Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 14, 1982.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Tuesday, December 14, 1982 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

#### A. Meeting Opened and Roll Called

Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. William R. Black.

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill (Chairman), Mr. William R. Black, Governor Edward T. Breathitt, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler (Honorary Trustee), Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Professor Opal Skaggs Conley, Mr. James W. Dinkle, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. Ronald G. Geary, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, Mr. R. Larry Jones, Mr. W. Terry McBrayer, Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Mr. A. Stevens Miles, Mr. Frank Ramsey, and Professor William F. Wagner. Absent from the meeting were Mr. Albert G. Clay and Professor Constance P. Wilson. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Dr. Donald B. Clapp, Vice President for Administration: Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher, and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; Mr. Henry Clay Owen, Controller and Treasurer; Mr. David I. Carter, Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs; Dr. Paul G. Sears, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs; and Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research. Members of the various news media were also in attendance. The Secretary, Mrs. Clark, reported a quorum present, and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:06 p.m.

#### B. Minutes Approved

The Minutes of the November 9, 1982 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees were approved without objection.

#### C. Appointments to the Mining and Minerals Trust Fund Board of Trustees

In accordance with HB 722 passed by the 1982 General Assembly, the Chairman appointed the following Board members to serve on the Mining and Minerals Trust Fund Board of Trustees:

#### Two-year terms

#### One-year term

#### D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

Because of the length of the afternoon's agenda, President Singletary did not review the items in his monthly report, copies of which were distributed earlier. He suggested that the Trustees might wish to read it at a later date and recommended that the report be accepted. Without objection, it was so ordered.

#### E. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

After noting that the personnel changes in PR 2 were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended its approval. Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Black and second by Mrs. Clark, the appointments and staff changes as recommended in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### F. Supplemental Recommendation of the President (PR 3A)

On motion by Mr. Larry Jones and second by Mrs. Hermansdorfer, the personnel action recommended in PR 3A was approved. (See PR 3A at the end of the Minutes.)

#### G. 1982-83 Budget Revisions (PR 3B)

With President Singletary recommending and on motion by Mr. Griffin with second by Mr. Farmer, the proposed routine revisions in the 1982-83 budget were approved. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

#### H. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 3C)

President Singletary recommended that the proposed Governing Regulations which were received and tabled at the November 9, 1982 meeting of the Board of Trustees be removed from the table and approved. On motion by Mr. Ramsey and second by Mr. Geary, PR 3C was approved. (See PR 3C at the end of the Minutes.)

#### I. Candidates for Degrees - Lexington Campus and Medical Center (PR 3D)

Without discussion, Mr. Miles moved that the President be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name was listed in PR 3D the correct degree to which he or she is entitled. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and passed unanimously. (See PR 3D at the end of the Minutes.)

#### J. Mandatory Health Fee (PR 3E)

In stating his support of the mandatory health fee recommended in PR 3E. President Singletary pointed out the desirability of a health plan on campus and his belief that the fee is reasonable. He stated that the proposal was recommended by the Self-Study Committee on University Health Services, the Student Health Advisory Committee, the Student Government Association, and other student organizations. It was also supported by a majority of the students voting in the recent referendum sponsored by Student Government Association. He added that fees will be increased only on recommendation of the Student Health Advisory Committee and approval of the Board of Trustees.

The Chair recognized Mr. Dinkle who voiced his support of the mandatory health fee. Mr. Dinkle added, however, that in light of the economy and because of the federal/state cutbacks in student financial aid he supports imposition of the fee reluctantly.

On motion by Governor Breathitt and second by Professor Conley, the mandatory health fee recommended in PR 3E was approved without dissent. (See PR 3E at the end of the Minutes.)

#### K. Report on Results of Alumni Member Election (PR 3F)

President Singletary reported that the three persons receiving the highest number of votes in the election for an alumni member of the Board of Trustees were Mr. Thomas P. Bell, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, and Mr. Robert M. Spragens.

Mr. Black moved that the report of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees as given by President Singletary be received and put to record, and the Secretary be authorized to certify to the Governor the names of the three persons receiving the largest number of votes from which list a successor to Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, whose term expires December 31, 1982, will be appointed. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffen and passed without dissent. (See PR 3F at the end of the Minutes.)

