, approval was given to the appointment of the following to membership on the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation for four-year terms:

Mr. Clay moved approval of the appointments as listed in PR 5E. His motion was seconded by Mr. Farmer and passed unanimously. (See PR 5E at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Resolution of Appreciation of Contributions of Mr. Maxwell H. Gluck

Mr. Clay recommended and so moved that a resolution be prepared and sent to Mrs. Maxwell H. Gluck in appreciation of the contributions made by Mr. Maxwell H. Gluck to the Equine Research program at the University of Kentucky. Mr. Clay's motion was seconded by Mr. Farmer and it was so ordered.

U. Appointments to the Mining and Minerals Trust Fund Board of Trustees

Mr. McCowan announced the reappointment of Mr. George W. Griffin and Mr. Frank Ramsey to the Mining and Minerals Trust Fund Board of Trustees for two-year terms ending December 31, 1986. These appointments were made in accordance with HB 722 passed by the 1982 General Assembly.

V. Interim Financial Reports (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Committee had met on the morning of December 11, 1984 and reviewed the eight items to be presented for action, the first of which was the interim financial report for the four months ended October 31, 1984 and the summary report of revenues and expenditures of the University of Kentucky Research Foundation for the three months ended September 30, 1984. After noting that the University is "on target," Mr. Clay moved acceptance of the reports. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin, and it was so ordered. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Disposal of Personal Property (FCR 2)

On motion made by Mr. Clay, and seconded by Mr. Brereton Jones, the Board approved the disposition of obsolete and surplus equipment as recommended in FCR 2. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

X. Disposal of Surplus Property (FCR 3)

With the concurrence of the Finance Committee, Mr. Clay moved that the University declare as surplus four temporary buildings at Somerset Community College and that the Vice Chancellor for Administration be authorized to dispose of these buildings and directed to execute, on behalf of the University, any and all contracts, deeds, and other documents deemed necessary to consummate the transaction. Mr. Clay's motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

Y. Capital Construction Report (FCR 4)

Mr. Clay moved that the capital construction report for the three months ending September 30, 1984 be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Rose, and it was so ordered. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

Z. Report on Leases (FCR 5)

Noting that none of the three leases in FCR 5 exceeded \$20,000 in value, Mr. Clay moved that the Board accept the report as recommended. The motion was seconded by Mr. Black, and it was so ordered. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

AA. Designation of Depository Bank (FCR 6)

Mr. Clay reminded the Trustees that in accordance with House Bill 622 enacted by the 1982 General Assembly, the Board must designate depository banks serving the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporation. He then moved that the Board designate the Citizens State Bank, Owensboro, Kentucky, to serve as a depository bank. Mr. Clay's motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See FCR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

BB. Agreement with Julius Marks Board of Directors (FCR 7)

Mr. Clay stated that the next item on the agenda was a proposed agreement with the Board of Directors of the Julius Marks Home. He called on Chancellor Bosomworth who emphasized the value of the nursing home for education programs of the University.

Mr. Louis E. Hillenmeyer III, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Julius Marks Home, emphasized the close working relationship in the past between the Julius Marks Nursing Home and the University, and emphasized the need for a new facility. He pointed out that a location on the University campus would meet their patient care needs and certainly improve the ability to establish a stronger relationship with the University. The facility would be built by the Julius Marks Corporation and they would be responsible for the patient care function. The University would be concerned with the educational aspect of the program.

Following discussion, Mr. Clay stated that he wished to amend the recommendation in FCR 7 to read as follows:

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize the President of the University or his designated representative to negotiate and execute an agreement with the Board of Directors of the Julius Marks Home (a not-for-profit corporation) to lease approximately four acres of land on the southcentral campus of the University of Kentucky to allow construction of a teaching/nursing home in support of the teaching, research, and patient care needs of the University of Kentucky Medical Center, with said agreement to be approved by the Finance Committee and by the Board of Trustees prior to execution.

