



John Clubbe, Byron's Natural Man: Daniel Boone & Kentucky, \$60.00. Citing nine stanzas from Byron's Don Juan which are about Boone, University of Kentucky professor John Clubbe has written a monograph exploring how and what Byron knew of Daniel Boone and life in America.

Algernon Swinburne, On the Cliffs, \$200.00. One of four long poems comprising Swinburne's \overline{Songs} of the Springtides, this poem is illustrated with a visual interpretation by John Tuska (the figures are printed in three colors from the handcut blocks).

William Kavanaugh Doty, The Confectionary of Monsieur Giron, \$30.00. The story of Monsieur Giron and his confectionary which stood on Mill Street in downtown Lexington in the early 1800's. (Part of the building still stands.) Reprinted for the first time since 1915.