#### L. Candidates for Degrees - Community College System (PR 4A)

Professor Conley moved that the degrees and certificates specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed. Her motion was seconded by Mr. Brereton Jones and passed without dissent. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

#### M. Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation, Incorporated (PR 5A)

Chancellor Gallaher explained that the creation of the foundation represents the culmination of a concerted effort by the mining industry, the University, and State Government to upgrade the University's mining program and facilities. The foundation will bring together the mining industry and the University, especially the College of Engineering, and will enable the University to develop excellence in mining engineering. He concluded by stating that with the program's new leadership and laboratory building the University is well on its way to having one of the best mining programs in the country.

On motion by Mrs. Hayes and second by Mr. Dinkle, the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation, Incorporated were approved without dissent. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

#### N. Naming of University Building (PR 6A)

Chancellor Bosomworth recommended that the Board approve the name of COLLEGE OF MEDICINE OFFICE BUILDING for the building currently housing the Departments of Behavioral Science and Preventive Medicine and Environmental Health. He explained that the building, which provides faculty offices and teaching space, was made possible through the combined resources of the Physicians Practice Plan, Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, and the Medical Center.

With President Singletary recommending and on motion of Mrs. Hermansdorfer, with second by Mr. McBrayer, the name COLLEGE OF MEDICINE OFFICE BUILDING was approved as recommended in PR 6A. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

#### O. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Farmer, reporting for Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, said the committee had met on the morning of December 14, 1982 and considered four items to be presented for action, the first of which was the Interim Financial Report for the period ending October 31, 1982. He then moved that the report be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### Adoption of Resolution Approving Issuance and Sale of Series D Community Colleges Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds

Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Farmer and seconded by Mr. Black that the following Resolution, which was read in summary form to the Board of Trustees, be passed and adopted; said Resolution was entitled as follows:

> A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY AFFIRMING THE AUTHORIZATION OF AND ACCEPTING THE SUCCESSFUL BID FOR THE PURCHASE OF \$7,800,000 OF UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY COMMUNITY COLLEGES EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BONDS, SERIES D.

On motion by Mr. Farmer and second by Mr. Miles, the capital construction report for the four months ending October 31, 1982 was accepted. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### R. Designation of a Depository Bank (FCR 4)

The Finance Committee so recommending, on motion of Mr. Farmer with second by Mr. McCowan, the Bank of Ashland, Ashland, Kentucky was designated as a depository bank for the University of Kentucky and/or its affiliated corporations. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### S. Activities at Robinson Forest

Dr. Charles E. Barnhart, Dean, College of Agriculture, submitted a report on Robinson Forest, copies of which were distributed to members of the Board of Trustees. Dean Barnhart reviewed the report and gave a slide presentation showing activities in the forest. The report is not a part of the Minutes but is included in the official files of the meeting.

Following a question and answer period concerning use of the forest, Mr. Brereton Jones asked Dean Barnhart whether it was possible for activities in the forest to be self supporting and if he would return to the Board with information on such possibilities. Mr. Sturgill then requested that Dean Barnhart also report to the Board on the number of students in the forestry, wood utilization, or other programs, both graduate and undergraduate, who used the forest as a laboratory during 1972-82.

#### T. Hospital Master Plan Presentation

A Master Plan Report for the University Hospital was presented by consultants from Bohm-NBBJ. President Singletary emphasized that it was a consultants' report being presented to the Board for information purposes and that the University administration will develop recommendations in response to the report. A copy of the report is not included in the Minutes but is in the official files of the meeting.