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the amended agreement with Julius Marks Board of Directors was authorized. (See FCR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

CC. Execution of Deed and Agreement of Easement (FCR 8)

The Finance Committee so recommending, Mr. Clay moved that, in connection with the purchase of 314 Rose Lane, Lexington, Kentucky, the Board authorize the execution of a deed and agreement of easement whereby the University will construct a parking lot on said property for University uses during normal business hours but will grant exclusive use of said property, for parking purposes, at night and on weekends to the Roman Catholic Bishop Diocese of Covington in connection with the operation of the Newman Center. He explained that the property is sorely needed for parking in connection with the William B. Sturgill Development Building and that joint use of the property will facilitate its acquisition.

On motion made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Rose and passed, approval was given to the execution of a deed and agreement of easement as recommended in FCR 8. (See FCR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

DD. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Geary, Chairman of the Investment Committee, recommended that the report of changes in investments for the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the three months ended September 30, 1984 be accepted. Mrs. Hayes so moved. Her motion was seconded by Mr. Ramsey, and it was so ordered. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

EE. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:05 p.m.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky (March 1983), which were received by the Board of Trustees for preliminary consideration at its September 1984 meeting, be approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

Amendment #1 - Change Part I.B, first paragraph, to read:

The University of Kentucky Community College System consists of a system of community colleges located in various parts of the state at points established by statute (KRS 164.591; 164.593). KRS 164.580 directs that each community college shall provide: (1) a general two-year academic curriculum with credits transferable to two-year and four-year colleges and universities; (2) technical and semi-professional programs of two years or less; and (3) within a two-year college curriculum, courses in general education, including adult education, not necessarily intended for transfer nor technically oriented.

Rationale: This amendment inserts an important phrase contained in KRS 164.580 which previously had been omitted unintentionally in the early development of the Governing Regulations.

Amendment #2 - Delete second paragraph of Part I.B:

[The Community College System also includes the Lexington Technical Institute operated as authorized by KRS 164.125.]

Rationale: At its meeting on December 13, 1983, the Board of Trustees approved the name change of Lexington Technical Institute to Lexington Community College, effective July 1, 1984. Hence, this paragraph previously providing clarification about an institution without "Community College" as part of its name is no longer needed.

Amendment #3 - Change Part II.A.2, first paragraph, first sentence and the parenthetical expression at the end of the paragraph, to read:

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky consists of sixteen competent citizens of Kentucky appointed by the Governor, three members of the [teaching] faculty of the University (two from the University System and one from the Community College System) who shall have the right to vote on all matters except that of faculty compensation, and one member of the student body of the University of Kentucky. ...(KRS 164.130 as amended by the General Assembly [in 1972 and 1980])

Rationale: This amendment in the Governing Regulations is necessary because of the amendment in Section 1 of KRS 164.130 which was approved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky on March 2, 1984.

Amendment #4 - Change Part II.A.2, third paragraph, first part, to read:

The two faculty members representing the University System of the University of Kentucky shall be [teaching or research] members of the faculty of the University System of the rank of assistant professor or above, elected by secret ballot by all faculty members of the rank of assistant professor or above in the University System. Faculty members shall serve for terms of three years and until their successors are elected and qualify. They are eligible for re-election but are ineligible to continue to serve as members of the Board if they cease to be members of the [teaching staff] faculty of the University System.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #3.

Amendment #5 - Change Part IV, fifth paragraph, second sentence, to read:

In academic years beginning with an even number (e.g., 1982-1983, 1984-1985), this group shall be composed of the following: Chancellor for the Medical Center, Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School, Director of Libraries, [Associate] Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Lexington Campus, and Deans of the Colleges of Allied Health Professions, Architecture, Communications, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Law, and Social Work.

Rationale: When the appointment of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Lexington Campus was approved by the Board of Trustees on March 6, 1984, effective immediately, the position of Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Lexington Campus was discontinued and the responsibilities of the Associate Vice Chancellor's position were transferred to the Vice Chancellor's position.

Amendment #6 - Change Part IV, sixth paragraph, first sentence, to read:

The ex officio non-voting membership shall include the President, all lother; vice presidents, [Dean of Admissions and] <u>University</u> Registrar, Dean of University Extension, Dean of Students, <u>Professor</u> of Military Science, Professor of Aerospace Studies, and, if they are not already

elected members of the Senate, the University System faculty members of the Board of Trustees, the Academic Ombudsman, and the chairmen of the University Senate Committees, including University Senate Advisory Committees.

