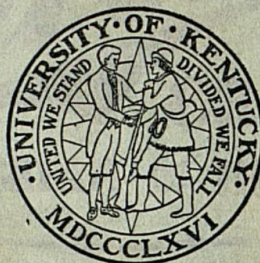

RULES AND REGULATIONS

THESE RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

1. The Fair Grounds will be open for the reception of stock and articles for exhibition on Saturday, August 10, 1935. Such articles should be shipped to the exhibitors or his agent, and in no case shall any article be brought upon the grounds and be placed on exhibition except by and at the expense of the owner or his authorized agent.

2. Freight for the Fair should be billed to the Lexington Colored Fair Grounds, Lexington, Kentucky.

3. All entries can be made by addressing the Secretary at Lexington, Ky., who will furnish printed entry blanks for all rings. Books for entries of stock will be opened ten days before the Fair begins and exhibitors should take advantage of this opportunity to make their entries before the Fair begins. Entries, however, may be made after ten days limit on sanction of committee in charge or the Secretary.

4. All stock or articles must be entered in the name of the exhibitor or his agent and must be entered before 11 o'clock on the day of the showing of the respective rings.

5. Exhibitors will please be careful that they enter their stock or articles in the right classes. Failure to do so will necessitate an additional entrance fee.

6. No person who is an exhibitor will be allowed to act as a judge in any ring in which he or she competes.

7. The gates to the Fair Grounds will be thrown open to the public each morning at 9 o'clock.

8. Ownership of stock or articles or pedigree thereof must not be made known to the judges. Any exhibitor doing so is not entitled to a premium on said article or stock.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

1. The gates leading into the Show Ring will be closed ten minutes after the call of the marshall for each ring. Strict attention should be paid to this rule.
2. All premiums will be paid in current money unless otherwise stated.
3. Cattle, sheep, hogs, poultry and other live stock should be left in the care of an attendant, as the Association is in no way responsible for their safety.
4. Grooms and attendants are charged regular admission fees, and exhibitors are requested to see that their help are supplied with badges.

AWARDS

1. Awards will be made by the one judge system unless otherwise ordered.
2. Awards are designated as follows: Blue, first; Red, second; White, third.
3. Exhibitors desiring their awards paid to agent must furnish agent with order to the Secretary.

PROTESTS

1. An exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Association if the protest is not sustained.
2. Every protest must be in writing, signed by the protestor, and, if it relates to any award, must be lodged on the day award is made.
3. All protests will be decided by the Board of Directors and their decisions shall be final.
4. The Association reserves to itself, acting through its Board of Directors, the sole and absolute right to interpret all conditions and regulations and settle all differences in connection with or incident to the Fair; also to prohibit exhibition of entries, cancel awards of prizes and declare off any stake, ring or race on account of insufficient number of entries or for any other reasons when the judgment of the Board of Directors deems such actions best.

PERMITS AND PRIVILEGES

1. The Association reserves the right of cancellation at any time, for reason satisfactory to it, of all contracts made with concessionaries. All contracts will be made on the basis of a Fair of six days and six nights, and when contract is cancelled by the Association a proportionate part of the amount paid will be retained to cover the length of time which the privilege has run.

2. Each concessionaire must confine himself to the space assigned him. Failure to do so will subject him to forfeiture of his privilege without reimbursement.

3. No gambling devices or immoral exhibitions of any kind will be permitted on the grounds at any time.

4. All persons buying privileges must pay at least one-half when the privilege is bought and the remaining one-half on or before the first day of the Fair.

5. Under no circumstances will any person or firm be allowed to place any advertising matter upon buildings, trees or other places on the grounds or be permitted to distribute advertising matter outside the place assigned therefor.

BAR

1. No grown person is allowed to enter articles of their making in the name of any child in the children's department.

GENERAL RULES ON JUDGING

For information and guidance of exhibitors and judges, the following general rules are announced.

1. To aid in avoiding discourtesy to judges on the part of exhibitors who assume that only their own judgments as to merits of their exhibits can be correct, it is made a request of this Association that judges of the horse classes shall not discuss their award nor in any way give reason for their judgment. Judges are further requested not to express opinion as to the merits of the exhibit which one may be justified in construing as pre-judgment.
2. Judges are requested to adhere to one type, as far as possible, in making awards, and thus avoid confusion. All horses, whether ridden or driven, must be judged from the ground.
3. No exhibitor shall himself ride or drive more than one horse or one team of horses in any one class.
4. Any exhibitor who shall interfere with a judge in any way, or who shall show a judge any disrespect, or who shall publicly take exception to or criticize the ruling or decisions of any judge, shall forfeit all awards not then paid to him, and be debarred from further entry and competition, until he shall have made such apology and reparation as shall be satisfactory to the Board of Directors, and shall have been reinstated by the vote of a majority of the whole board. In addition, it shall be in the discretion of the board to levy such fine against the offender as it may see fit.
5. No director of this Association shall be permitted to serve as a judge in any ring.

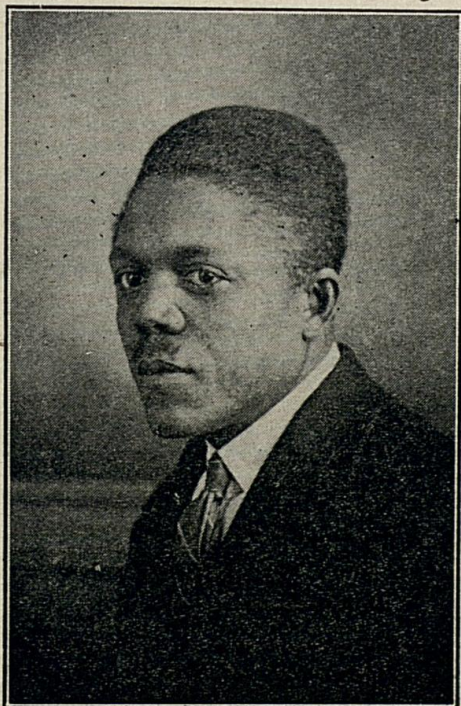

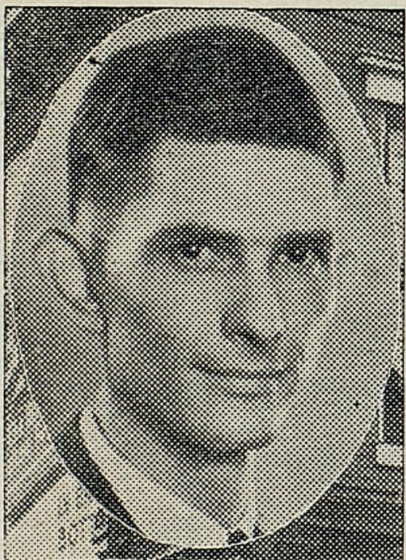

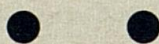