#### U. Meeting Adjourned

3. Comments - Student fees generated by the Center on Aging in the College of Medicine will fund geriatric programs. The increase in miscellaneous student fees will provide expenditure authority for replacement of teaching lab materials in the Chemistry Department. The increase in Federal Appropriations will fund additional programs in the areas of entomology, forestry, and the 4-H youth programs in the Agricultural Cooperative Extension Service. The increase in departmental sales and services generated by the Center for Continuing Professional and Executive Development will provide for the administration of student research projects for the Management and Marketing departments. Sales of publications by the Center for Learning Resources in the College of Allied Health Professions will provide the Center with increased expenditure authority to be utilized for special publications. The increase to departmental sales and services generated from advertisements to the College of Law's Kentucky Law Journal will provide increased departmental expenditure authority. #### Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky which were received for preliminary consideration at the November 9, 1982 meeting of the Board of Trustees be approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change Part IV, twelfth paragraph, fourth subsection, to read:

Recommend to the appropriate chancellor and the President on the establishment, alteration, and abolition of educational units in the University System.

Rationale: This change is consistent with the basic objective of the recent administrative reorganization which is to more clearly focus the responsibility and authority for the day-to-day administration of the three academic sectors on the chancellors. The primary means of accomplishing this objective are the placement of business, administrative, and student services under the control of the chancellor, and the delegation of certain authority for personnel, program, budget, and facilities.

#### Second Amendment - Change Part VII.A.4, first paragraph, to read:

The faculty of a college shall consist of its dean, assistant and/or associate deans, and full-time faculty personnel having the rank of assistant professor, associate professor, or professor in the regular, special title, or extension series. Membership, with

or without voting privileges, also may be extended by a college faculty to any other person assigned to it for administrative work, teaching, or research. An individual may be assigned to more than one faculty; in this instance, one assignment shall be designated by the President or other appropriate officer (X.B.1) appropriate chancellor(s) or dean (Part X.B.1) as the primary one.

Rationale: The same as that for the first amendment.

#### Third Amendment - Change Part VII.A.4, second paragraph, to read:

The faculty shall hold regularly scheduled meetings. In addition, it shall meet in special session on the call of the President of the University, the chancellor of the academic sector, or the dean of the college, or at the request of a prescribed number of its membership. Each college faculty shall establish the quorum for the transaction of business. Copies of minutes of college faculty meetings shall be made available to all members of the faculty of the college.

Rationale: The chancellor of the academic sector should be included among those authorized to call a special session of a college faculty.

#### Fourth Amendment - Change Part VII.A.6., second paragraph, to read:

The department faculty has jurisdiction, with the approval of the dean and the President appropriate chancellor or chancellor's designee over matters concerning its internal policies, insofar as these do not conflict with those of other departments or with the rules of the University Senate or the faculties of the school or college of which the department is a part. It should hold regularly scheduled meetings and is authorized to established rules for procedure and a committee structure to deal with matters over which it has jurisdiction, copies being filed with the secretary (secretaries) of the school and/or college of which the department is a member. It has primary responsibility for the development of policies on such matters as academic requirements, courses of study, class schedules, graduate and research programs, and service functions. Jointly with the department chairman, it should establish: (1) procedures to be used within the department in making recommendations on the appointment of new members of the department, promotions, reappointments, terminal reappointments, decisions not to reappoint, post-retirement appointments, and the granting of tenure; and (2) the procedures to be used within the department in the faculty performance evaluations and in the preparation of budget requests.

Rationale: The same as that for the first amendment.

#### Fifth Amendment - Change Part VII.B.5., second paragraph, to read:

The department chairman is responsible for recommendations on the appointment of new members of the department, promotions, reappointments, terminal reappointments, decisions not reappoint, post-retirement appointments, and the granting to tenure. Procedures and criteria used in preparing recommendations shall be those established by the University, the college, and the department faculty. As a minimum, the procedures must include consultation with all tenured members of the department and with all full-time, non-tenured faculty members (except those appointed in the research title or visiting series) with the actual or equivalent rank of assistant professor or higher who have been members of the department for two years, except as noted below. All recommendations on matters listed above, excluding reappointments and post-retirement appointments, shall include the written judgment of each consulted member of the department along with the recommendation of the chairman. The following exceptions may be made: (1) faculty members on approved leave of absence or with a primary administrative, service, or other assignment outside the department may, but are not required to, provide written judgments on all recommendations;  $\Gamma(1)$  (2) faculty members need not be consulted on recommendations for promotion affecting faculty members with equivalent or higher rank, except that all faculty members with tenure shall be consulted on recommendations for granting of tenure;  $\mathcal{L}(2)\mathcal{I}$  (3) faculty members without tenure need not be consulted on recommendations for granting of tenure;  $\mathcal{L}(3)\mathcal{I}$  $\frac{(4)}{and}$  the right to make recommendations on temporary appointments and/or appointments at the assistant professor level or below may be delegated, with these appointments to be reviewed by the tenured faculty of the department during the second semester of the first year of appointment; and  $\mathcal{L}(4)\mathcal{T}$  (5) in a large and diverse department, upon prior recommendation by the department faculty and approval of the  $\mathcal{L}$ President  $\mathcal{T}$  dean and the chancellor, consultation with faculty members may be restricted to those associated with the concerned, previously-defined academic division or program area in the department,