Rationale: Through an administrative reorganization, the functions previously handled by the position of Dean of Admissions and Registrar have been reassigned to the positions of University Registrar and Director of Admissions. In view of this organizational change, the University Senate Council has recommended this proposed amendment. The deletion of "other" is a needed editorial change since all vice presidents are included in the ex officio non-voting membership.

Amendment #7 - Change Part IV, ninth paragraph, second sentence, to read:

The [Dean of Admissions and] <u>University</u> Registrar shall serve as ex officio secretary.

Rationale: Refer to first two sentences of rationale for Amendment #6.

Amendment #8 - Change Part IV, twelfth paragraph, third function, to read:

Adopt policies for the University System academic calendar and approve the annual calendar as prepared by the [Dean of Admissions and] University Registrar.

Rationale: Refer to first two sentences of rationale for Amendment #6.

Amendment #9 - Change Part V, second paragraph, first four sentences, to read:

The elected faculty membership shall consist of and represent proportionately the full-time faculty in the various community colleges land the technical institute, except that no college [or the technical institute] shall have fewer than three senators. Moreover, each community college [and the technical institute] shall elect an additional senator for each twenty-five (or major traction thereof) full-time taculty members above the first twenty-five. At least one of the three senators shall have responsibility in the occupational program area and at least one shall have responsibility in the general education areal, except for the senators from the technical institute. The faculty of each community college [and the technical institute] shall nominate candidates for senator(s) and elect the senator(s) by secret ballot during the month of April preceding the term of office beginning on August 15.

Rationale: On December 13, 1983, the Board of Trustees approved the name change of Lexington Technical Institute to Lexington Community College, effective July 1, 1984. As a result of this, there is not presently any technical institute in the Community College System.

Amendment #10 - Change Part V, third paragraph, first sentence, to read:

The ex officio membership shall include the Chancellor for the Community College System, the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Community College System, the chairman of each advisory committee to the Senate, and the president of the student body at each community college [or technical institute].

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #11 - Change Part V, tourth paragraph, tirst sentence, to read:

The appointed membership shall consist of three community college [or technical institute! directors and three other administrators, each of whom shall be appointed by the Chancellor for the Community College System.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #12 - Change Part V, eighth paragraph, first part of first sentence, to read:

The Community College Council shall be composed of one duly elected senator from each college [or the technical institute] to serve a two-year term; ...

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #13 - Change Part V, thirteenth paragraph, seventh function, to read:

Recommending to the President all candidates for degrees and certificates from the community colleges [and the technical institute]. The Senate may delegate this function to the faculties of the community colleges [and the technical institute].

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #14 - Change Part VI, first paragraph, fourth sentence, to read:

The [Dean of Admissions and] <u>University</u> Registrar shall be secretary of the Assembly and shall be responsible for adequate notice of meetings, including a statement of subject or subjects to be discussed.

<u>Rationale</u>: Refer to the first two sentences in the rationale for <u>Amendment</u> #6.

Amendment #15 - Change Part VII.A.1, fourth paragraph, tirst sentence, to read:

The Honors Program is an educational unit which is equivalent to a department and administratively responsible to the [Associate] Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Lexington Campus.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #5.

Amendment #16 - Change Part VII.A.1, eleventh paragraph, to read:

The individual community colleges [and the Lexington Technical Institute] are the major educational units of the Community College System. The chief administrative officer of a community college [or the Lexington Technical Institute] is a director.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #17 - Change Fart VII.A.5, second paragraph, last part, to read:

...The academic or scholastic requirements of a school may exceed, but not be lower than, those established by the college faculty. Any such differences in standards must be approved by the University Senate.

Rationale: This change is needed for consistency with Part VII.A.4 and has been recommended by the University Senate Council.

Amendment #18 - Change Part VII.A.6, fourth paragraph, to read:

The academic or scholastic requirements of a department may exceed, but not be lower than, those of the school and/or college of which the department is a part. Any such differences in standards must be approved by the University Senate.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1/.

Amendment #19 - Change Part IX, tootnote, to read:

Includes departments, schools, graduate centers, institutes, interdisciplinary units, colleges, and individual community colleges, and the Lexington Technical Institute.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #20 - Change Part XI.B, first paragraph, first part, to read:

The non-academic relationships between University System students on the Lexington Campus and Lexington [Technical Institute] Community College students and the University are covered in the document entitled, Student Rights and Responsibilities. Part I. ...

