The role of the black journalist

Former vice chancellor to speak: William C. Parker encourages change in black journalism

William C. Parker, respected orator and former vice chancellor of minority affairs at UK, will speak at UK on Sunday about the role and responsibility of the black journalist.

Parker believes that many of today's black journalists have lost

ouch with their ability to create

touch with their ability to create change within their communities.

"It's not that they have forgotien their role], "he said. "It's just that nobody taught it to them."

He said that, historically, great black journalists were people who used their position to improve their environment, without losing the objectivity that is the hallmark of journalism.

But Parker was quick to point out that his message extends beyond the realms of journalism and blackness, and encouraged all students to attend.

Born in 1925, Parker escaped poverty to earn a bachelor's and master's degree from Illinois State University. He also chorate in psychology from Columbia Paritic University the lass done postgraduate work at Case-Western Reserve, Princeton, Rutgers as well as the University of Ghana in Accra.

The president of Parker & Gorden Steptenu, a broadcast fournalism senior and treasurer

of the National Association of Black Journalists, which is spon-soring the event, also looks for-ward to seeing Parker. "It is an honor," she said, "be-cause he has contributed so much to UK and to the minority affairs program."

Foul trouble plaqued the Cats throughout the first half as Ole Miss connected on 13 of 17 free throws versus just three attempts at the line for UK.

The UK coach again attributed the Cats' fouling and defensive problems to the way Ole Miss had affected the team mentally. "We didn't move our feet," Mattox said. "Tonight they packed that thing in and offensively when it wasn't clicking, we let it affect us defensively."

The issue: Students attending UK and LCC are not receiving benefits

For the last two years, corporate communications junior Jon Rasmussen, 25, has attended school full-time. But he always paid full price for his UK sports tickets, his good grades dight get him on the dean's list and he never had the chance to get UK health and the problems are familiar to anyone who attends UK and LOC with 12 or more hours combined between the two. Though LOC is part of UK's educational system and general education courses are of equal merit at the two schools, one must be a full-time student at one of the schools, not both, to take advantage of some basic full-time benefits.

Rasmussen attends both schools to accommodate his schedule. This semester is the first time he has been able to take 12 hours at UK, though he still has one class at LCC.

LOS ANGELES — Despite the hype over whether Eminem's "The Marshall Mathers LP" would take home album of the year honors, the rapper lost out to a pair of aging rockers — Steely Dan, who up until Wednesday night had never won a Grammy. The duo snagged the album of the year win for "Two Against Nature," their stalbum in nearly two decades. They also won best pop album and best pop "Pop". Also taking home three trophies apiece were firsh rockers U2 and crossover country singer Faith Hill. Eminem also won three awards, all in the rap categories. Outside the ceremony, about 100 people from women's and gay-rights groups demonstrated against Eminem. Elton John, one of music's most famous gay celebrities, also weathered criticism for joining the rapper onstage. Their performance of "Stan," Eminem's darkly gripping song about a deranged fan, also tested CBS censors. At least three curse words could be heard during the performance.

the country first erupted Sunday. The violence
highlights the breakdown of law and order in Indonesia as the archipelago emerges from more
than three decades of authoritarian rule and old
ethnic hatreds erupt into bloodshed. President
Abdurrahman Wahid left for a two-week trip
Thursday to the Middle East and Africa saying
he was not worried about leaving Indonesia
mired in a political crisis and ethnic violence.

SAN SEBASTIAN, Spain — A car bomb exploded in this northern coastal city Thursday, killing two young men and injuring others, an thorities said. 

"According a report released Wednesday on cnn.com, Napster Inc. offered \$1 billion Tuesday to the recording industry to settle a copyright infringement lawsuit. The offer follows last week's ruling from a federal appeals court which stated that the company knew its users

which stated that the company knew its users were violating music copyright laws through its file-sharing service.

Under the offer, Napster would pay \$150 million per year for five years to the major record labels — EMI, Warner, Universal, Sony and BMG — and pay \$50 million per year for five years to independent labels. Napster would also establish a three-tiered membership plan with the top membership costing \$5.95 to \$9.95 per month. Under that plan, users would have access to unlimited transactions in downloading cess to unlimited transactions in downloading

cess to unlimited transactions in downloading music. Less expensive plans would limit the number of transactions.

However, a recording industry group urged Napster to accept a federal injunction ordering it to block copyrighted music from its service. Oth-

to block copyrighted music from its service. Other recording industry officials also balked at the settlement offer.

Should Napster try to engage the music industry in negotiations in order to preserve its business? Or is Napster's attempt to cut a deal with the music industry flawed? Should Napster even attempt to cut a deal at all? Do you think Napster users will pay to use the company's software, or is the company destined to lose its battle to stay afloat in the face of lawsuits and shutdowns?"

The UK track and field teams will host one of
the most prestigious events in collegiate athletics