Rationale: The first change in this paragraph of Part VII.B.5 has been recommended specifically by the Department of Behavioral-Science, the Dean of the College of Medicine, and the Chancellor for the Medical Center and is known to have strong support in other parts of the University. The rationale for the second change (other than numbering) in this paragraph is the same as that for the first amendment.

#### Sixth Amendment - Change Part X.B.1, fifth paragraph, to read:

The term "joint appointment" shall apply in any case in which an individual holds two or more intra-University faculty appointments. In such an instance, one of the appointments shall be designated as

the primary appointment by the dean of the college if the individual's appointments are associated with educational units in the same college, by the appropriate chancellor if the appointments are with educational units in different colleges but in the same academic sector (i.e., Lexington Campus, Medical Center, or Community College System), or by the Presidenty mutual agreement of the appropriate chancellors if the appointments are with educational units in different academic sectors. The constituent appointments relating to a joint appointment may be processed simultaneously or at different times; however, each appointment should be processed independently and considered on its own merits. An individual's academic rank, though usually the same, may differ in the constituent appointments. The possibility of tenure applies only to the primary appointment. In case of termination of the non-primary appointment(s) leaving only the primary appointment for a full-time faculty member, the individual's assignment associated with the primary appointment shall become full-time.

Rationale: The same as that for the first amendment.

#### Seventh Amendment - Change Part X.B.3. to read:

The precise terms and conditions, excepting salary, covering each appointment shall be stated in writing on an official appointment record. Notice of reappointment shall be in the possession of the appropriate administrative officers and the appointee at least three months before the renewed appointment begins, when possible, or at the earliest date feasible in view of budget considerations. It shall be the responsibility of the \_Vice President for Administration appropriate chancellor to insure compliance with this regulation.

Rationale: Information on salary is not included on the form entitled "University of Kentucky Notice of Appointment and Assignment." With respect to the second modification, since responsibility to insure compliance with this regulation has been delegated for more than ten years to the appropriate academic vice president, it appears logical in view of the recent administrative reorganization to assign the responsibility directly to the appropriate chancellor.

Eighth Amendment - Change the first two paragraphs of Part X.B.4 to read:

Part-time, visiting, or temporary short-term appointments with explicit terminal dates of one <code>[academic]</code> year or less terminate at the expiration of the term without notice.

For those employed year-to-year on a fiscal or academic year basis, notification of non-renewal of appointment at the end of the first year of service shall be given not later than March 1 if the appointment expires at the end of that year or three months in advance if the one-year appointment terminates during the academic year. Notification of non-renewal of appointment at the end of the second year of service shall be given no later than December 15 if the appointment expires at the end of the year or six months in advance if the appointment expires during the year. Notification of non-renewal of appointment after more than two years of service shall be given at least 12 months before expiration of the appointment. Notice of non-renewal of appointment of those on post-retirement appointment shall be not less than six months.

Rationale: The modification in the first paragraph is needed because notice of non-renewal affecting an appointment having a length greater than 9 months (one academic year) but not more than 12 months (one year) is not currently covered in the University's regulations. The deletion of the last sentence in the second paragraph is appropriate because a post-retirement appointment is a temporary short-term appointment and would be covered by the first paragraph of Part X.B.4 as amended.