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #21 - Change Part XI.B, third paragraph, first sentence, to read:

Copies of the document, Student Rights and Responsibilities. Parts I and II, shall be made available to all students in the University System and the Lexington [Technical Institute] Community College.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #22 - Change Part XI.B, fourth paragraph, to read:

The non-academic relationships between Community College System students, excepting Lexington [Technical Institute] Community College students, and the University are covered in the document entitled Code of Student Conduct: Rules, Procedures, and Responsibilities, which has been adopted by the Board of Trustees and may be amended only by that body. The academic relationships between Community College System students, including Lexington [Technical Institute] Community College students, and the University are defined in the Rules of the Senate of the Community College System (Section I, Student Academic Affairs). These rules have been adopted and may be amended by the Senate of the Community College System.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #23 - Change Part XI.B, fifth paragraph, first sentence, to read:

Copies of the documents discussed in the preceding paragraph shall be made available to all Community College System students, including Lexington [Technical Institute] Community College students.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #9.

Amendment #24 - Change Part X.C.5.b.(1), second sentence, to read:

Group I personnel, as defined in the retirement program, who are totally disabled are entitled to six months' sick leave with pay after which the [Total Disability Benefits Plan] Long Term Disability Plan, for which [premiums are paid by] the University pays the full cost, becomes operative.

Rationale: This amendment is consistent with the content of FCR 2 which was approved by the Board of Trustees on September 15, 1981.

Amendment #25 - Change Part X.C.12, including title, to read:

12. [Total Disability Insurance] Employee Disability Program

After the completion of one year of employment at the University, regular full-time faculty and staff other than those covered by Civil Service are covered by the [Total Disability Insurance] Employee Disability Program. This program provides income protection through linsurance coverage with TIAA] Long Term Disability Plan and, in some

cases, supplemental benefits by the University. The University pays the full cost of this program.

Rationale: This amendment is consistent with the content of FCR 2 which was approved by the Board of Trustees on September 15, 1981.

Amendment #26 - Change Part I.A, section (1)(a) under 164.125, to read:

(a) Upon approval of the Council on Higher Education, associate and baccalaureate programs of instruction;

Rationale: This amendment incorporates modified wording in KRS 164.125 approved by the General Assembly, effective June 17, 1978.

Amendment #27 - Change Part IV, third paragraph, first sentence, to read:

The 85 elected faculty members shall be apportioned each spring among the colleges and the University Libraries according to the following two equally weighted factors based on data for the preceding fall semester: (1) the number of full-time [teaching and/or research] faculty, except those appointed in the extension series (although they are eligible for election to membership), research title series, [or] and visiting series, with the rank of assistant professor or higher in the college or the University Libraries; and (2) the number of full-time students enrolled in the college, computed so that students enrolled in the Graduate School shall be assigned to the college in which they are pursuing their studies.

Rationale - This amendment is based on a recommendation from the University Senate to President Singletary (October 12, 1983).

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky (March 1983), which were received by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees for preliminary consideration at its October 1984 meeting, be approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

Amendment #1 - Change Part VII.A.4, third paragraph, to read:

Consistent with the Governing Regulations, the Administrative Regulations, and the Rules of the University Senate, the faculty of each college shall establish its own rules, including a committee or council structure necessary for the performance of the faculty's functions. After approval of these by the appropriate chancellor, copies of the rules of the faculty and a description of its committee structure shall be made available to its members and [a copy] copies filed with the secretary of the University Senate and the Senate Council Office.

Rationale: This amendment is related to a memorandum from President Singletary to Academic Vice Presidents, Deans, Directors, and Chairmen dated April 2, 1974, on the subject of establishing rules of procedure and structures of committees and/or councils in educational units. Since the date of this memorandum, documents dealing with rules of procedure and organizational structures for educational units have been forwarded through regular approval channels to the Office of the President for final approval. In view of the reorganization of the University of Kentucky effective July 1, 1982, this delegation of authority to the appropriate chancellor for final approval of such documents is consistent with placing responsibility for operating decisions closer to the educational units of the University.

