

## An open-primary system would benefit Ky. voters

As Kentuckians wait for the May 20 primary, it is easy to be jealous of the more than 20 states that cast their votes this month.

However, as this topsy-turry election season has shown, moving Kentucky's primary up to Super Luesday in early February wouldn't necessarily give the commonwealth a greater say in the presidential nomination process. Even though medium-sized states like Alabama, Oklahoma and Minnesota held their pri-

Instead, all eyes were on California, New York and Georgia. It's unlikely Kentucky would have fared any better than other states with relatively small numbers of delegates if it had moved up its primary.

Under Kentucky law, registered voters who changed their party registration after Dec. 31, 2007, are not eligible to vote in their current party's primary in 2008, and independents can only vote in nonpartisan primary races. These strict rules limit Kentucky voters' influence over presidential nominations and essentially shut out independents allogether.

In an open primary, by contrast,

#### Allow students, faculty to carry guns on campus

What should university communities do to minimize death and injury due to gun attacks in campus classrooms? The police cannot be in all places at all times. Legislation that limits gun ownership will not work for the simple reason that criminals or violent individuals do not obey laws.

Legislation that will be the simple reason that criminals or violent individuals with valid state-issued concealed-carry permits to carry guns on campus and in classrooms. This approach is supported by Students for Concealed Carry on Campus. Two, require all faculty members to take firearms training equivalent to that needed to obtain a concealed-carry permit. Then, when teaching, faculty members would be responsible for carrying a weapon and serving as the first line of defense in the event of an attack.