### MANDATORY HEALTH FEE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve a mandatory health fee of \$25.00 per semester (fall, spring and summer) for each full-time student effective with the fall semester 1983 with the following provisions:

- 1. Students already enrolled in a comparable comprehensive health plan may apply for and receive a refund.
- 2. The Board will not increase the fee in subsequent years unless the Student Health Advisory Committee has made an evaluation and recommended the increase.
- The Student Health Service will pursue other enhancements to revenue as a means of improving the likelihood of cost and fee containment.
- 4. Services provided through the Student Health Service will not be changed until the Student Health Advisory Committee has had an opportunity to consider the changes and make a recommendation.

Background: The mandatory health fee will support the Student Health Service and will permit the continuation of services currently provided to students and at a reasonable cost. A survey of other comparable universities conducted by the Student Health Advisory Committee indicated that most have mandatory fees and most charge more than \$25.00 per semester. As pointed out by the Self-Study Committee on University Health Services there are no reliable alternatives to maintaining student health services on campus, and parents are concerned that such services be available. There is also the need for such services to protect the general health of the university community.

The proposed mandatory fee was recommended by the Self-Study Committee on University Health Services, the Student Health Advisory Committee, the Student Association, and other student organizations. It was also supported by a majority of the students voting in a recent referendum sponsored by the Student Association.

Page Two

The program provides for exceptions for students enrolled in a comparable comprehensive health plan, but it is believed that only a few plans will qualify for the exception. A committee composed of a member from the Student Health Advisory Committee, Student Association, Dean of Students' staff, Risk Management staff, and Medical Center Chancellor's staff will evaluate plans to determine if they meet the criteria for an exception.

The Student Health Advisory Committee will be involved in any future changes in the level or nature of services provided or in the level of fees charged. Services will not be changed until the Committee has had an opportunity to consider such changes and make a recommendation. Fees will be increased only with the recommendation of the Committee and approval by the Board of Trustees.

### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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### UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

MINING ENGINEERING FOUNDATION, INC.

### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT:

### ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation, Inc.

### ARTICLE II

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual unless terminated pursuant to law.

### ARTICLE III

The corporation is organized exclusively for educational purposes, to-wit, to make the Mining Engineering Department at the University of Kentucky one of the finest in the nation by establishing a continuing partnership between the University of Kentucky and the mining industry of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the enhancement and improvement of the Mining Engineering Department of the College of Engineering. To that end, the purposes of the corporation shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (1) To solicit and receive gifts, bequests and devises of things of value and accept the same subject to such conditions and trusts as may be imposed thereon for the exclusive benefit of the Mining Engineering Department of the College of Engineering.
- (2) To build an endowment fund and such other funds as may be necessary or desirable and advise as to the creative management of said funds and disburse therefrom, from time to time, such monies as may be determined by the hereinafter named Board of Directors, in accordance with the limitations of any gift, bequest or devise which may come to the corporation.

(3) To assist in determining, in cooperation with the administration of the College of Engineering and the Department of Mining Engineering, appropriate projects and programs of the Mining Engineering Department to be financed in whole or in part by funds raised, or by income from said endowment or other funds.

### ARTICLE IV

The University of Kentucky shall serve as fiscal agent for the corporation and, as such, receive and hold in an agency account all monies received by and on behalf of the corporation and expend therefrom such monies as may be authorized by the corporation.

### ARTICLE V

The corporation shall have all powers granted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky so long as such powers are consistent with the qualifying provisions of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code for such corporations.

### ARTICLE VI

In the event of dissolution of the corporation, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed to the University of Kentucky for the use and benefit of its Mining Engineering Department or its successor organization or program, to be held and administered in accordance with any restrictions, conditions or limitations imposed thereon; provided, however, if the University of Kentucky at the time of dissolution is not qualified, not in existence, or unwilling or unable to accept said assets, then the assets shall go to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for exclusively public purposes.

### ARTICLE VII

The address of the initial registered office of the
corporation is, University of
Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky 40506 and the name of its initial
registered agent is,
University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky 40506.

