on the gob side. Tools that are not in use laid against the rib. No loose brows left hanging back on the ribs. Places cleaned up well for the machine men to cut, with no loose coal left in the way of the machine, and no loose coal and slate left hanging on face to fall and be ground into the "bug dust". Posts set on line with proper clearance for machinemen to handle their machine and for the couplers and miners to handle their cars. Track torn up after a cleanup and placed out of the way of the machine.
