TO THE READERS OF THE "WESTERN PRESBYTERIAN."

I take this occasion to announce to the readers and friends of the Western Presbyterian that it has been permanently suspended, and its subscription list transferred to the Presbyterian at Philadelphia. Some weeks ago I made a public announcement that the publication of the paper would be resumed at an early day. Since that time facts have come to my knowledge which, together with reasons of a personal character, have compelled me reluctantly to give up the enterprise altogether. A very wide correspondence with brethren of the Synod of Kentucky and others, has satisfied me that, in this state of affairs, the interests of our churches would be best promoted by introducing the Presbyterian in the place of the Western Presbyterian. It is the oldest paper in the Church. It stands high in the confidence of all our people, and in the affections of a very large portion of them. These reasons, cogent in themselves, are supported by this further consideration, which seemed to be decisive of my duty to make this transfer, to wit-that all our churches could be united in the support and patronage of the Presbyterian. This was felt to be a matter of the utmost importance, and I sincerely trust that all the subscribers of the Western Presbyterian will become at once subscribers to, and cordial supporters of the Presbyterian. It now becomes the medium through which they will receive the news, and all communications of interest, pertaining to the churches in Kentucky and elsewhere, which hitherto have been received chiefly through the columns of our home organ.

The proprietors of the *Presbyterian* assume no responsibility in reference to the accounts of the *Western Presbyterian* with its subscribers. All subscriptions yet due the paper are payable to myself, and I am alone responsible for all amounts due subscribers who have paid in advance.