### ARTICLE VIII

The affairs of the corporation shall be regulated, managed, controlled and conducted by a Board of Directors to be appointed by the President of the University of Kentucky, upon recommendation of the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus and with the approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky. The Board shall consist of thirty-four (34) members appointed from the following categories:

- (1) Twenty-four (24) shall be representatives of the mining industry, and shall be as broadly representative of the industry as possible; after initial appointments, all nominations for membership on the board in this category shall be made in writing to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus.
- (2) Six (6) shall be ex-officio members from the University of Kentucky, to-wit, the President, the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus, the Vice Chancellor for Administration of the Lexington Campus, the Vice President for University Relations, the Chairman of the Department of Mining Engineering, and the Dean of the College of Engineering.
- (3) Two (2) shall be members of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.
- (4) Two (2) shall be members of the faculty of the University of Kentucky.

Each member of the Board, except for the ex-officion members, shall be appointed for one (1) term of four (4) years. The members may succeed themselves for staggered terms of one (1) to four (4) years, as determined by the President, but the members except for those serving ex-officio may not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms.

### ARTICLE X

The officers of the corporation shall consist of a president, one or more vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and such other officers (and assistant officers) as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Directors. The officers shall be elected or appointed at such time and in such manner and for terms (not exceeding three years) as may be prescribed in the By-Laws. Any two of the offices of vice-president, secretary, and treasurer may be combined in one person. The officers of the corporation may be designated by such additional titles as may be provided in the By-Laws.

### ARTICLE XII

No part of the funds or assets of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, officers or directors of the corporation, or other private persons. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

### ARTICLE XIII

These Articles of Incorporation shall be amended by the adoption of an amendment at a meeting of the Board of Directors upon receiving the vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the directors in office and approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.

BY-LAWS

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### UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

MINING ENGINEERING FOUNDATION, INC.

### ARTICLE I

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation, Inc. is to make the Mining Engineering Department of the College of Engineering at the University of Kentucky one of the finest in the nation by establishing a continuing partnership between the University of Kentucky and the mining industry of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. To that end, the purposes of the Foundation include, but not necessarily by way of limitation:

- (1) To solicit and receive gifts, bequests and devises of things of value and accept the same, subject to such conditions and trusts as may be imposed thereon for the exclusive benefit of the Mining Engineering Department of the College of Engineering.
- (2) To build an endowment fund and such other funds as may be necessary or desirable, and advise as to the creative management of said funds and disburse therefrom, from time to time, such monies as may be determined by the hereinafter named Board of Directors and in accordance with the limitations of any gift, bequest, or devise which may come to the Foundation.
- (3) To assist in determining, in cooperation with the administration of the College of Engineering, appropriate projects and programs of the Mining Engineering Department to be financed in whole or in part by funds raised, or by income from said endowment or other funds.

#### ARTICLE II

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 - Membership: The management of the affairs of the Foundation shall be vested in a Board of Directors whose membership shall consist of thirty-four (34) members. The members shall be appointed by the President of the University of Kentucky, upon recommendation of the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus, and with the approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, in accordance with Article VIII of the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation, as follows:

- (1) Twenty-four (24) members shall be representatives of the mining industry and related industries.
- (2) members shall be ex-officio University of Kentucky, to-wit, the President, of Chancellor the Lexington Campus, the for Chancellor Administration οf Lexington the Campus, the Vice President for University Relations, the Chairman of the Department of Mining Engineering, and the Dean of the College of Engineering.
- (3) At least two (2) members shall be from the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.
- (4) At lease two (2) members shall be from the faculty of the University of Kentucky.

Section 2 - Terms of Office: Each member of the Board shall be appointed for one (1) term of four (4) years. The members may succeed themselves for staggered terms of one (1) to four (4) years, as determined by the President of the University of Kentucky, in consultation with the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus, but the members may not serve for more than two (2) successive terms.

Section 3 - Compensation: Members of the Board shall receive no compensation for their services, but they may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of the Foundation.

Section 4 - Vacancies: In the event of a vacancy on the Board, a successor shall be appointed to fill the unexpired term in the same manner in which a new director is appointed.