Amendment #2 - Change Part VII.A.5, second paragraph, first part, to read:

Within the limits established by the regulations of the Board of Trustees, the policies and rules of the University Senate, and the policies and rules of the faculty of the college of which it is a unit, the faculty of a school shall determine the educational policies of the school. It shall be responsible for functions and duties assigned to it by the faculty of

the college. For these purposes, it shall establish its own rules and determine its own committee structure. After approval of these by the dean of the college and the chancellor, copies of the rules and a description of its committee structure shall be made available to its members and a copy filed with the college of which it is a unit. ...

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1.

Amendment #3 - Change Part VII.A.6, second paragraph, first part, to read:

The departmental faculty has jurisdiction, with the approval of the dean and the appropriate chancellor or chancellor's designee, over matters concerning its internal educational policies, insofar as these do not conflict with those of other departments or with the rules of the University Senate or the faculties of the school or college of which the department is a part. It should hold regularly scheduled meetings and is authorized, with the approval of the dean of the college and the appropriate chancellor, to establish rules for procedure and a committee structure to deal with matters over which it has jurisdiction, copies being filed with the secretary (secretaries) of the school and/or college of which the department is a member. ...

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1.

Amendment #4 - Change Part VII.A.8.a, third paragraph, to read:

Consistent with the Governing Regulations, the Administrative Regulations, and the Rules of the Senate of the Community College System, the faculty of each community college shall establish its own rules, including an organizational structure necessary for the performance of the faculty's functions. After approval of these by the Chancellor for the Community College System, copies of the rules of the faculty and a description of the faculty's committee structure shall be made available to faculty members and a copy filed with the Office of the Chancellor for the Community College System.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1.

Amendment #5 - Change Part VII.A.8.b, second paragraph, to read:

The rules of the Faculty Assembly of a community college shall be consistent with the Governing Regulations, the Administrative Regulations, and the Rules of the Senate of the Community College System and shall be adequate to allow the Assembly to perform its responsibilities. Copies of the rules shall be submitted to the director of the college, the Community College Council, and the Chancellor for the Community College System for review and approval before being made operational.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1.

Amendment #6 - Change Part VII.A.8.c, second paragraph, first part, to read:

The division faculty, with the approval of the director and the Chancellor for the Community College System, I has the responsibility for internal policies of the division, insofar as these policies do not conflict with those of other divisions, with the rules of the faculty of the college of which it is a part, or with the Rules of the Senate of the Community College System. It should hold regularly scheduled meetings and is authorized, with the approval of the director of the college and the Chancellor for the Community College System, to establish rules for procedure and a committee structure to deal with matters for which it has responsibility.

Rationale: Same as that for Amendment #1.

Acceptance of Gift from Marion Thomas Brooks Estate

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees accept the gift of \$644,262.24 from the Marion Thomas Brooks Estate.

Background: Marion Thomas Brooks graduated from U.K. in 1922 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture. He and his wife, Elinor Messer Brooks, resided in Birmingham, Alabama where Mr. Brooks was a successful landscape architect. According to the terms of his will, the University's bequest is to be divided as follows: "Eighty percent (80%) is to be used for payment of all or part of the cost of erection of one or more permanent structures at said University, as the governing body of said University shall, in its sole discretion, direct. I suggest (without requiring) that a building, entrance gates, a carillon, a fountain and a pool would be appropriate structures. I direct that a suitable bronze plaque bearing the inscription, "In memory of Elinor Messer Brooks and Marion Thomas Brooks, Birmingham, Alabama", shall be affixed to said structure or structures. A recommendation will be made subsequently on the use of the eighty percent. Twenty percent (20%) is to be used for the establishment of a scholarship trust fund for the benefit of students who are academically qualified, in need of financial assistance, domiciled in Northern Kentucky, and enrolled or attempting to enroll for classes at said University. Said share shall be known as "The Marion Thomas Brooks Memorial Scholarship Fund", in perpetuity. The principal of said trust shall be invested, and the income from said trust shall be used for granting scholarships or for reinvestment."

Under the policy adopted by the Board of Trustees on November 19, 1965, gifts in excess of \$100,000 are required to be accepted by the Board of Trustees.

