

FRANKLIN COUNTY Confederate Diary Dated 1862

This diary tells of the battle of the Merrimac fought on March 8th & 9th, 1862. It also gives the line of march of the infantry although some of the names of the places have faded and are not discernible. Many names of persons and places are mentioned with no further identification.

This diary has been copied verbatim from the original handwritten script, and the field worker's copy transcribed, verbatim, by the Research Division, Historical Records Survey. Obvious errors in wording or spelling, copied from the original, are underscored in the transcription.