#### ARTICLE III

#### OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 - Officers: The Officers of the Board shall consist of a Chairman, Vice Chairman, and a Secretary.

Section 2 - Election and Term: Officers of the Board shall be elected from the membership at the annual meeting and shall serve one-year terms.

Section 3 - Duties of Officers:

- a. Chairman: The Chairman shall preside at all meetings, shall sign all documents required to be signed for the Board, shall serve as an ex-officio member of all committees, and shall have such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board.
- b. Vice Chairman: In the Chairman's absence, the Vice Chairman shall perform all the duties of the Chairman and shall have such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board.
- c. Secretary: The Secretary shall maintain minutes of all meetings of the Board, shall attest to all documents required to be signed for the Board, shall issue proper notice of all meetings of the Board, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### OFFICERS OF THE FOUNDATION

Section l - Officers: The corporate officers of the Foundation shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2 - Term: The corporate officers of the Foundation shall serve one year terms, to be automatically renewed each year.

Section 3 - Appointments:

- a. President: The President of the University of Kentucky shall serve as corporate President of the Foundation.
- b. Vice President: The Chancellor of the Lexington Campus of the University of Kentucky shall serve as corporate Vice President of the Foundation.
- c. Secretary: The Secretary of the Board of Directors shall serve as corporate Secretary of the Foundation.
- d. Treasurer: The Controller-Treasurer of the University of Kentucky shall serve as corporate Treasurer of the Foundation.

Section 4 - Duties of Corporate Officers: The duties of the corporate officers shall be as determined by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE V

#### MEETINGS

Section 1 - Regular Meetings: Regular meetings shall be held at least semi-annually. Notice of the date, time, and place of such meetings shall be given by the Secretary no less than thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting.

Section 2 - Special Meetings: Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chairman or upon the written request of any six (6) members of the Board, providing that notification is given by the Secretary no less than three (3) days before such meetings of the date, time, place, and purpose of the meeting. Final action shall not be taken on any matter not included in the call for a special meeting.

Section 3 - Annual Meetings: Annual meetings shall be held between April 1 and June 30 of each year, as determined by the Board of Directors. Notices of the time and place of each meeting shall be given by the Secretary no less than thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting.

Section 4 - Quorum: A simple majority of the current membership of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at all regular and special meetings.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### STAFFING

Section 1 - Executive Director: The Chairman of the Department of Mining Engineering of the College of Engineering shall serve as Executive Director for the Foundation and shall perform those duties which are prescribed by the Board.

Section 2 - Other Personnel: Personnel engaging in the performance of staff and clerical functions for the Foundation shall be employees of the University of Kentucky, subject to the policies, procedures, and regulations governing University employees.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### COMMITTEES

Section 1 - Appointments: The Chairman of the Board of Directors, with the approval of the Board, shall appoint, charge, and fix the terms of committee chairmen and members and, when appropriate, abolish all standing, ad hoc, and special committees necessary or desirable for the management of the affairs of the Foundation.

Section 2 - Membership: Membership on committees shall include members of the Board of Directors and may extend beyond the membership of the Board. The Chairman of the Board and the Executive Director shall serve as ex-officio members of all committees.

Section 3 - Meetings: Regular meetings shall be held at a time fixed by a majority vote of committee members. The time and place of regular meetings shall be communicated to all members. Special meetings may be called by the committee chairman, by written request of two (2) committee members, by the Executive Director, or by the Board of Directors.

Section 4 - Quorum: A simple majority of the committee membership shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 5 - Reporting: Minutes of the committee meetings shall be submitted to the Board of Directors, through the Chairman of the Board. At the request of the Chairman, an annual report of committee activities shall be submitted to the Board.

Section 6 - Executive Committee: The officers of the Board of Directors and the ex-officio members of the Board shall

constitute an Executive Committee which shall conduct the business of the Board when necessary between meetings, and as directed by the Board.

Section 7 - Nominating Committee: A Nominating Committee consisting of five (5) members of the Board shall be appointed to serve for one (1) year. It shall be the responsibility of the Nominating Committee to submit the names of prospective Board members to the Chairman of the Mining Engineering Department of the College of Engineering for recommendation to, and appointment by, the President of the University with approval by the University's Board of Trustees.