Background: John R. Gaines, thoroughbred breeder and owner of Gainesway Farm in Lexington, has an outstanding record of public service in the horse industry, in the state, and in the community. He is a director of the National Museum of Racing; the Kentucky Economic Development Council; Keeneland Association; a former trustee of the University of Kentucky; and a curator of Transylvania University. Both the Kentucky Horse Park and the new Breeders' Cup Series were established under Mr. Gaines' leadership.

However, it is Mr. Gaines' love of the arts and humanities which has caused this action today. Mr. Gaines is actively involved in the art world as an authority and a collector. He is a director of the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.; the Fogg Museum at Harvard University; the Morgan Library in New York City; and the University of Kentucky Art Museum. Last year the establishment of the Joan B. and John R. Gaines Fellowships in the Humanities gave life and momentum to the innovative concept of concentrated undergraduate study of the humanities at a major public university. The center is now in operation even as its new quarters are being renovated. It is indeed fitting to commemorate these contributions by naming the new humanities center THE GAINES CENTER FOR THE HUMANITIES.

Because of his contributions to the University's sports programs as coach and athletic director, it is fitting that the aquatics center be named the HARRY C. LANCASTER AQUATICS CENTER.

AGREEMENT WITH JULIUS MARKS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

*Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize the President of the University or his designated representative to negotiate and execute an agreement with the Board of Directors of the Julius Marks Home (a not-for-profit corporation) to lease approximately four acres of land on the southcentral campus of the University of Kentucky to allow construction of a teaching/nursing home in support of the teaching, research, and patient care needs of the University of Kentucky Medical Center, with said agreement to be approved by the Finance Committee prior to execution.

Background: Approval of this recommendation will place a high quality nursing home in close proximity to the Medical Center and provide increased access to a geriatric patient population in support of the University's academic program objectives. Affiliation with such a facility will give the University Hospital priority in the admission of patients and improve the Hospital's stepdown care capabilities, while providing a clinical base for the development of roles for health professionals which will lead to improved patient care services for older persons in the Commonwealth. It will further enhance the services that Medical Center faculty provide to older patients and make available to the University a facility which will support research opportunities related to health systems of significance to the Commonwealth.

The academic program objectives of the five Medical Center colleges are not being properly met in the area of health care for geriatric patients. Specifically, there are deficiencies in access to patient care situations for health professions students at a time when there is a growing national concern relating to health care for this segment of society.

For the past two years, the Medical Center has had an effective but very limited teaching and service relationship with the Julius Marks Home. The old physical plant of this facility seriously limits the ability to meet both the objectives of its patient care program and those of the University's teaching program. Although the quality of care at the Home is high, the location, multiple small facilities, lack of skilled-care beds, problems of transportation for students and faculty, and the lack of teaching space have seriously limited the Medical Center's involvement

and opportunities. If located in proximity to the Medical Center, with facilities designed to support teaching and related academic objectives and to enhance patient care services, the facility would represent an outstanding and unique opportunity for the University to significantly strengthen its academic program in geriatrics not only for medical faculty, residents, and students, but also for students and faculty in Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy, and selected Allied Health areas. Additionally, opportunity will be provided for the Medical Center to seek and obtain grants and foundation support for program development in this area and materially strengthen the University's gerontology programs.

In concert with the Julius Marks Board, private funding will be sought to finance construction of the teaching component of the proposed facility. Cost of this element of the facility would not lead to an increase in the recharge to patients and third-party carriers. It is not expected that this relationship would lead to an encumbrance of University educational funds in order to subsidize the care of patients accepted to the facility under the auspices of the Julius Marks Board which, in fact would have ultimate responsibility for this particular liability. Medical Center resources would be utilized to support the teaching and research activities. The affiliation agreement which would be negotiated would define the specifics of the University's relationship with regard to patients, costs, student access, and staff privileges. The lease will be similar to other University leases to not-for-profit organizations.

Preliminary negotiations with reference to the development of this relationship and opportunity have been under way between the administrators and representatives of the Julius Marks Home and the University of Kentucky for a period of 12 months and preceded the most recent Board request to the University administration related to land use. Timing of the Certificate of Need application requires consideration of the matter at the December Board meeting if the University and its Medical Center are to take advantage of this unique opportunity.