Section 8 - Fund Raising Committee: A Fund Raising Committee shall be appointed consisting of as many members as the Chairman shall determine sufficient, to serve for one (1) year.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### CHECKS, DEPOSITS, AND FUNDS

Section 1 - Depository of Funds: The University of Kentucky shall serve as fiscal agent for the Foundation and be the depository and manager of all funds for the Foundation.

Section 2 - Records and Reports: The Controller-Treasurer of the University of Kentucky shall have custody of all records pertaining to financial transactions of the Foundation and shall manage such funds in accordance with the fiscal policies of the University; and shall prepare, maintain, and make such records and reports available to the Board at its regular meetings and/or whenever requested by the Board. Said Treasurer shall also make

any and all information or reports available to the Executive Director of the Foundation at his request.

Section 3 - Advice and Counsel: The Controller-Treasurer of the University shall seek the advice and counsel of the Board of Directors with regard to the management of the funds of the Foundation and shall report to the Board on the management of such funds.

Section 4 - Gifts: The Board of Directors may accept, on behalf of the Foundation, any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general or special purposes of the Foundation.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### **BOOKS AND RECORDS**

The Foundation shall keep correct and complete books and records of accounts (which shall be audited annually by the external auditor employed by the University) and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors. All books and records of the Foundation may be inspected by any Board member for any proper purpose at any reasonable time. Quarterly financial statements shall be prepared for distribution to all Board members.

#### ARTICLE X

#### WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever notice is required to be given under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or these By-Laws, a

waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice (whether before or after the time stated therein) shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, latest edition, shall govern the Board of Directors and its committees in all cases in which they are applicable except where superseded by these By-Laws.

#### ARTICLE XII

#### INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS, OFFICERS AND AGENTS

To the extent permitted by law, directors, officers, and agents of the Foundation, while acting for and on behalf of the Foundation, shall be afforded indemnity by the Foundation.

#### ARTICLE XII

#### RATIFICATION

These By-Laws shall become effective when adopted by a majority vote of the Board members present at a meeting of the directors especially called for this purpose, and when approved by the Board of Trustees of the University.

#### ARTICLE XIV

#### AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote of the membership of the Board, provided written notice of the proposed revision has been given at least thirty (30) days prior to such meeting; and provided further that the amendments shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Trustees of the University.

#### INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT

Recommendation: that the financial report for the four months ending October 31, 1982, be accepted.

Background: The October 31, 1982, report reflects income of \$149,699,088 for the period of the report; the income figure is 44% of the annual income estimate of \$336,580,372.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY AFFIRMING THE AUTHORIZATION OF AND ACCEPTING THE SUCCESSFUL BID FOR THE PURCHASE OF \$7,800,000 OF UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY COMMUNITY COLLEGES EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BONDS, SERIES D.

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky by Resolution passed and adopted on November 9, 1982, authorized the issuance and sale of \$7,800,000 principal amount of "University of Kentucky Community Colleges Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series D", dated December 1, 1982 (the "Bonds"), and

WHEREAS, the provisions of the Resolution authorizing said Bonds require that same be offered for public sale on the basis of sealed, competitive bids, and

WHEREAS, sealed bids have been received in accordance with said Notice of Bond Sale and considered by said Finance Committee, said bids being as follows:

#### Designation of a Depository Bank

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees designate the Bank of Ashland, Ashland, Kentucky, to serve as a depository bank for the University of Kentucky and/or its affiliated corporations.

Background: To comply with House Bill 622 enacted by the 1982 General Assembly, the Board of Trustees must designate depository banks serving the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations.

The Advisory Board of Ashland Community College in a meeting on June 17, 1976, recommended that the Bank of Ashland serve as a depository on a rotating basis with the First Bank and Trust Company and the Third National Bank. However, the Bank of Ashland was not included in the banks designated by the Board of Trustees on September 21, 1982. This action will permit the rotation of banks to continue as recommended by the Advisory Board.
